

Approve and execute Amendment No. 2 for training and professional services with NaphCare, Inc. for a one-time payment not to exceed \$80,000 related to the Forensic Behavioral Health implementation of the Electronic Healthcare Medical Records System in the County jails and juvenile detention facilities.

medical administration records, medical diagnoses, consent/refusal forms and known allergies. Subsequently, NaphCare, Inc., created a software application, TechCare for the correctional healthcare environment and NCCHC best practice compliance. On November 24, 2014 (3-106) the Board of Supervisors authorized execution of a 10 year, \$9,410,624 agreement with NaphCare for the implementation of TechCare in the County's jails and juvenile detention facilities. An Amendment to the initial project budget was also approved on July 7, 2015 (3-23), adding \$1,263,713 to that contract. The County implemented the medical and pharmacy components of TechCare June 29, 2015.

The County now seeks to implement the forensic behavioral health module of TechCare to unify inmate medical and behavioral health information into one electronic record. The forensic behavioral health (FBH) software module itself was included as part of the original system purchase. Riverside University Health System are requesting authorization to incur additional fixed costs to provide services necessary to bring County Forensic Behavioral Health (FBH) staff onto the system by 7/1/2016. This one time addition to the contract would provide customization of the software to meet the needs of FBH workflows, development of an interface for state mandated reporting and on-site training conducted by the vendor's professionals of approximately 100 FBH staff who will to use and operate the system to meet the behavioral health needs of patients in the jails and juvenile detention facilities.

Impact on Citizens and Businesses

This service impacts the patients in Riverside County receiving care from Riverside University Health System/Behavioral Health.

Contract History and Price Reasonableness

The vendor is in year two of a ten year contract on this project. This is a one-time fixed fee addition to a contract with an existing vendor. The cost is based on fixed pricing of \$125 an hour rate for 640 hours of professional services.

WHEREAS, COUNTY purchased CONTRACTOR's TechCare® EHR System for County's Forensic Behavioral Health (FBH) staff to assist, streamline and facilitate the delivery and administration of behavioral healthcare services to incarcerated individuals in 2014 as part of a larger EHR system purchase (November 24, 2014 (3-106); and

WHEREAS, CONTRACTOR implemented the FBH module system at that time; and WHEREAS, COUNTY authorized additional funds for implementation of that EHR system in 2015 (July 7, 2015 (3-23); and

WHEREAS, COUNTY's Forensic Behavioral Health (FBH) staff, which numbers approximately 100 individuals, did not participate in training during the initial "go live" of the EHR system in 2015;

NOW THEREFORE, the Agreement between County of Riverside, a political subdivision of the State of California (COUNTY) and NAPHCARE (CONTRACTOR), entered into as of November 24, 2014 is hereby amended as follows by adding the following provisions:

- I. Contractor shall re-implement TechCare, its licensed EHR software system, within County's FBH for use to provide care for incarcerated adults and juveniles with behavioral health needs.
- Contractor will adjust and ensure the appropriate operation of a single, bidirectional interface in order to communicate critical reporting and care continuity data between TechCare and other County systems.

- V. Contractor shall continue after this go-live project to customize TechCare to meet reasonable business requirements of County's FBH. All customization services provided by Contractor after "go-live" will be counted against the continuing "Hours Pool" already provided for in Exhibit B, Section VII of the contract.
- VI. The COUNTY shall provide written confirmation to CONTRACTOR of golive start date two (2) weeks in advance of agreed upon date. Should COUNTY change go-live date within two (2) weeks preceding start date, COUNTY shall be solely responsible for all non-refundable costs incurred by CONTRACTOR related to go-live activities.
- VII. CONTRACTOR will not be required to provide on-site training or go-live activities within seven (7) days of a national holiday.
- VIII. The applicable timetable for this implementation shall be initiated no sooner than March 25, 2016.
- 2. All other terms and conditions of the Agreement not modified herein shall remain unchanged.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the Parties hereto have caused their duly authorized representatives to execute this Amendment.
