BACKGROUND: Summary (continued)

These laboratory application systems need to be integrated into EPIC to ensure continuity of patient care. More resources are required to integrate RUHS laboratory systems into Epic. This agreement will add a resource to the Epic conversion project to ensure continuity of patient care for mission critical laboratory systems during the Epic implementation, go-live, and system stabilization. The qualified Novius Lab Analyst provided under this agreement has in-depth working experience with all the laboratory application systems utilized by RUHS.

PROFESSIONAL SERVICE AGREEMENT

Description of Services

Innovative Consulting Group (ICG) shall provide one or more individuals to provide services as outlined and specified in Exhibit A, Scope of Services at the not to exceed fee stated in the Compensation Section. Audrey Chambers Robinson is the individual agreed by the parties to provide these services. If Ms. Robinson becomes for any reason unable to complete the assigned scope of services and deliverables, ICG will propose other consultants equally skilled and qualified until the parties are able to agree on another individual who can complete the work.

Period of Performance

This service engagement will begin on 5/2/2016 with an end date of 11/30/2016

The consulting resources will be scheduled to provide between 35 and 45 hours of remote and on-site work as requested, per week on average (based on work schedules mutually agreed-upon by ICG and Riverside University Health System)

Compensation

All professional service billable hours and reimbursement of travel & living expenses will not exceed \$236,000.00 for this contract. Services will be billed at a rate of \$146 per hour plus travel expenses.

On call support after hours is not included in this rate structure.

Riverside County will reimburse ICG for actual transportation and lodging expenses without mark-up, IRS mileage rate, and the IRS meal per-diem. ICG will work with Riverside University Health System to ensure out-of-pocket expenses are maintained as low as possible while still providing reasonable accommodations for ICG staff (

Fees for services performed and travel/living expenses will be billed every two weeks. Payment terms will be net 30 upon receipt of invoice.. Invoicing, unless otherwise directed, will go to:

Alteration or Changes

Riverside University Health System and the ICG are the only authorized representatives who may at any time, by written order, make alterations to this Agreement. If any such alteration causes an increase or decrease in the cost of, or the time required for the performance under this Agreement, an equitable adjustment shall be made in the Agreement price or delivery schedule, or both, and the Agreement shall bemodified by written amendment accordingly.



Any claim by Innovative Consulting Group for additional payment related to this Agreement shall be made in writing by the ICG within 30 days of when the ICG has or should have notice of any actual or claimed change in the work which results in additional and unanticipated cost to the ICG. If the Riverside University Health System Purchasing Agent decides that the facts provide sufficient justification, he may authorize additional payment to the ICG pursuant to the claim. Nothing in this section shall excuse the ICG from proceeding with performance of the Agreement even if there has been a change.

Extension & Termination Agreement

Either party may terminate this agreement without cause with a 30-day written notice. Written notice must be given at least 4 weeks prior to such termination.

If Ms. Robinson becomes for any reason unable to continue providing services and a mutually agreed to replacement consultant cannot be identified, the contract will terminate as of the last date MS. Robinson provides services. Termination of this agreement will not affect fees or travel and living expenses already incurred.

Consultant Status

ICG consultants shall be considered for all purposes independent contractors acting in a consulting capacity to Riverside University Health System. ICG consultants shall not be considered employees of Riverside University Health System under any interpretation of this agreement.

Riverside University Health System will not withhold income taxes or Social Security taxes on behalf of ICG consultants under the terms of this agreement. In addition, ICG consultants will have no claim under this agreement or otherwise against Riverside University Health System for vacation pay, sick leave, unemployment insurance, workers compensation, retirement benefits, or employee benefits of any kind.

ICG consultants normally work Monday - Thursday, with Friday being an administrative day.

ICG may request that Riverside University Health System sponsor ICG's consultant(s) for vendor education courses. Should that occur, Riverside University Health System will evaluate the request on a case by case basis and inform ICG of that decision.

ICG warrants that its consultants are not presently and will not in the future be excluded from the federal healthcare programs and that it periodically verifies this fact through the information provided by the Office of the Inspector General of the Department of Health and Human Services.

Non-Hiring

The Parties to this Agreement agree not to hire, attempt to hire, or contract with, the other party's employees or subcontractors during the term (including any renewals thereof) of this Agreement and for one year subsequent to the expiration or termination of this Agreement.

Conduct of Contractor

ICG covenants that it presently has no interest, including, but not limited to, other projects or contracts, and shall not acquire any such interest, direct or indirect, which would conflict in any manner or degree with Audrey Chambers Robinson's performance under this Agreement. ICG further covenants that no person or subcontractor having any such interest shall be employed or retained by ICG under this Agreement.

ICG agrees to inform the Riverside University Health System of all Audrey Chambers Robinson's interests, if any, which are or may be perceived as incompatible with the Riverside University Health System's interests.

ICG warrants that Audrey Chambers Robinson shall not, under circumstances which could be interpreted as an Innovative Consulting Group

attempt to influence the recipient in the conduct of his/her duties, accept any gratuity or special favor from individuals or firms, in accomplishing the work under this Agreement.

Innovative Consulting Group or its employees shall not offer gifts, gratuity, favors, and entertainment directly or indirectly to Riverside University Health System employees.



Facility Access

Riverside University Health System agrees to provide access to whatever reasonable facilities and equipment is necessary to successfully complete the Scope of the Engagement. This access will primarily be required during the hours of 7:30 AM to 6:30 PM.

<u>Insurance</u>

Without limiting or diminishing the CONTRACTOR'S obligation to indemnify or hold the COUNTY harmless, CONTRACTOR shall procure and maintain or cause to be maintained, at its sole cost and expense, the following insurance coverage's during the term of this Agreement. As respects to the insurance section only, the COUNTY herein refers to the County of Riverside, its Agencies, Districts, Special Districts, and Departments, their respective directors, officers, Board of Supervisors, employees, elected or appointed officials, agents, or representatives as Additional Insureds.

A. Cyber Liability Contractor shall maintain cyber liability insurance, with limits not less than \$2,000,000 per occurrence or claim, \$2,000,000 aggregate. Coverage shall be sufficiently broad to respond to the duties and obligations as is undertaken by Contractor in this agreement and shall include, but not be limited to, claims involving infringement of intellectual property, including but not limited to infringement of copyright, trademark, trade dress, invasion of privacy violations, information theft, damage to or destruction of electronic information, release of private information, alteration of electronic information, extortion and network security. The policy shall provide coverage for breach response costs as well as regulatory fines and penalties as well as credit monitoring expenses with limits sufficient to respond to these obligations.

If the Contractor maintains broader coverage and/or higher limits than the minimums shown above, the County requires and shall be entitled to the broader coverage and/or higher limits maintained by the Contractor. Any available insurance proceeds in excess of the specified minimum limits of insurance and coverage shall be available to the County.

B. Professional Liability Contractor shall maintain Professional Liability Insurance providing coverage for the Contractor's performance of work included within this Agreement, with a limit of liability of not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$2,000,000 annual aggregate. If Contractor's Professional Liability Insurance is written on a claims made basis rather than an occurrence basis, such insurance shall continue through the term of this Agreement and CONTRACTOR shall purchase at his sole expense either 1) an Extended Reporting Endorsement (also, known as Tail Coverage); or 2) Prior Dates Coverage from new insurer with a retroactive date back to the date of, or prior to, the inception of this Agreement; or 3) demonstrate through Certificates of Insurance that CONTRACTOR has Maintained continuous coverage with the same or original insurer. Coverage provided under items; 1), 2), or 3) will continue as long as the law allows.

C. General Insurance Provisions - All lines:

- 1) Any insurance carrier providing insurance coverage hereunder shall be admitted to the State of California and have an A M BEST rating of not less than A: VIII (A:8) unless such requirements are waived, in writing, by the County Risk Manager. If the County's Risk Manager waives a requirement for a particular insurer such waiver is only valid for that specific insurer and only for one policy term.
- 2) The CONTRACTOR must declare its insurance self-insured retention for each coverage required herein. If any such self-insured retention exceeds \$500,000 per occurrence each such retention shall have the prior written consent of the County Risk Manager before the commencement of operations under this Agreement. Upon notification of self-insured retention unacceptable to the COUNTY, and at the election of the Country's Risk Manager, CONTRACTOR'S carriers shall either; 1) reduce or eliminate such self-insured retention as respects this Agreement with the COUNTY, or 2) procure a bond which guarantees payment of losses and related investigations, claims administration, and defense costs and expenses.
- 3) CONTRACTOR shall cause CONTRACTOR'S insurance carrier(s) to furnish the County of Riverside with either 1) a properly executed original Certificate(s) of Insurance and certified original copies of Endorsements effecting coverage as required herein, and 2) if requested to do so orally or in writing by the County Risk Manager, provide

original Certified copies of policies including all Endorsements and all attachments thereto, showing such insurance is in full force and effect. Further, said Certificate(s) and policies of insurance shall contain the covenant of the insurance carrier(s) that thirty (30) days written notice shall be given to the County of Riverside prior to any material modification, cancellation, expiration or reduction in coverage of such insurance. In the event of a material modification, cancellation, expiration, or reduction in coverage, this Agreement shall terminate forthwith, unless the County of Riverside receives, prior to such effective date, another properly executed original Certificate of Insurance and original copies of endorsements or certified original policies, including all endorsements and attachments thereto evidencing coverage's set forth herein and the insurance required herein is in full force and effect. CONTRACTOR shall not commence operations until the COUNTY has been furnished original Certificate (s) of Insurance and certified original copies of endorsements and if requested, certified original policies of insurance including all endorsements and any and all other attachments as required in this Section. An individual authorized by the insurance carrier shall sign the original endorsements for each policy and the Certificate of Insurance.

- 4) It is understood and agreed to by the parties hereto that the CONTRACTOR'S insurance shall be construed as primary insurance, and the COUNTY'S insurance and/or deductibles and/or self-insured retention's or self-insured programs shall not be construed as contributory.
- 5) If, during the term of this Agreement or any extension thereof, there is a material change in the scope of services; or, there is a material change in the equipment to be used in the performance of the scope of work; or, the term of this Agreement, including any extensions thereof, exceeds five (5) years; the COUNTY reserves the right to adjust the types of insurance and the monetary limits of liability required under this Agreement, if in the County Risk Manager's reasonable judgment, the amount or type of insurance carried by the CONTRACTOR has become inadequate.
- 6) CONTRACTOR shall pass down the insurance obligations contained herein to all tiers of subcontractors working under this Agreement.
- 7) The insurance requirements contained in this Agreement may be met with a program(s) of self-insurance acceptable to the COUNTY.
- 8) CONTRACTOR agrees to notify COUNTY of any claim by a third party or any incident or event that may give rise to a claim arising from the performance of this Agreement.

Liability

Any litigation arising from this agreement shall be adjudicated under the laws of the State of California or, if mutually agreed upon, to arbitration by the American Arbitration Association.

HIPAA

The CONTRACTOR is subject to and shall operate in compliance with all relevant requirements contained in the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA), Public Law 104-191, enacted August 21, 1996, and the related laws and regulations promulgated subsequent thereto. ICS warrants that it is responsible for the actions of any consultant provided under this Agreement and any use or misuse by the consultant of any health information protected by federal or California state law. It further warrants that it has provided such consultants with appropriate training regarding such laws and the obligations that they impose on Riverside University Health System and other healthcare providers. ICS further warrants that its consultants will not remove or disclose or retain any protected health information from Riverside UniversityHealth System during the course of this consulting engagement and that its consultants will use any remote access privileges provided to them solely for work under this Agreement.
