BACKGROUND:

Summary

The passage of Proposition 63 Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) in November 2004 increased funding, personnel, and other resources to support county mental health programs and monitor progress toward state goals for servicing children, transition age youth, adults, older adults, veterans, and families with mental health needs. County Veterans Service Offices (CVSO) providing or enhancing their mental health outreach and services are authorized to apply.

BACKGROUND:

Summary (continued)

Funding is restricted for use in supporting mental health outreach and treatment programs only and is not intended to cover overall agency expenses, major capital expenses, or other related expenses. Coordination of county and VA-wide mental health outreach services shall be conducted to improve veterans' access to mental health services, and minimize health stigma by assuring veterans receive appropriate physical and mental healthcare treatment referrals. Outreach and services should not be limited to only veterans of current conflicts.

Some service-related outcomes should include:

- Collaborate with community-based service providers and institutions of higher education.
- Enhance the access to mental and physical healthcare of veterans and their families.
- Reduce stigma and encourage those with mental health needs to seek help by adopting educational mental health programs for veterans and their families.
- Promote programs that encourage early intervention of mental health needs for veterans and their families.
- Provide information for mental health services for re-entry and transitioning incarcerated veterans to help ensure they have the necessary support needed to return to their communities.
- Provide homeless veterans with referrals to supportive housing programs that include mental health treatment services
- Reduce the eligibility and enrollment barriers by providing timely and effective referrals to service providers.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

Additional funds will be used for mental health awareness/treatment programs for veterans.

BOARD RULES

Requests to Address Board on "Agenda" Items:

You may request to be heard on a published agenda item. Requests to be heard must be submitted to the Clerk of the Board before the scheduled meeting time.

Requests to Address Board on items that are "NOT" on the Agenda:

Notwithstanding any other provisions of these rules, member of the public shall have the right to address the Board during the mid-morning "Oral Communications" segment of the published agenda. Said purpose for address must pertain to issues which are under the direct jurisdiction of the Board of Supervisors. YOUR TIME WILL BE LIMITED TO THREE (3) MINUTES.

Power Point Presentations/Printed Material:

Speakers who intend to conduct a formalized Power Point presentation or provide printed material must notify the Clerk of the Board's Office by 12 noon on the Monday preceding the Tuesday Board meeting, insuring that the Clerk's Office has sufficient copies of all printed materials and at least one (1) copy of the Power Point CD. Copies of printed material given to the Clerk (by Monday noon deadline) will be provided to each Supervisor. If you have the need to use the overhead "Elmo" projector at the Board meeting, please insure your material is clear and with proper contrast, notifying the Clerk well ahead of the meeting, of your intent to use the Elmo.

Individual Speaker Limits:

Individual speakers are limited to a maximum of three (3) minutes. Please step up to the podium when the Chairman calls your name and begin speaking immediately. Pull the microphone to your mouth so that the Board, audience, and audio recording system hear you clearly. Once you start speaking, the "green" podium light will light. The "yellow" light will come on when you have one (1) minute remaining. When you have 30 seconds remaining, the "yellow" light will begin flash, indicating you must quickly wrap up your comments. Your time is up when the "red" light flashes. The Chairman adheres to a strict three (3) minutes per speaker. Note: If you intend to give your time to a "Group/Organized Presentation", please state so clearly at the very bottom of the reverse side of this form.

Group/Organized Presentations:

Group/organized presentations with more than one (1) speaker will be limited to nine (9) minutes at the Chairman's discretion. The organizer of the presentation will automatically receive the first three (3) minutes, with the remaining six (6) minutes relinquished by other speakers, as requested by them on a completed "Request to Speak" form, and clearly indicated at the front bottom of the form.

Addressing the Board & Acknowledgement by Chairman:

The Chairman will determine what order the speakers will address the Board, and will call on all speakers in pairs. The first speaker should immediately step to the podium and begin addressing the Board. The second speaker should take up a position in one of the chamber aisles in order to quickly step up to the podium after the preceding speaker. This is to afford an efficient and timely Board meeting, giving all attendees the opportunity to make their case. Speakers are prohibited from making personal attacks, and/or using coarse, crude, profane or vulgar language while speaking to the Board members, staff, the general public and/or meeting participants. Such behavior, at the discretion of the Board Chairman may result in removal from the Board Chambers by Sheriff Deputies.
