So many voting irregularities were told to me and a friend of mine that I felt it was worth coming to the meeting today to share my frustrations about the election day chaos at many polling places in Riverside County.

A friend's aunt and uncle went to vote at their polling place on June 7th, 2016. The husband was able to vote as usual since they both were long time registered Democrats in Riverside County at the same address for many years.

The aunt was unable to vote as her registration had somehow completely disappeared from the registrar's records. This is unacceptable. She had to go home and find her voter registration card that had come in the mail long ago and go back to the polling place to show it to the poll workers.

After some checking and a phone call by the poll worker, she was at last verified and able to vote. This kind of snafu is unacceptable. Our democracy should make it easy for residents to vote, not complicated and difficult.

Please see that some changes are instituted with our Registrar of Voter office so that this does not happen in the next election year.


Distinguished Members:

First, my father Manuel Garcia was made to vote on a provisional ballot due to the fact that he no longer drives. He is elderly and his driver's license has expired. When I accompanied him to vote his name could not be found. He has lived at the same address for almost 20 years and in his own words, "I have not died yet."

Second, my nephew Bryan Toledano attempted to vote just to find that his entire street did not appear on their map. He was forced to vote on a provisional ballot too. He was given a Provisional tracking number of 50427-30.

Finally, my mother-in-law Maria de la Lus Ramirez registered online to be able to vote. The process was done successfully or so she thought, but just days before the primary she received a notice on the mail telling her that she would not be able to vote in the primary due to a lack of signature.

Dear Supervisors,

I called to report a complaint about my Precinct Inspector Danielle M. Bitetti and Range Inspector Linda Arriaga on June 8th. I spoke with Toni???? in your absence and she said she would report this to you and have you get back to me.

Since I did not hear back from you and was not given the opportunity to document this in the precinct report I thought your office should know about this.

I worked as a precinct officer at the Cesar Chavez Community Center, 2060 University Ave. on June 7, 2016 from 6:30am-about 1:30pm when I was summarily dismissed "for being argumentative" with my inspector. I believe I was dismissed for trying to raise awareness that the precinct inspector and range inspector were not following the correct legal procedures for issuing Provisional Ballots as outlined in our ROV Election Officer handbook (page 70, 133), RCROV Presidential Addendum (page 7), CA Sec. of State Voter Bill of Rights (<http://www.sos.ca.gov>), RCROV Election Officer Training CD, RCROV Election Officer live training taken 5/20/16, and various California Election Code provisions as well as the HAVA requirements.

- 1) I was working the "A-L" line at this precinct and I observed between 6-10 voters being turned away without being offered a Provisional Ballot who should have been. (I can only imagine that the same was occurring in the "M-Z" line as Danielle Bitetti was standing behind us so she could observe what we were doing).
- 2) In some cases I observed Danielle Bitetti even telling the voter that she could give them a Provisional ballot "but it would not be counted anyway."
- 3) The voters who were turned away had several different profiles among which: Could not be found on our rosters; Could not be found in the RCROV registry; May have been registered somewhere else (but still entitled to submit a Provisional Ballot); said they had a felony record (but were not asked if they were currently on parole for the felony which is the only reason they would not have been entitled to a ballot); said they were homeless and had no address but wanted to vote; had a registration that said they were "inactive" even though they registered in 2012, etc....

4) After a significant number of voters seemed to be turned away, I expressed to Danielle Bitetti that these voters had been entitled to a Provisional Ballot. She said it was useless to give them one because it would not be counted anyways. I explained to her that it was not up to us to judge whether their vote was

to be counted because that was the purpose of the Provisional Ballot process---someone back at ROV over the next 30 days would be researching that person's ballot and be determining whether they were entitled to vote and in what races (for instance an LA County voter could have their votes for President and Senator counted but not Riverside or Congressional District races counted). I also referred her to the page in our Handbook that confirmed this. She did not seem to appreciate this information and told me "to go chase after them then if I wanted to give them a ballot."

5) Danielle Bitetti seemed to have difficulty making decisions in the difficult cases (a voter showing up with a NPP VBM and wanting a Democratic ballot, etc...) so she would look in her manual and call ROV and be on hold for lengthy periods of time. Offers to assist her in problem solving or coming up with an answer (Danielle can I help? Can I look something up? Can we put our heads together on this?) were often ignored or begrudgingly taken. I was concerned about voters being left waiting for lengthy periods of time so was attempting to assist in order to keep the voting process moving along and I was often able to quickly resolve the issue and come up with a solution for the voter which she did not seem to appreciate as "team work" but rather as interfering.

6) When the Range Inspector showed up, I posed the question about Provisional Ballots to her because I was concerned that we had been engaging in voter disenfranchisement for not offering Provisional Ballots and telling voters that if they voted Provisionally it would not get counted anyways. While she did not disagree with me that the voters should be given Provisional Ballots, she said, repeating what Danielle Bitetti had been saying, that it was useless to take them because it would not be counted, the ROV did not have the time or personnel to count a bunch of Provisional Ballots of people who may be from other counties. I told her that what they both were saying was contrary to my training, the training video, the handbook, etc....

7) I was called to the back of the room by Danielle Bitetti and Linda Arriaga and asked several questions and then was summarily dismissed for the day for "being argumentative."

8) I believe I was wrongly dismissed for speaking up when the law on Voting Rights was being violated and in order to prevent the issuance of Provisional Ballots to voters who were entitled to them.

9) Danielle Bitetti does not possess the "teamwork" attitude required to be an effective and responsible Precinct Inspector because she ignored the assistance of her precinct officers when she could not get through to ROV and kept voters waiting, she did not have the knowledge base to make the difficult calls correctly and she repeatedly ignored or refused the help or advice of her precinct officers. I recall from my own inspector training in 2012 being told to rely on your precinct officers as they often have as much or more knowledge than you! Instead I was told by Linda Arriaga that I was to listen to my precinct officer because she has more knowledge than you on these things and that I could refer to rules in the handbook or training all I wanted but there was a difference between the reality of how things work and the reference materials, rules, training, etc....

10) Also I was instructed by Danielle Bitetti not to offer the electronic voting machine to voters because it was unreliable, despite this instruction being contrary to the ROV training video.

I enjoy working the polls and ensuring the smooth voting process of this all important Constitutional right but it seemed that these 2 county employees were more interested in protecting the workload of the ROV county employees or limiting the number of Provisional Ballots issued than in complying with voting rights laws.

I look forward to working another assignment for the November election as I believe, and hope you agree that it is important to have election officers who know and understand the training, voting laws and how to work as a "team" with their precinct board.

Dear Supervisors,

While I didn't see any voter fraud I found one Republican's registration was changed to NPP and the NPP, with the same registration number was on the supplemental list.

There were too many provisionals, but we handed them out fairly at one of the polls I worked.

There seems to have been a huge problem with VBM voters who claimed they never received their ballots. We were wondering if they just did not send the card back to registration or they wanted to vote NPP or for some other party. If a VBM voter came in and was shown to be something they claimed they were not listed as, they got a provisional ballot of they (basically) demanded.

We did have one NPP fellow who demanded a Republican ballot, so we gave him a Republican Provisional although we knew is should not have been counted.

However, at around 7 PM two of the six of us at our assigned precinct had to quickly get to a precinct in Menifee where the Inspector had walked out several hours earlier.

We did the best we could with a borrowed poll worker from the precinct on the other side of the room and a wonderful, yet very young worker who was the only one of the assigned precinct workers to stay until 8pm. Apparently the other poll worker, besides the Inspector left around the middle of the day.

All this means very little towards the upcoming Nov. 8 because there will be only the same ballots no matter which party voters are affiliated with.

I strongly feel that 'veteran' poll workers be assigned at least one to a precinct. In my assigned precinct, three of the six of us were 'vets'. At the two precincts in the same room in the Menifee area where I went to, nobody was a 'vet'.

I also feel that since so many folks registered in 'my' precinct were VBM, for the General, perhaps two precincts sharing the same room can, somehow be combined into one larger precinct. That way more 'vets' can be spread out where needed.

The second precinct I was at finally got their ballots to the collection place a little after 11pm.

Apparently, earlier in the day, the Inspector at the second precinct couldn't get the AVU working so another one was delivered.

What also was VERY BAD is that when the second precinct was in such trouble, there was no range Inspector at the site. That would have helped both precincts do a proper closing and we could all have gotten out much earlier. The other precinct also had their share of issues.

Since I and the person who escorted the ballots with me were not from the Menifee area, but rather the Murrieta area, we had to place several calls to find out exactly where the dropoff center was. I called the range inspector before we left for the drop off point and she said she was leaving and would not be at the site when we eventually got there.

I am very sure the two teams I worked at did the best job possible and did not commit any fraud. I have to make many notes at the second precinct because security tags didn't match for closing and we could not have anything like a team A and a team B.

There needs to be great changes by the time the next primary rolls around in 2018. Perhaps changing to ink-a-vote ballots at the precincts would work better than the H U G E ballots everyone had to contend with.

Dear Supervisors,

I worked at a polling location in Riverside County with 2 precincts on Election Day. We got fully staffed only on the day of the primary, so a number of the workers did not receive previous training. We couldn't contact some of the poll workers because they were students and their contact information was protected by a system, which was down; they didn't show. Thankfully there were other students who showed up in response to a Facebook post the night before by one of the precinct captains and we trained them on the spot. There were a number of voters who stated their party preference had been changed without their knowledge, and an overwhelming number of voters who were listed as being vote-by-mail, though they stated they had not signed up as such. As a result, these voters had to vote provisionally, due to these discrepancies. We were posting notices that read that California has an "open" primary, when only 3 of the 6 political parties allowed only NPP voters and their party members (not voters registered in other parties) to vote in their primaries, which we then had to explain. On top of this, there were 4 different NPP ballots alone, in addition to separate ballots for each of the 6 different parties, including the Democratic Party, which had a separate ballot for voters registered as Democrats. This totaled 8, or possibly even 10 different ballots (I'm not certain if the American Independent Party and the Libertarian Party had separate NPP ballots from the regular ballots for those two parties).

As an NPP vote-by-mail voter myself (in San Bernardino County), I received two different ballots in the mail, a generic ballot with no presidential candidates listed, and a few days later one with the presidential candidates in the party I had requested listed. When I called to question why I received the first one when I had filled out the form to request a Democratic ballot, I was told that the generic ballots were sent out first, prior to the requests for a specific ballot being processed, and that the generic ballot had been cancelled, a stupefying explanation! When I asked Riverside County if they had handled their requests for specific ballots this way, they said no, that they processed the requests as they came in so this may not have been done here. But the most alarming fact of this election is the numbers of people who were on the voter register who were listed as vote-by-mail who said they either had not requested a mail ballot and/or who said they did not receive one. All of these issues created a chaotic, confusing situation for everyone concerned: poll workers, voters, and county elections workers alike, but particularly for NPP voters.

For starters, the deadline to register is far too early. Most Americans are too busy to remember to register three weeks in advance, and a lot of new voters don't even know of this deadline. Why can't they just walk in, register and vote all at the same time?

Another issue is that there are too many variables for ballots. Not only there's a different one for each party but also a variety of them according to the affiliation of the voter. How many average citizens know about the "Democratic Crossover Ballot"? Why is there a need for provisional ballots that won't be counted unless there's a specific situation in which the margin is way too close? What if by counting those provisional ballots is that the margin gets close? How about if all the first time voters made a mistake because of their inexperience in the election proses and all of them end up having to vote in provisional ballots? In that case we would be miscounting an entire demographic, is that fair?

If it's the people's duty to participate in democracy, isn't the government's duty to make it as straight forward as possible? Wouldn't it be better to simplify it as much as possible? Wouldn't it be a democracy's dream to make it as simple and straight forward that it became virtually impossible for a candidate to rig the election? Wouldn't it be better for all if we let the people

choose the candidates? 219 million people wouldn't choose the wrong president, would they? Wait, why out of those 219 million eligible voters only 146 million people are registered to vote? Every Vote Counts

Thank you for the privilege of speaking before our community's leaders.

You have heard the eyewitness accounts of those who preceded me. The deficiencies they describe included poor training of election workers, lost ballots, and the providing of provisional ballots when crossover ballots were called for. I myself walked neighborhoods in Riverside and with my teammates and encountered people who appeared to have been intimidated, being told whom to vote for, as well as people on the voters' list who may not have been eligible to vote. One night I called from a Riverside phone bank and asked for a man on the voter list who, I was told, had died in 1977. His wife and I reminisced about that year, for it was the year I was married.

Just like my comrades, I could go on. For example, a friend of mine, who had originally registered as No Political Party, had to challenge three voter officials when he went to vote, as he demanded a crossover ballot, only to have to finally acquire the ballot from a fourth, apparently a supervisor.

That's from us. The news media has much more. The *L.A. Times* of June 7 headlined their article on election day with the words "It was just chaos..." Writer Matt Pearce described late openings and incomplete voter rolls, and many have referred to the attempt by the Associated Press the night before the election to suppress the vote by polling super delegates in the Democratic Party and declaring one candidate the Presumptive nominee.

Heavy.com -- a personal favorite -- described many issues, including broken machines and altering of voter registrations. *Scpr.org's* Mary Plummer tells us that as of 16 June there were 1.4 million votes still to be counted. Other accounts reveal that at a time when the whole nation is being challenged to avoid placing onerous demands for identification on the poor and minorities lest they lose the practical ability to vote, the confusion at the polls compels our elections administrators to request multiple forms of ID and not less, suppressing the vote of the least fortunate.

Our votes -- your votes as well as ours -- matter. Do you know whether your vote was counted this month? I don't. I could not find out because of Riverside county elections phone numbers that couldn't connect with my home in Riverside County, because of web site dead ends, and because of the lack of instructions for common voters, not by mail or provisional, to find out if their votes were counted as required by law.

In 1960 a few votes in Cook county gave us President Kennedy rather than Nixon. In 2000 a handful of votes in Florida resulted in the election of George W. Bush rather than Al Gore. History as well as our own commitment to a better world demands that we make sure every vote is counted.

Therefore, we humbly suggest the imminent need for action. We would like to see

an investigation of the June 7, 2016, election process by a select blue-ribbon, bipartisan, or even multi-partisan group of citizens perhaps headed by the Lieutenant Governor. In addition we recommend the immediate, certainly before the November election, establishment of a well-trained, unionized civil service corps of elections workers to replace the volunteer, poorly paid poll workers we have now. Let's stop trying to choose those to whom the power of government is entrusted in the Twenty-first Century, by utilizing techniques unchanged since the Eighteenth Century.
