**SUBJECT:** Approval of the Contract Aggregate to Provide Children's Mental Health Services; District: All; [\$21,673,342]; Federal Funds 50%, State Funds 50%; [\$0 ongoing]

**RECOMMENDED MOTION:** That the Board of Supervisors:

1. Approve an increase to the annual combined contract aggregate amount of \$21,673,342 for Central Children's Mental Health Services for FY16/17;
2. Authorize the Purchasing Agent to sign the Agreements as listed in Attachment A, as approved to form by County Counsel;
3. Exempt the County Purchasing Agent from the sole source requirement when adding new vendors not to exceed \$100,000 without securing competitive bids in accordance with Ordinance 459 while staying within the Board approved aggregate amount of \$21,673,342; and
4. Authorize the Purchasing Agent, in accordance with Ordinance No. 459, based upon the availability of funding and as approved by County Counsel to: a) increase or decrease the Agreements listed in Attachment A; b) shift funds while staying within 10% contingency of the approved aggregate amount of \$21,673,342; c) sign renewals; and, d) sign amendments that do not change the substantive terms of the Agreements through June 30, 2017.

**BACKGROUND:**

**Summary**

On June 30, 2015, (3-35) the Board of Supervisors approved the combined contract aggregate for Children's Mental Health Services in the amount of \$20,810,625 for FY15/16. RUHS-BH requests that the Board approve increasing the contract aggregate amount to \$21,673,342 for FY16/17 in order to provide additional Wraparound services. In addition, the vendors in Attachment A will provide Pathways to Wellness services, a State requirement as a result of the "Katie A" lawsuit. The "Katie A" lawsuit settlement requires California counties to provide mental health services to an increased population of children under the age of 18 and their families, who are either in foster care or at imminent risk of entering the child welfare system. Children's Mental Health Services are fully reimbursed by State and Federal funds and no additional County funds are required. These services include:

- Day Treatment
- Case Management/Brokerage
- Mental Health Services (Individual, Group and Family Therapy)
- Therapeutic Behavioral Services
- Behavioral Coaching Services (MHSA funded)
- Medication Evaluation and Monitoring
- Crisis Intervention
- Intensive Home Based Services

**Impact on Citizens and Businesses**

These services are a component of Behavioral Health's system of care aimed at improving the health and safety of consumers and the community.

**Contract History and Price Reasonableness**

Due to the specialized services provided, RUHS-BH requires the flexibility to add vendors if necessary to ensure continuity of care. The reimbursement rates for the Agreements outlined in Attachment A cannot exceed the County's maximum allowance and have termination clauses in the event that applicable funds become unavailable for service provision. There are sufficient funds in the Department's FY16/17 budget, and no additional County funds are required.

The department will be developing a Request for Proposal in FY16/17 for these services. RUHS-BH is requesting contract approval for these vendors in the interim to avoid interruption of services and ensure continuity of care for consumers.
