On motion of Supervisor Ashley, seconded by Supervisor Benoit, and duly carried by unanimous vote, IT WAS ORDERED that the meeting of Tuesday, September 13, 2016, be adjourned in memory of Alberta Mable Kearney, a 95-year-old resident of Perris, California who passed away on September 9, 2016 and will always be remembered as a mentor to hundreds of students and adults in the Perris Valley.

An instrumental force in the community, Alberta resided in Perris for 60 years and was founder of the Dora Nelson African American Art & History Museum in the City of Perris. After moving to Perris in 1957, she purchased the former First Baptist Church building, which was dilapidated, and supervised its demolition without realizing the historical significance. Disappointed over losing a historical site, she spent the rest of her life collecting memorabilia that told the story of the African-American experience in the Perris Valley. Over the years, she collected items owned by Nelson and others who contributed to improving race relations.

A month before her death, Alberta was present as representatives from the Association of African-American Museums toured the renovated Nelson Museum, named in honor of a former slave and founder of the City's first black congregation. The City of Perris and Riverside County Supervisor Marion Ashley helped pay for the renovations, which included a new roof, landscaping, fencing, interior paint, and flooring. While dignitaries from Washington D.C. toured the remodeled museum on East Seventh Street, she was "all smiles" and praised the efforts of the City, County, and volunteers.

Alberta's memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved her. She will be dearly missed but never forgotten.
