BACKGROUND: Summary

- The Blythe Emergency Food Pantry provides and distributes supplementary food to low-income families and the homeless in eastern Riverside County. This emergency food pantry serves approximately 30 families each day with supplemental meals and distributes food to more than 400 families each month. CID funds will be used toward the cost of food and operating expenses.
- 2. The Blythe Harmony Kitchen provides hot meals five days a week for senior citizens, low-income and homeless people in the community of Blythe and the surrounding communities of Mesa Verde and Ripley. Blythe Harmony Kitchen serves approximately 100 meals each day and 23,000 meals per year. CID funds will be used toward the cost of food and operating expenses.
- 3. The Desert Hot Springs Family Resource Center will hold its annual holiday event, the Build-A-Bike Project on December 21, 2016. This event is a way to help families during the holiday season as well as to encourage exercise and healthy activities for their children. The Desert Hot Springs Family Resource Center Advisory Board will distribute bicycles to children from low income families in the Desert Hot Springs area. CID funds will be used to purchase bikes, helmets and bike locks for children selected to participate in this event.
- 4. The Red Hot Ballroom, Inc. is a non-profit after-school program providing students the opportunity to participate in dance instruction. This program is in 13 schools in the Coachella Valley Unified School District, 17 schools in the Desert Sands Unified School District and seven schools in the Palm Springs Unified School District. The dance program teaches social skills, self-esteem, respect for others and healthy physical exercise. At the end of the school year Red Hot Ballroom holds a dance competition among school districts. CID funds will be used toward the cost of dance shoes and dance outfits for students who cannot afford to purchase them.
