BACKGROUND:

Summary

1. The Palo Verde Valley Transit Agency (PVVTA) was recently awarded grant funding from the Federal Transit Administration to establish a new transportation service, the Blythe Wellness Express. The Blythe Wellness Express will be used to help fill a critical transportation gap for Palo Verde Valley residents to access healthcare. This program anticipates an estimated 2,660 passenger trips, annually, to and from medical facilities in the Coachella Valley and farther west of Riverside County. CID funds will be used toward the cost of operational expenses for this program.

2. The Southern California Energy Water plus Green Living Summit will be held Oct. 26-27 at the Agua Caliente Casino Resort Spa in Rancho Mirage. The 2016 Summit will kick off with a welcome reception Oct. 26. On Oct. 27, the conference will feature a full day of interactive educational sessions, keynote presentations and panel discussions. Scholarships to attend the conference are awarded to students from the Desert Mirage High School Green Academy, Desert Hot Springs Renewable Energy Academy of Learning, and Desert Smart Robotics Club as well as college students. The students will be able to demonstrate their work in exhibit booths, attend conference programs, and interact with speakers. CID funding will provide scholarships for approximately 100 students.
