

BACKGROUND: Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

1. **Women Wonder Writers - \$1,000** funding will be used to assist with the "Books con Amigos" event held in collaboration with the City of Riverside and the Spanish Town Heritage Foundation. This event focuses on literacy and healthy family relationships for at-risk children. This event is free and open to the public.
2. **Riverside Medical Clinic Charitable Foundation- \$1,000** funding will be used to provide training to educators, law enforcement, youth leaders, and community representatives who are committed to ending bullying
3. **Riverside African American Historical Society - \$1,500** funding will be used to support the Eleanor Jean Grier Leadership Academy Project which provides a leadership program for underrepresented/underserved adults. The academy project utilizes an all-volunteer staff and funding will be used to offset the cost of classroom supplies.
