

BACKGROUND:

Summary

California Government Code Section 26530 states, unless otherwise designated by the Board of Supervisors pursuant to Section 5114 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, the District Attorney shall represent the County in proceeding under Part 1 (commencing with Section 5000) of Division 5 of the Welfare and Institutions Code (cited and known as the Lanterman-Petris-Short Act). Section 5114 provides that the Board of Supervisors may delegate such duty to the County Counsel by ordinance or resolution.

The County Counsel's office has historically provided representation to the Behavioral Health Department in judicial proceedings when allegations have been made that a person is a danger to others, or to himself, or gravely disabled as a result of a mental disorder or impairment by chronic alcoholism.

The Behavioral Health Department has requested that the County Counsel's office continue to provide legal representation to their department. The Riverside County District Attorney's Office has confirmed that it has no objection with the County Counsel's Office continuing to provide representation to Riverside University Health System - Behavioral Health Department.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

Additional Fiscal Information:

The Department of Mental Health will continue to provide funding to County Counsel when representation is requested. Based on previous fiscal years for costs for services, it is anticipated that County Counsel will bill approximately \$15,000.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS DESIGNATING THE COUNTY COUNSEL TO REPRESENT THE COUNTY IN MENTAL HEALTH PROCEEDINGS BROUGHT UNDER THE LANTERMAN-PETRIS-SHORT ACT

WHEREAS, California Government Code Section 26530, requires the District Attorney to represent the County in proceedings brought under Part 1 (commencing with Section 5000) of Division 5 of the Welfare and Institutions Code (Lanterman-Petris-Short Act) unless the Board of Supervisors otherwise designates said representation to County Counsel pursuant to California Welfare and Institutions Code Section 5114; and

WHEREAS, upon designation by the Board of Supervisors, California Government Code Section 27646 requires the County Counsel to represent the County of Riverside in mental health proceedings; and

WHEREAS, the District Attorney has confirmed that he has no objection to the County Counsel representing the County of Riverside in said mental health proceedings; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to California Welfare and Institutions Code Section 5114 the designation of the County Counsel is required to be made by ordinance or resolution; and

WHEREAS, the Director of Riverside University Health System - Behavioral Health requests that County Counsel represent the County in said mental health proceeding and the Board of Supervisors acknowledges the need for such a designation;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside, in regular session assembled on December 6, 2016, hereby designates the County Counsel to represent the County of Riverside in mental health proceedings brought under Welfare and Institution Code Section 5000 et seq., known and cited as the Lanterman-Petris-Short Act.
