Born on February 23, 1927 in Batavia, New York, Tellis spent much of his early youth in Portland, Oregon and then moved to the Coachella Valley, where he met his future wife, Elvera Marie Polikronis, while attending Coachella Valley High School. He enlisted in the United States Navy after high school and served as an electronic technician's mate in the South Pacific onboard the aircraft carrier USS Shangri-La. He then attended college at the University of Portland and the University of California, Los Angeles before returning to the Coachella Valley in 1951 to help run the family's businesses following the death of his father.

On November 4, 1951, Tellis and Elvera were married in San Jose, after which they settled in Thermal and raised three daughters: Pauline Tarnow, Elaine Fleck, and Katherine Codekas. They operated the former Sun Gold Date Gardens, Gift Shop, and Motel on Highway 111 between Indio and Palm Springs. Later, Tellis went to work for Cal-Date, a division of Tenneco West, from which he retired as a Vice-President in 1985.

In addition to his more than 35 years of work as a rancher and businessman growing dates, table grapes, and citrus in the valley, Tellis served on numerous public boards and associations throughout the area including the Thermal Elementary School District Board and the Riverside County Fair Board. He also served as Chairman of the California Date Administrative Committee and the California Date Packers Council, as a Director of the Colorado River Water Users Association, as a member of the Association of California Water Agencies, and as President of the Salton Sea Authority. He is best known for his decades of service as a Director of the Coachella Valley Water District. In 2007, the California Date Administrative Committee honored him with the Sunny Chuchian Award of Excellence for his years of service to the date industry.
