Born in Franklin, Los Angeles, California, Stuart graduated from Louisiana State University with a Bachelor's Degree in Science in 1979 and received his Medical Degree, Internship, and Residency from LSU in 1984. He completed his fellowship training in Interventional Radiology at UC-San Diego in 1990.

After his fellowship, Stuart moved to Rancho Mirage and began his career at Eisenhower Medical Center. He was the Director of the Vascular and Interventional Radiology Department at Eisenhower where he helped develop one of the first aortic stent graft programs in Southern California. In 2001, he established one of the first virtual colonoscopy programs in the nation and helped in the development of the first FDA approved 3-D virtual colonoscopy system with the Viatronix Corporation.

In 2003, Stuart started the first MRI Breast Cancer Detection program in the Coachella Valley. He began working at Desert Medical Imaging in 2008 where he helped establish one of the first outpatient MRI-guided prostate biopsy and laser centers in the world.

Stuart was a loving and devoted husband, father, brother, uncle, and friend. His memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved him. He will be greatly missed but never forgotten.

On motion of Supervisor Ashley, seconded by Supervisor Tavaglione, and duly carried by unanimous vote, IT WAS ORDERED that the meeting of Tuesday, February 7, 2017, be adjourned in memory of William P. Moss II, a 96-year-old resident of Indian Wells, California who passed away on January 22, 2017 and will always be remembered as an “oil executive, movie producer, rancher, author, political confidant, and spiritual mentor.”

Born in 1920 in Wyoming, William grew up in the oil fields of Odessa, Texas, attended San Marcos Academy, graduated from Baylor University, and served in the U.S. Army Air Corps during World War II. In 1968, he helped organize the Petroleum Corporation of America which was merged with Presidio Oil Company in 1987.

A lifelong Republican and GOP fundraiser, William served on the George H.W. Bush for President National Steering Committee and was appointed Chairman of the President’s Drug Advisory Council. This effort was the beginning of the privately-funded organization “Community Anti-Drug Coalitions” which now exists across forty states. He helped initiate Team 100, a successful National GOP fundraising organization, and was a founder of the National Republican Senatorial Trust Committee.

William founded the William Moss Institute in conjunction with American University, Washington, D.C. He served on the University’s Board of Trustees and was Chairman of the Investment Committee. At Southern Methodist University, William established the Free Enterprise Institute. He was a supporter of the John Goodwin Tower Center for Political Studies and served on the Board of the Margaret Thatcher Foundation.

William was Founder and Chairman of the Television Corporation of America which produced the peabody award-winning “784 Days that Changed America—from Watergate to Resignation.” When he married Dianne Ingels in 1995, they partnered in many public service initiatives including conceiving and initially funding the Washington National Cathedral’s Center for Global Justice and Reconciliation.

At age 85, William had a “spiritual awakening” and dedicated his life to assisting other “alcoholics” on a journey to sobriety. He published two books, “Finding Inner Peace During Troubled Times” and “It’s never Too Late.” He was recognized for his spiritual contributions to the work of the Salvation Army and Prison Fellowship.

William was a loving and devoted husband, father, grandfather, great-grandfather, and friend. His memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved him. He will be greatly missed but never forgotten.
