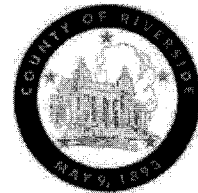



BACKGROUND:

Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

1. **Santa Rosa Plateau Nature Education Foundation - \$1,500** funding will be used to support the "No Child Left Inside" Environmental Education Program which teaches students about unique plants, animals and habitats at the Santa Rosa Plateau Ecological Reserve. Over 8,000 students from 10 school districts in grades 3-12 participate in this educational program.
