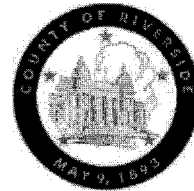



Term of Appointment: Three-year term beginning July 1, 2017 and ending June 30, 2020

Freymuth currently serves on the Palm Springs Airport Commission and has more than 40 years of experience in the airline industry. Born and educated in Germany, Freymuth began his career with Pan Am working in reservations, ramp operations and sales. In 1965, he moved to the United States with Lufthansa as an account executive and a group and charter specialist, working in New York, Denver and Chicago. Several years later, he was appointed regional director – North America for Air Siam based in Los Angeles to prepare for the airline's new B747 service.

Freymuth went on to join LTU International Airways (a \$3 billion company and Germany's second-largest carrier) to prepare for the carrier's introduction of transatlantic service. Peter headed up LTU's wholly owned subsidiary in the Americas as president and chief executive officer for 25 years before retiring in 2001 after LTU had been acquired by Swissair.
