Born on June 3, 1932 in Charleston, West Virginia, Denham spent the first ten years of his life in a small cabin with no running water in Campbells Creek, West Virginia. He loved the family cow, Bessie, and playing outside in the wide open spaces of coal mining country. After 26 years in the coal mines, his father chose a new life for their family and moved to Washington, D.C. Denham spent many hours at the D.C. Metropolitan Police Boys Club, where he competed in boxing and basketball. As a teen, he worked at Camp Ernest W. Brown Boys Club in Scotland, Maryland as a summer counselor.

Upon graduating from Eastern High School, Denham joined the U.S. Navy and served on a destroyer traveling the world and serving in hostile waters. After four years of service during the Korean War, he started a career in the trades as a lineman for the Potomac Electric Power Company. He later became part of the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, working as a respected journeyman lineman for many years.

In 1978, Denham and his wife Barbara relocated to Orange County, California with their children. He started a new career as a general contractor flipping houses and renovating homes along the coast long before it became a trend. They lived in Mission Viejo, San Clemente, and Carlsbad before settling in Sun City in Menifee in 1999.

Born on June 15, 1917 in Bellefonte, Pennsylvania, "Candy" was raised in a orphanage with her siblings and mother who was the seamstress. She married Ford Barton in 1950, graduated with a Masters Degree in Physical Education in 1952, and worked as a PE teacher for 36 years.

During the war, while still living in Pennsylvania, Candy took over the football team for the football coach who had gone to war. After reading books on how to coach football, she went on to win their division that year.

While living in Leisure World in Laguna Woods, Candy and her husband Ford were involved in the Aquadettes Ladies Synchronized Swimming Club. During a visit with some of her Delta Psi Kappa Sorority Sisters from Temple University, she had an opportunity to meet with the Queen of England to ask if Synchronized Swimming could be added to the Olympics which were to be held in England that year. When the Queen asked Candy to stay and teach her children to swim, she declined in order to get back to the U.S.

An instrumental force in the community, Candy was a "beloved" teacher at Poly, Ramona, and Arlington High Schools in Riverside and taught swim lessons for many years. She was a "strong woman of faith" and was very involved in her church, where she was a deacon. She also enjoyed traveling and being active such as river rafting in Colorado and dog sledding in Alaska.

Candy was a loving wife to her husband who preceded her in death and a devoted step-mother, grandmother, great-grandmother, great-great-grandmother, sister, and friend. Her memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved her. She will be greatly missed but never forgotten.

Born and raised in Los Angeles, California, Shirley had a "blended" career in the Military for thirty-eight years and the private Aerospace industry for forty-five years. She proudly served in the U.S. Air Force from 1962 to 1967 and served in the Air Force Reserves from 1967 to 1981. She then transferred to the California Air National Guard Program, retiring in 2000 as a Chief Master Sergeant. She had numerous tours in support of Vietnam, Desert Shield/Storm, and other international and domestic tours.

As a Senior Quality Engineer, Shirley's expertise was recognized as a Quality Practitioner and Quality Engineering Management Consultant in Quality Management (TQM) theory, principals and organizational reengineering (radical process redesign), process engineering, and system/process analysis. She was also a certified professional civilian and Military training instructor and facilitator.

During her Military service, Shirley earned many decorations and awards including the Meritorious Service Medal, the AF Commendation Medal with two OLC, the Presidential Unit Citation with one OLC, the Combat Readiness Medal with one SOLC, the Air Reserve Forces Meritorious Service Medal with one HG and three Mobility Devices, the National Defense Service Ribbon with BS, the Vietnam Service Medal, and the Southwest Asia Service Medal, et al.

An inspirational force in the community, Shirley was a life member of the Air Force Association and served as Treasurer on the Board of Directors of the Palm Springs Chapter 134. She was a Fourth District Representative on the Riverside County Veterans Advisory Committee and a member of U.S. Congressman Ruiz's Veterans Advisory Board and his Military Academy Nominations Selection Committee. She was a life member of the Air Force Sergeants Association, the Noncommissioned Officer Association, and the Enlisted Association of the National Guard (Cal-EANGUS). She was also a member of the Desert Veterans Memorial Association, the Women's Air Force Association (WAFA), and the American Legion Palm Springs Post 519.
