On motion of Supervisor Ashley, seconded by Supervisor Tavaglione, and duly carried by unanimous vote, IT WAS ORDERED that the meeting of Tuesday, April 11, 2017, be adjourned in memory of William Jefferson Adams, an 89-year-old resident of Palm Desert, California who passed away on March 17, 2017.

Born on December 12, 1927 in Ventura, California, William studied in Los Angeles until 1941, then in Sacramento and San Bernardino. He studied pre-law at San Bernardino Valley Junior College prior to enlisting in the United States Army Air Corps in 1946. He attended San Jose State College from 1947 to 1950, graduating cum laude with departmental honors in French.

During the Korean Conflict, William resumed U.S. Army service with Military Intelligence from 1950 to 1952. He attended Hastings Law School in San Francisco from 1952 to 1955, served as Associate Editor of its Law Journal, and graduated second in his class with membership in the Oder of the Coif.

William clerked for the California Supreme Court and then pursued private practice in California, migrating towards municipal and government law. He served in City Attorney roles for Atwater, Merced, Palm Springs, and Indian Wells in California and served on or represented numerous governmental bodies. In the early 1990's, he resumed private practice focusing on municipal and governmental law. He retired from all practice of law in 2010.

An avid aviator since 1959, William held licenses for powered and sailplane aircraft and hot air ballons. He was a prominent supporter of the Merced Antique Fly-In in the 1960's and 1970's, serving as announcer. He also participated in hot air ballooning in the Coachella Valley and Southern California for many years.

William was a loving and devoted husband, father, grandfather, great-grandfather, and friend. His memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved him. He will be greatly missed but never forgotten.

His education includes an Associate Degree in Nuclear Medicine Technology from the Community College of Denver and a Masters Degree in Public Administration with a Hospital Management emphasis from National University, San Diego.

An inspirational force in his communities and country, Ray's prominent career and accomplishments are remarkable. He oversaw numerous medical service schools; served ten years of active duty with two tours in Vietnam as a Combat Medic; twenty-six years in the Naval Reserve as Training, Executive, and Commanding Officer; twenty-six years as Veterans Administration Department of Medicine and Surgery; and Chief of Research Operations for seventeen years at VA Medical Center in Loma Linda. He was an active board member for various nonprofits such as American Red Cross, American Cancer Society, and Kiwanis Club of San Bernardino. His commitment to community service was recognized with the Congressional Excalibur Award and Citizen of the Year by the League of Women Voters in San Bernardino.


