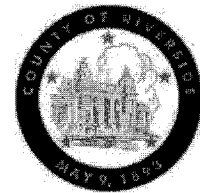



**SUBMITTAL TO THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE,
STATE OF CALIFORNIA**

BACKGROUND:

Municipal Advisory Councils have been established in several unincorporated communities through the County and have proven very successful in providing input to the Board of Supervisors on matters pertaining to public health, safety, welfare, public works and planning. On June 30, 1998, in Resolution No. 98-220, the Board of Supervisors established a Municipal Advisory Council for the Temescal Canyon territory. On February 24, 2009, in Resolution No. 2009-047, the Board of Supervisors changed the name of the Municipal Advisory Council from Temescal Canyon Municipal Advisory Council to Temescal Valley Municipal Advisory Council; reduced the membership from seven (7) regular members and two (2) alternate members to five (5) regular members and one (1) alternate member; and changed the eligibility requirements for members.

Resolution No. 2017-080 will amend the "Membership" provision to add a second alternate member to the Temescal Valley Municipal Advisory Council to help ensure there is always a quorum available to act. The alternate member may act in place of a regular member when a regular member is absent from a Municipal Advisory Council meeting. Resolution No. 2017-080 will also amend the "Membership" provision from four (4) regular members who are "residents or landowners" within the Temescal Valley territory and one (1) regular member from the "commercial business or mining or heavy industrial uses sector" in the Temescal Valley territory to five (5) regular members who are "residents, landowners, or business owners" within the Temescal Valley territory. Resolution No. 2017-080 will also amend the "Term" provision to a two (2) year term beginning on July 1 of the appointed year and expiring two (2) years later on June 30. Finally, Resolution No. 2017-080 will also amend the "Term" provision to stagger the terms of the regular members and alternate members to help ensure that there is always a quorum available to act. These amendments are desired by the Temescal Valley Municipal Advisory Council and the First District Supervisor to best suit the needs and interests of the Temescal Valley territory and the First District Supervisor.

4 A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE
5 AMENDING THE STRUCTURE OF THE TEMESCAL VALLEY MUNICIPAL ADVISORY
6 COUNCIL AND SUPERSEDING RESOLUTION NOS. 98-220 AND 2009-047

7 WHEREAS, on June 30, 1998, the Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution No. 98-220
8 establishing the Temescal Canyon Municipal Advisory Council for the purpose of advising the Board of
9 Supervisors on matters including, but not limited to, public health, safety, welfare, public works and
10 planning;

11 WHEREAS, on February 24, 2009, the Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution No. 2009-047
12 changing the name of the Municipal Advisory Council from Temescal Canyon Municipal Advisory
13 Council to Temescal Valley Municipal Advisory Council;

14 WHEREAS, Resolution No. 2009-047 reduced the membership of the Temescal Canyon
15 Municipal Advisory Council from seven (7) regular members and two (2) alternate members to five (5)
16 regular members and one (1) alternate member;

17 WHEREAS, Resolution No. 2009-047 changed the eligibility requirements for members from one
18 (1) regular member from each of seven (7) designated areas to "every effort shall be made to include four
19 (4) regular members who are residents or landowners within the Temescal Valley Municipal Advisory
20 Council territory and one (1) regular member which shall be from the commercial business or mining or
21 heavy industrial uses sector in the Temescal Valley Municipal Advisory Council territory;"

22 WHEREAS, it is now desired by the Temescal Valley Municipal Advisory Council and the First
23 District Supervisor to amend the "Membership" provision to add a second alternate member to the
24 Temescal Valley Municipal Advisory Council;

25 WHEREAS, having a second alternate member appointed to the Temescal Valley Municipal
26 Advisory Council will best suit the needs and interests of the Temescal Valley territory and the First
27 District Supervisor because it will help ensure that there is always a quorum available to act on matters
28 coming before the Municipal Advisory Council;

1 WHEREAS, Board of Supervisors' Policy No. A-51 regarding the formation and operation of
2 Municipal Advisory Councils and Community Councils does not address having alternate members but
3 does state that Board of Supervisors' appointments may be done "in such manner as it is determined best
4 suits the needs and interests of the community being served and the supervisor being advised;"

5 WHEREAS, it is now desired by the Temescal Valley Municipal Advisory Council and the First
6 District Supervisor to amend the "Membership" provision to change the eligibility requirements for
7 members from "every effort shall be made to include four (4) regular members who are residents or
8 landowners within the Temescal Valley Municipal Advisory Council territory and one (1) regular member
9 which shall be from the commercial business or mining or heavy industrial uses sector in the Temescal
10 Valley Municipal Advisory Council territory" to "All appointed members shall be at least eighteen (18)
11 years of age and residents, landowners, or business owners within the Temescal Valley Municipal
12 Advisory Council territory described in Exhibit A," as authorized by California Government Code
13 Section 31010;

14 WHEREAS, California Government Code Section 31010 allows for a Resolution establishing or
15 amending the structure of any Municipal Advisory Council or Community Council to provide for the
16 qualifications of its members;

17 WHEREAS, it is now desired by the Temescal Valley Municipal Advisory Council and the First
18 District Supervisor to amend the "Term" provision from a two (2) year term beginning on May 1 of the
19 appointed year and expiring two (2) years later on April 30 to a two (2) year term beginning on July 1 of
20 the appointed year and expiring two (2) years later on June 30 to best suit the needs and interests of the
21 Woodcrest territory and the First District Supervisor;

22 WHEREAS, Board of Supervisors' Policy No. A-51 does not address the specific months during
23 which a member's term must begin and end but only addresses term limits of two or four years and states
24 that all members "serve at the pleasure of their district supervisor;"

25 WHEREAS, it is now desired by the Temescal Valley Municipal Advisory Council and the First
26 District Supervisor to amend the "Term" provision to stagger the terms of the regular members and
27 alternate members because it will help ensure that there is always a quorum available to act on matters
28 coming before the Municipal Advisory Council;

1 WHEREAS, Board of Supervisors' Policy No. A-51 does not address the staggering of terms but
2 only addresses term limits of two or four years and states that all members "serve at the pleasure of their
3 district supervisor;" and

4 WHEREAS, California Government Code Section 31010 providing for the establishment of
5 Municipal Advisory Councils does not address a specific membership or term structure for a Municipal
6 Advisory Council but does state that a Board of Supervisors' resolution establishing any municipal
7 advisory council shall provide for "the qualifications, number, and method of selection of its members,
8 whether by election or appointment;"

9 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED by the Board of Supervisors of the
10 County of Riverside, in regular session assembled on May 2, 2017 that the structure of the
11 Temescal Valley Municipal Advisory Council is hereby modified as follows;

12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED AND ORDERED that the operation of the Temescal Valley
13 Municipal Advisory Council shall be in compliance with the rules, regulations and procedures prescribed
14 in Riverside County Board of Supervisors Policy No. A-51, and with the specific provisions delineated
15 below in this Resolution.

- 16 1. TERRITORY. The territory for which the Temescal Valley Municipal Advisory Council is
17 established, and area over which it extends, is situated within the First Supervisorial District
18 along the Interstate Highway 15 corridor defined, more or less, by Corona to the north, Lake
19 Matthews to the east, Lake Elsinore to the south and the Cleveland National Forest and Orange
20 County line to the west, as more specifically shown and depicted in Exhibit A to this
21 Resolution.
- 22 2. MEMBERSHIP. The Temescal Valley Municipal Advisory Council shall consist of five (5)
23 regular members and two (2) alternate members, each of who shall be appointed by and serve
24 at large at the pleasure of the First District Supervisor. The two (2) alternate members may act
25 in place of a regular member when a regular member is absent from a Municipal Advisory
26 Council meeting. All appointed members shall be at least eighteen (18) years of age and
27 residents, landowners, or business owners within the Temescal Valley Municipal Advisory
28 Council territory described in Exhibit A.

- 1 3. TERM. Appointed members shall serve without compensation for a term of two (2) years
2 beginning on July 1 of the appointed year and expiring two (2) years later on June 30.
3 However in order to establish a system of staggered terms, the members shall classify
4 themselves as follows: three (3) regular members and one (1) alternate member shall serve a
5 two (2) year term beginning on July 1 of an odd-numbered year and expiring two (2) years
6 later on June 30 of an odd-numbered year; and two (2) regular members and one (1) alternate
7 member shall serve a two (2) year term beginning on July 1 of an even-numbered year and
8 expiring two (2) years later on June 30 of an even-numbered year. An odd-numbered or even-
9 numbered year is designated as such if the last digit in the calendar year is an odd number or
10 an even number, respectively. All appointed members shall serve at the pleasure of the
11 District Supervisor.
- 12 4. BOARD OF SUPERVISORS' POLICY NO. A-51. The provisions of Board of Supervisors
13 Policy No. A-51 on the subject of "Formation/Operation of Municipal Advisory Councils and
14 Community Councils" are incorporated into this Resolution by reference, and are intended for
15 the guidance of the Temescal Valley Municipal Advisory Council unless explicitly stated
16 otherwise by this Resolution.
- 17 5. SUPERSEDING RESOLUTION NO. 98-220 AND RESOLUTION NO. 2009-047.
18 Resolution No. 98-220 previously adopted on June 22, 1998 and Resolution No. 2009-047
19 previously adopted on February 24, 2009 are hereby superseded and replaced by this
20 Resolution No. 2017-080.

LEGAL DESCRIPTION

LYING WITHIN THE UNINCORPORATED AREA OF RIVERSIDE COUNTY, CALIFORNIA,
DESCRIBED AS FOLLOWS:

BEGINNING AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 15, TOWNSHIP 4 SOUTH, RANGE 6 WEST, SBBM;

THENCE EAST ALONG THE NORTH LINE OF SAID SECTION 15, TO THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SAID SECTION 15;

THENCE SOUTH ALONG THE EAST LINE OF SAID SECTION 15 AND ALONG THE EAST LINE OF SECTION 22, TOWNSHIP 4 SOUTH, RANGE 6 WEST, SBBM, TO THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SAID SECTION 22;

THENCE EAST ALONG THE NORTH LINE OF SECTION 26 TOWNSHIP 4 SOUTH, RANGE 6 WEST, SBBM, TO THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SAID SECTION 26;

THENCE SOUTH ALONG THE EAST LINE OF SAID SECTION 26 TO THE RANCHO EL SOBRANTE DE SAN JACINTO RANCHO LINE;

THENCE EAST ALONG SAID RANCHO LINE TO THE EAST LINE OF SECTION 30, TOWNSHIP 4 SOUTH, RANGE 5 WEST, SBBM;

THENCE SOUTH ALONG THE EAST LINE OF SAID SECTION 30, AND THE EAST LINE OF SECTION 31, TOWNSHIP 4 SOUTH, RANGE 5 WEST, SBBM, TO THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SAID SECTION 31;

THENCE WEST ALONG THE SOUTH LINE OF SAID SECTION 31 TO THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 6, TOWNSHIP 5 SOUTH, RANGE 5 WEST SBBM;

THENCE SOUTH ALONG THE EAST LINE OF SAID SECTION 6 TO THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SAID SECTION 6;

THENCE EAST ALONG THE NORTH LINE OF SECTION 8, TOWNSHIP 5 SOUTH, RANGE 5 WEST, SBBM TO THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SAID SECTION 8;

THENCE EAST ALONG THE NORTH LINE OF SECTION 16, TOWNSHIP 5 SOUTH, RANGE 5 WEST, SBBM, TO THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SAID SECTION 16, BEING A POINT ON THE CITY LIMITS OF THE CITY OF LAKE ELSINORE, COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE, STATE OF CALIFORNIA;

LEGAL DESCRIPTION

THENCE SOUTHERLY AND WESTERLY, ALONG THE VARIOUS COURSES OF LAKE ELSINORE CITY LIMITS TO THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 20, TOWNSHIP 5 SOUTH, RANGE 5 WEST, SBBM ALSO BEING A POINT ON THE BOUNDARY OF THE CLEVELAND NATIONAL FOREST;

THENCE WESTERLY, SOUTHERLY, WESTERLY, AND NORTHERLY ALONG THE VARIOUS COURSES OF THE CLEVELAND NATIONAL FOREST TO THE COMMON BOUNDARY LINE OF THE FIRST AND SECOND SUPERVISORIAL DISTRICTS;

THENCE NORTHERLY AND EASTERLY ALONG SAID SUPERVISORIAL BOUNDARY LINE TO THE CITY LIMITS LINE OF THE CITY OF CORONA, COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE, STATE OF CALIFORNIA;

THENCE NORTHERLY, EASTERLY AND WESTERLY ALONG THE VARIOUS COURSES OF SAID CITY LIMITS TO A POINT ON THE WEST SECTION LINE OF SECTION 15, TOWNSHIP 4 SOUTH, RANGE 6 WEST, SBBM;

THENCE NORTH ALONG SAID WEST SECTION LINE TO A POINT ON THE CENTER OF SECTION LINE OF SAID SECTION 15, ACCEPTED AS S. J. COMPROMISE CORNER, AS SHOWN ON RECORD OF SURVEY, BOOK 126, PAGES 17 THROUGH 20, INCLUSIVE, OF MAPS;








THENCE WEST ALONG SAID CENTER OF SECTION LINE TO THE WEST QUARTER CORNER OF SAID SECTION 15;

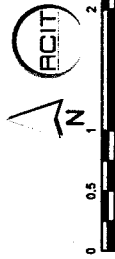
