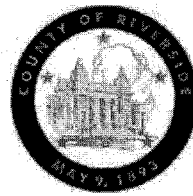

2. Authorize the Chairman of the Board to execute this Agreement on behalf of the County.



**BACKGROUND:**

**Summary**

The Riverside County Flood Control and Waste Conservation District desires to continue contracting for emergency response services to control the discharge of pollutants with the Riverside County Fire Department, and as such, the two agencies have reached an agreement as to the level of service to be provided to the District. This agreement is necessary for the Riverside County Flood Control and Water Conservation District to continue contributing funds to the Riverside County Fire Department's Hazardous Materials Emergency Response Team for emergency response services to control the discharge of pollutants in runoff to waters of the United States.

The National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permits for Riverside County require Riverside County's storm water permittees (District, County of Riverside, Coachella Valley Water District and the incorporated Cities) to respond to emergency spills in the County of Riverside.

In compliance with the NPDES Permits, the District has chosen to continue to help financially support the Hazardous Materials Emergency Response Team for its emergency response services. Therefore, the District will contribute a lump sum amount of one million eight hundred twenty-five thousand dollars (\$1,825,000) to the Riverside County Fire Department to help support its Hazardous Materials Emergency Response Team.

A companion item appears on the Special District's agenda this same date. The fund sources for the District appears on their separate Form 11.

Attached is a copy of the Multi-Year Agreement and the Form 11 from Flood Control and Water Conservation District. The original Multi-Year Agreement for signature is attached to Flood Control and Water Conservation District's Agenda Item to be heard later this same date.

This agreement is similar to the County's other Multi-Year Agreement for Hazardous Materials Emergency Response Team Service. The agreement has been approved as to form by County Counsel.

Continuing to provide support to the Hazardous Materials Emergency Response team funds a much-needed resource that provides protection to residents and businesses in Riverside County.



**Additional Fiscal Information**


There is no general fund impact with the approval of this agreement. The Riverside County Fire Department expects to receive \$365,000 a year for five (5) years for a total of \$1,825,000. This is a new contract beginning July 1, 2017. Any previous amounts received this fiscal year is covered by the previous signed agreement.

**Contract History and Price Reasonableness**

There are no changes as to the level of service provided to the contract since the last signed agreement in FY 12/13. There is no general fund cost to the county for this program.
