BACKGROUND:

Summary

Riverside County Ordinance 787 requires the Board of Supervisors approval for the closure of hazardous fire areas for more than fifteen (15) days. Because of the potential of damaging human caused fires, the County Fire Chief has determined these areas should be closed except on public roadways and on inhabited areas of private property within the closure areas. The potential for large damaging fires occurring this year may be enhanced by the extreme vegetation growth experienced throughout in Riverside County.

The Hazardous Fire Area closures will remain in effect until the County Fire Chief determines that the fuel and weather conditions are safe for the public and the threat of wildfire is minimized. The Fire Closure areas in Riverside County are as follows:

Avery Canyon
North Mountain and Indian Canyon
Whitewater Canyon
Nuevo / Lakeview
Minto (Sage)
Reinhardt Canyon
Ramona Bowl and Bautista Canyon

Impact on Residents and Businesses

There may be a reduction of recreational activities in some areas due to the closures.
