

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Supervisors:

1. Adopt Resolution No. 2017-112, authorizing the Sheriff, Undersheriff, Assistant Sheriff, or Chief Deputy to sign and submit a grant application to the Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC) for \$235,750 to continue the Residential Substance Abuse Treatment (RSAT) programs in Riverside County;
2. Authorize the Sheriff or his designee to sign the grant agreement; and
3. Authorize the Sheriff or his designee to administer the grant project, sign reimbursement requests, and future grant amendments or modifications that do not increase the original award by more than 20% and that do not materially change the scope of the grant project.

BACKGROUND:

Summary

The Board of State and Community Corrections released Year-3 reapplication to current Residential Substance Abuse Treatment (RSAT) grantees. A non-competitive Request for Application (RFA) for continuation of funding for the third year (July 1, 2017-June 30, 2018) is contingent upon the availability of federal funding.

The Sheriff's Department has been operating a successful Residential Substance Abuse Treatment (RSAT) program at the Larry D. Smith Correctional Facility since October 1998. The program provides both male and female inmates vital substance abuse treatment and is structured to reduce recidivism within the county jail system.

The current grant application will fund year three of a three-year grant cycle, for the RSAT program with a proposed start date of July 1, 2017. The application requests \$235,750 to support two Correctional Counselors and program materials.

The grant application requires a 25% match of the total project cost of \$314,333 in the amount of \$78,583. This 25% match is met through in-kind personnel and operating categories, which is in the Sheriff's Department's budget.

The grant application is an estimated request to the Board of State and Community Corrections and the application requires the adoption of a resolution. Once the grant is awarded to the Riverside County Sheriff Department, a Form 11 for grant acceptance will be submitted for board approval.

16 not be used to supplant expenditures controlled by this body.

17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County of Riverside agrees to provide all
18 matching funds required for said project and abide by the statues and regulations governing the
19 federal Grants Program as well as the terms and conditions of the Grant Agreement as set forth
20 by the BSCC.
