# **BACKGROUND:**

#### **Summary**

The Board of State and Community Corrections released Year-3 reapplication to current Residential Substance Abuse Treatment (RSAT) grantees. A non-competitive Request for Application (RFA) for continuation of funding for the third year (July 1, 2017-June 30, 2018) is contingent upon the availability of federal funding.

The Sheriff's Department has been operating a successful Residential Substance Abuse Treatment (RSAT) program at the Larry D. Smith Correctional Facility since October 1998. The program provides both male and female inmates vital substance abuse treatment and is structured to reduce recidivism within the county jail system.

The current grant application will fund year three of a three-year grant cycle, for the RSAT program with a proposed start date of July 1, 2017. The application requests \$235,750 to support two Correctional Counselors and program materials.

The grant application requires a 25% match of the total project cost of \$314,333 in the amount of \$78,583. This 25% match is met through in-kind personnel and operating categories, which is in the Sheriff's Department's budget.

The grant application is an estimated request to the Board of State and Community Corrections and the application requires the adoption of a resolution. Once the grant is awarded to the Riverside County Sheriff Department, a Form 11 for grant acceptance will be submitted for board approval.
