On motion of Supervisor Ashley, seconded by Supervisor Tavaglione, and duly carried by unanimous vote, IT WAS ORDERED that the meeting of Tuesday, June 13, 2017, be adjourned in memory of Clare J. Taber, a prominent businessman and resident of Riverside, California who passed away on May 22, 2017.

Born on November 11, 1927 in Owosso, Michigan, Clare graduated from Vermontville High School and proudly served in the United States Navy before following his family to Riverside in 1946. He attended Riverside City College and Woodbury College graduating with a BA in Business Administration in 1951.

After briefly working as an accountant and business manager, Clare returned to his former trade of plumbing. He worked at two shops in the Riverside area for several years prior to opening Taber Plumbing in Riverside in 1958. Within 10 years, he had built his company into one of the premier plumbing contractors in the Inland Empire. He always appreciated and supported the men and women who worked for the company which was a large part of his success. Taber Company continues today as a Real Estate Development and Property Management Company with a third generation in the business.

An instrumental force in the community, Clare was extremely active in civic affairs and grew with Riverside. He was President of the Greater Riverside Chamber of Commerce, sat on the City of Riverside Planning Commission and, though a lifelong Democrat, was appointed to the Selective Service Board by then Governor Reagan. He was Area Representative for then Congressman John V. Tunney, member of the Monday Morning Group, and was on the Board of Directors of Riverside Community Hospital, the Riverside Visitors and Convention Bureau, the Salvation Army, and the Riverside Community College Foundation. He was a member of the Riverside Rotary and Evergreen Masonic Lodge. He helped revive the Riverside Chapter of the Urban League and received the Vernon Jordan award for his commitment to civil rights. He was also a member of Local 364, United Association of Plumbers and Pipe Fitters for over 60 years.

Clare was a loving and devoted husband, father, step-father, grandfather, great-grandfather, brother, uncle, and friend. His memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved him. He will be dearly missed but never forgotten.

On motion of Supervisor Washington, seconded by Supervisor Tavaglione, and duly carried by unanimous vote, IT WAS ORDERED that the meeting of Tuesday, June 13, 2017, be adjourned in memory of Victor "Vic" Edelbrock Jr., the 80-year-old "Hot-rod scion" who passed away on June 9, 2017 at his home in Rolling Hills, California.

Born on August 23, 1936, Vic was the son and only child of "famed" mechanic and Edelbrock founder, Vic Edelbrock. He graduated from Dorsey High School, earned his degree in business from the University of Southern California (USC) in 1958, attended the Reserve Officers' Training Corps (ROTC), married his wife Nancy Crook in 1959, and earned his Private Pilot certificate in 1968.

A "visionary" and instrumental force in the high-performance auto parts industry, Vic was just 12 when he began spending summers working around his father's auto parts shop. After the death of his father in 1962, he inherited the business and took over to lead the company as President and CEO. He held both positions until 2010, when he stepped down as President but remained Chairman of the Board of Directors.

At the time Vic took over the company, it consisted of just 10 employees and annual sales were \$450,000. For the next several decades, he helped grow the company his dad created into a major name among hot-rodders, sanctioned drag racing, and short track motor racing. The Edelbrock Corp., which is based in Torrance off Crenshaw Boulevard and has a foundry in San Jacinto became "royalty" in the automotive world and in 2004 revenue exceeded \$125 million.

For his career accomplishments, Vic received numerous awards and honors. He was selected as the fourth recipient of the Robert E. Petersen Lifetime Achievement Award in 2005 for his contributions to the evolution and prosperity of specialized automobiles. He was inducted in the International Drag Racing Hall of Fame and was selected to the SEMA Hall of Fame. He was also named "Person of the Year" by the Performance Warehouse Association in 1982 and 1987.

Vic's memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved him. He will be dearly missed but never forgotten.

On motion of Supervisor Perez, seconded by Supervisor Tavaglione, and duly carried by unanimous vote, IT WAS ORDERED that the meeting of Tuesday, June 13, 2017, be adjourned in memory of Lowell Miller Vandervort, a 94-year-old resident of Palm Desert, California and former CEO of Eisenhower Medical Center who passed away on May 3, 2017.

Born on December 27, 1922 in Danville, Illinois, Lowell was a World War II Veteran having served as a Staff Sargent in the U.S. Army Air Corps from 1942 to 1946 as a weather observer. He held a Bachelor of Arts Degree from Wheaton College in 1950, performed graduate study at the University of Illinois from 1950 to 1951, and held a Masters in Hospital Administration from the University of Minnesota in 1958. He married Druscilla Skomp in 1951. She preceded him in death in 2002.

Lowell came to the Desert from Milwaukee, Wisconsin to lead Eisenhower Medical Center until his retirement in 1986. During his tenure as CEO, Eisenhower experienced its "exponential growth" evident in today's campus including the construction of the Kiewit and Wright Professional Buildings, the Annenberg Center for Health Sciences, the Hal B. Wallis Research Facility, the Betty Ford Center, the Community Blood Bank Center, the Barbara Sinatra Children's Center, the Mamie Wing and Autry Tower, the Corwin Denney Heliport, and the start of construction on the Dolores Hope Outpatient Care Center.

An instrumental force in leadership, Lowell served as a Charter Board Member of the Institute for Creation Reserarch in Dallas, Texas, Trustee Emeritus for the Desert Christian Academy in Bermuda Dunes, Chairman Emeritus for Health Development International, Charter Board Member of the Community Blood Bank of Rancho Mirage, and Board Member of the Hospital Council for Southern California. His academic appointments included Assistant Clinical Professor of Hospital Care Administration from the University of Southern California from 1978 to 1986 and Clinical Preceptor-Program in Health Care Administration from the University of Minnesota from 1964 to 1976. He was also the recipient of the J.A. Hamilton Achievement Award conferred by the University of Minnesota in 1958 and was listed among Who's Who in America from 1962 to 1988.

After his retirement, Lowell volunteered as a Hospital Administration Consultant to hospitals being built in third world countries. He led Bible studies for many years and was a member of the Palm Desert Community Presbyterian Church. He also served as a Hospice Volunteer for many years with the Visiting Nurses Association of the Inland Counties.

Lowell's memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved him. He will be dearly missed but never forgotten.

On motion of Supervisor Perez, seconded by Supervisor Tavaglione, and duly carried by unanimous vote, IT WAS ORDERED that the meeting of Tuesday, June 13, 2017, be adjourned in memory of Howard Philip Marguelas, an 82-year-old longtime resident of Rancho Mirage, California who passed away on June 1, 2017.

Born on December 5, 1934 in San Francisco, California, Howard was a leader in the U.S. Produce Industry and the Principal Founder of Sun World International, bringing in many new fruits and vegetables to American consumers. Beginning in the 1960's with the first Hawaiian pineapples sold on the mainland, he branded fruit and nuts under the "SUN GIANT" brand and Red Flame Seedless grapes, vine-ripened tomatoes, colored sweet peppers, seedless watermelon, and assorted new grapes and plums under the "SUN WORLD" brand, as well as his popular California-grown mangoes.

Earlier in his career, along with his father Joseph and partner Frank Heggblade, Howard worked for produce marketing company, Heggblade-Marguleas Co. which they sold to Tenneco, Inc. in 1970. He subsequently served as President and Chief Executive Officer of Heggblade-Marguleas-Tenneco in Bakersfield. In the mid-1970's, he founded Sun World International which he sold twenty years later after growing it into one of the most innovative and largest privately-held produce companies in the country.

Recognized as a "dynamic leader and innovator" in the American Agribusiness world, Howard served under California Governors Edmund G. (Pat) Brown and Ronald Reagan as a member of the California State Board of Agriculture. Produce industry publication The Packer honored him as its 1989 "Man of the Year" and later named him one of the most influential produce industry leaders of the past 100 years. He was honored with the Distinguished California Agriculturalist Award in 1990, granted the Mentor's Award by the California Fresh Fruit Association, and named the Riverside County Farm Bureau's Man of the Year in 1999.

A true philanthropist and champion for health care, education, and local organizations, Howard served on numerous boards of directors and trustees including the Claremont McKenna College, the University of California Agricultural Issues Center Advisory Board, the University of California at Riverside, Eisenhower Medical Center, the American Cancer Society Foundation for the U.S. as a founding chairman, Heart Institute of the Desert, Society of Fellows at United Cerebral Palsy of the Inland Empire, Coachella Valley Boys and Girls Club as a founding member, the Boys and Girls Clubs of America, and the McCallum Theatre in Palm Desert as a founding member.

Howard was a loving and devoted husband, father, grandfather, brother, uncle, and friend. His memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved him.


