### **BACKGROUND:**

### **Summary**

The U.S. Office of National Drug Control Policy (ONDCP) has notified the Riverside County Sheriff's Department that it has been allocated HIDTA 16 Program funds. The proposed grant award period is from January 1, 2016 through December 31, 2017. County Counsel has approved the award documents as to form.

On May 12, 2015 (3-33) and on July 11, 2017 (3.50), the Board accepted the HIDTA 15 and HIDTA 17 grant awards. In reconciling HIDTA grant funds received, we realized that a Form 11 for the HIDTA 16 grant was mistakenly never submitted to the Board for approval. The HIDTA 16 grant performance period began January 1, 2016 of FY 15/16, however, grant activities did not commence until FY 16/17. The majority of the \$1,304,446 HIDTA 16 grant funds were spent and reimbursed in FY 16/17 with the remaining \$460,133 to be spent in FY 17/18. The Sheriff's Department is asking the Board to accept the HIDTA 16 grant funds and to approve spending the HIDTA 16 remaining funds.

For over 25 years, Riverside County has participated in the HIDTA program, which fosters cooperation among law enforcement agencies in their efforts to eliminate drug trafficking locally and nationally. The LA HIDTA is comprised of the Los Angeles, Orange, Riverside, and San Bernardino counties. The Office of National Drug Control Policy (ONDCP) and the LA HIDTA initially awarded Riverside County an allocation of \$1,251,346 for this grant award cycle then modified the HIDTA 16 award with an increased \$53,100 award for a total allocation of \$1,304,446.

Based on the HIDTA 16 award, grant funds are distributed among the County project initiatives in the following manner:

No County match is required. The HIDTA 16 grant has a two year performance period that operates from January 1, 2016 through December 31, 2017. The Department will span three (3) fiscal years to spend out the HIDTA 16 grant funds to fulfill the grant authorized requirement.

Operating with a focus throughout the entire LA HIDTA region, the primary mission of the RMTF is to target major methamphetamine distribution, and Drug Trafficking Organizations (DTO) by investigating, disrupting, and arresting person(s) and organizations involved in illicit sales and trafficking of all hard narcotics (methamphetamine, cocaine, and heroin) thereby improving the quality of life for all citizens, both regionally and nationally.

Statistics indicate that methamphetamine, cocaine and heroin availability remains a constant concern and narcotic traffickers typically use well-established highways and pipelines to smuggle, ship and move illicit narcotics. To combat the availability of these narcotics, RMTF, using grant funds, will continue the deployment of a highway interdiction team, comprised of three narcotics detecting canines and their respective handlers. This team will be used to identify, disrupt, and arrest DTOs that regularly use these highways and trafficking routes to further their criminal enterprise(s).

INCH will also aid the task forces by providing connectivity to the Statewide Integrated Narcotics System (SINS). INCA will support the efforts of the California Department of Justice, Bureau of Investigations (BI) in enforcing laws related to illegal drugs in California. The INCA task force is comprised of numerous law enforcement agencies within the jurisdiction of the LA HIDTA. This cooperative effort, coupled with their ability to jointly work with similar task forces, has proven to be highly effective in the investigation of DTOs within the region. Additionally, INCH will assist by providing necessary case support and serve as a clearing house for the dissemination of narcotics related intelligence.

INCH funds a small portion of a Sheriff's Network Administrator. Since FY 10-11, Riverside County uses INCH grant funds to pay for four (4) Criminal Intelligence Analysts. The County purchases services from these analysts through a personnel recruiting agency, Strategic Contracting Services (SCS). In addition, the grant will also continue to provide

funding for an accounting staff position at the Sheriff's Special Investigations Bureau, which the Department has filled at the Accounting Technician I level.

The increased award are discretionary funds awarded to the County by LA HIDTA, after the initial grant award. The increased award is based on national statistics and is awarded to counties that show the need for additional funds based on drug seizures and arrests. The funds described above are Domestic Marijuana Enforcement (DME) and Heroin/Fentanyl/BHO. The DME funds are to supplement the enforcement of illegal marijuana growing and distributing, the Heroin/Fentanyl/BHO funds are to supplement the cost of enforcing and responding to illegal heroin, fentanyl and BHO (Honey oil labs). The increased award is discretionary and may be used for overtime and/or equipment in any of the HIDTA initiatives (RMTF, INCH, INCA) to support an Emerging Threat (ET) or Strengthen Infrastructure (SI).

### Impact on Residents and Businesses

The HIDTA funding will allow the Sheriff's Special Investigations Bureau (SIB) to provide a level of narcotics enforcement beyond the normal, everyday enforcement.

### **GRANT CONDITIONS**

### A. General Terms and Conditions

1. This award is subject to The Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements in 2 C.F.R. Part 200 (the "Part 200 Uniform Requirements"), as adopted and implemented by the Office of National Drug Control Policy (ONDCP) in 2 C.F.R. Part 3603. For this 2016 award, the Part 200 Uniform Requirements supersede, among other things, the provisions of 28 C.F.R. Parts 66 and 70, as well as those of 2 C.F.R. Parts 215, 220, 225, and 230.

- 8. Conflict of Interest and Mandatory Disclosures
  - A. Conflict of Interest Requirements

### B. Mandatory Disclosure Requirement

### 3. Reporting Procedures

Administrative proceeding means a non-judicial process that is adjudicatory in nature in order to make a determination of fault or liability (e.g., Securities and Exchange Commission Administrative proceedings, Civilian Board of Contract Appeals proceedings, and Armed Services Board of Contract Appeals proceedings). This includes proceedings at the Federal and State level but only in connection with performance of a Federal contract or grant. It does not include audits, site visits, corrective plans, or inspection of deliverables.
- b. Conviction, for purposes of this award term and condition, means a judgment or conviction of a criminal offense by any court of competent jurisdiction, whether entered upon a verdict or a plea, and includes a conviction entered upon a plea of nolo contendere.
- c. Total value of currently active grants, cooperative agreements, and procurement contracts includes—
  - (1) Only the Federal share of the funding under any Federal award with a recipient cost share or match; and

(2) The value of all expected funding increments under a Federal award and options, even if not yet exercised.

### C. Program Specific Terms and Conditions

The following special conditions are incorporated into each award document.

- 1. This grant is awarded for above program. Variation from the description of activities approved by ONDCP and/or from the budget attached to this letter must comply with the reprogramming requirements as set forth in ONDCP's HIDTA Program Policy and Budget Guidance.
- 2. This award is subject to the requirements in ONDCP's HIDTA Program Policy and Budget Guidance.
- 3. No HIDTA funds shall be used to supplant state or local funds that would otherwise be made available for the same purposes.
- 4. The requirements of 28 CFR Part 23, which pertain to information collection and management of criminal intelligence systems, shall apply to any such systems supported by this award.
- 5. Special accounting and control procedures must govern the use and handling of HIDTA Program funds for confidential expenditures; i.e., the purchase of information, evidence, and services for undercover operations. Those procedures are described in Section 6 of the HIDTA Program Policy and Budget Guidance.
- 6. Property acquired with these HIDTA grant funds is to be used for activities of the Los Angeles HIDTA. If your agency acquires property with these funds and then ceases to participate in the HIDTA, this equipment must be made available to the HIDTA's Executive Board for use by other HIDTA participants.
- 7. All law enforcement entities that receive funds from this grant must report all methamphetamine laboratory seizure data to the National Clandestine Laboratory Database/National Seizure System at the El Paso Intelligence Center.

### D. Federal Award Performance Goals

- 1. All entities that receive funds from this award are responsible for achieving performance goals established in the HIDTA Performance Management Process (PMP) and approved by the HIDTA's Executive Board and ONDCP.
- 2. All entities that receive funds from this award must report progress in achieving performance goals at least quarterly using the PMP.

See also Section A. 4 regarding Federal Financial Reports.

### E. Payment Basis

- 1. A request for Advance or Reimbursement shall be made using the HHS/DPM system (www.dpm.psc.gov).
- 2. The grantee, must utilize the object classes specified within the initial grant application each time they submit a disbursement request to ONDCP. Requests for payment in the DPM system will not be approved unless the required disbursements have been entered using the corresponding object class designations. Payments will be made via Electronic Fund Transfer to the award recipient's bank account. The bank must be Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) insured. The account must be interest bearing.

3. Except for interest earned on advances of funds exempt under the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act (31 U.S.C. 6501 et seq.) and the Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act (25 U.S.C. 450), awardees and sub-awardees shall promptly, but at least annually, remit interest earned on advances to HHS/DPM using the remittance instructions provided below.
