BACKGROUND:

Summary

The Sheriff's Inmate Training and Education Bureau is working to improve inmate classroom size and provide additional administration support within Site-B, which is located adjacent to the Smith Correctional facility. The project's scope of work entails constructing two new buildings; one for administration and one for additional classroom space. The administration building will have space for approximately 17 to 20 staff members, meeting rooms, office space and restrooms. The classroom building will have three to four classrooms, office space and restrooms.

In order to keep the project moving forward, avoid impacts and meet project schedule commitments, EDA recommends the Board of Supervisors (Board) approve the SCF Site-B Buildings project and authorize the use of the Inmate Welfare Fund in the amount of \$1,345,300. EDA will return to the Board to approve project related documents and procure the most cost effective project delivery method and award in accordance with applicable Board policies.

Any attempt at assessing the potential impacts at this time would be wholly speculative and, therefore, the proposed action is not considered a project under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). The project will undergo environmental review once a schematic design is completed that will allow for a meaningful evaluation of potential impacts. The compliance document under CEQA will be presented to the Board under separate cover for approval in combination with the approval of schematic design and programming.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

The SCF Site-B Buildings project will provide additional space for classrooms and administrative staff. These additions will allow staff to better facilitate the delivery of programs and re-entry services to inmates.
