**BACKGROUND:** Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

- 1. The Blythe Emergency Food Pantry provides and distributes supplementary food to low-income families and the homeless in eastern Riverside County. This emergency food pantry serves approximately 30 families each day with supplemental meals and distributes food to more than 400 families each month. CID funds will be used toward the cost of food and operating expenses.
- 2. The Coachella Valley Housing Coalition sponsors the John F. Mealey College Scholarship Fund. This program serves more than 100 low-income students annually who reside in affordable housing communities developed by the Coachella Valley Housing Coalition. These communities are in Blythe, Mecca, Thermal, Coachella, Indio, La Quinta, Cathedral City, Desert Hot Springs and Palm Springs. CID funds will be used toward the JFM College Scholarship Fund.
