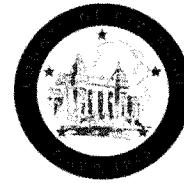

BACKGROUND:

Summary

The County of Riverside has been receiving this grant money for several years. The State Department of Resources, Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) requires the recipients to update their resolution every five years.

Code Enforcement uses this money to inspect waste tire facilities, tire dealers, auto dismantlers, tire haulers, and other points of waste tire generation to ensure compliance with all applicable laws and regulations, including the manifest system and investigate complaints, referrals, and illegal tire disposal activities.

The grant request is for \$600,000 per year, which funds 3 full-time Code officers and equipment and half of a Code Supervisor. CalRecycle staff has indicated that the county may be eligible for similar levels of funding over the next five years, subject to the availability of funds. All costs to be funded must be directly related to implementation and operation of the program.

The Board's action will allow Code Enforcement to submit an updated resolution and continue to apply annually for the Waste Tire Enforcement grant through fiscal year 2022/2023. Code Enforcement will return with any grant awards to the Board on an annual basis for approval to receive funding per Board Policy A-30.

The County is not required to provide a match to the grant fund as it is 100% reimbursable.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

Grant funds will be utilized to inspect tire-related businesses and ensure entities within the County are storing and hauling used and waste tires as dictated by California law, thereby reducing the illegal disposal and dumping of tires. This goal is accomplished by allowing personnel to be dedicated to the task of ensuring waste tires reach an appropriate end use facility by educating business owners of the proper disposal methods, verifying proper disposal activities, and referring the actions of offenders to the appropriate governing agency.



Senate Bill (SB) 876 was enacted to provide a comprehensive measure to extend and expand California's regulatory program related to the management of waste and used tires. The

3 A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE AUTHORIZING SUBMITTAL OF A WASTE
4 TIRE ENFORCEMENT GRANT APPLICATION

5 WHEREAS, funds are allocated and available from the California Department of
6 Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) for grants to solid waste Local Enforcement Agencies
7 and cities and counties with regulatory authority within the city and county government to perform
8 enforcement/compliance and surveillance activities at waste tire facilities; and

10 WHEREAS, the California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery has been
11 delegated the responsibility for the administration of the program within the state, setting up necessary
12 procedures governing application by the cities and counties under the program; and

13 WHEREAS, procedures established by CalRecycle require a jurisdiction applicant to
14 certify by resolution the approval of the jurisdiction's governing authority for submittal of a grant
15 application before submission of said application to the CalRecycle; and

16 WHEREAS, the applicant shall consider entering into an agreement with CalRecycle for
17 continuation of the Waste Tire Enforcement program as authorized by the grant agreement; and

18 WHEREAS, should the County of Riverside be awarded funds under the CalRecycle Waste
19 Tire Enforcement grant, the Deputy Director of the Riverside County Code Enforcement Department will
20 submit a final agreement to the Board of Supervisors for approval;

22 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Riverside County Board of Supervisors
23 authorizes the submittal of an application to the Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery
24 (CalRecycle) for all available Waste Tire Enforcement Grants for fiscal years (FY) 2017/18 through
25 2022/23.
