BACKGROUND

The Development Impact Fee (DIF) Program, established in Riverside County Ordinance No. 659, allows for the use of DIF Funds for facilities identified on the Public Facilities Needs List. Lake Cahuilla Recreation Area Improvements are on this list.

On 8/29/17 by Minute Order 3.122, the Board of Supervisors voted in support of renaming Lake Cahuilla Recreation Area to Lake Cahuilla Veterans Regional Park in honor of Riverside County military veterans.

The minute order also directed improvements which included the design and installation of a new quadrangle featuring the flags of the Army, Marines, Navy, Air Force, and Coast Guard at or near the park entrance in accordance with the United States Department of Defense flag protocol. It will also include the installation of new signage at the park entrance and outside the park as appropriate.

IMPACT ON CITIZENS AND BUSINESSES

Riverside County is home to 135,000 veterans, with 37,000 of those veterans residing in the 4th District. This project is a meaningful way to honor our patriotic veterans and their families.
