

BACKGROUND: Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

1. The Boys and Girls Club of Cathedral City provides the Triple Play Healthy Habits program. This program provides a multi-faceted approach to health and wellness for children ages 6 to 18. The goal of this program is to provide knowledge of healthy habits, encourage better food choices and increase physical activities. CID funds will be used to support the Triple Play Healthy Habits program.
2. The 24th Annual Steve Chase Humanitarian Awards Gala will be held at the Palm Springs Convention Center on February 10, 2018. Since 1995, this event has raised millions of dollars for the Desert AIDS Project's direct client services. Services include: primary and HIV-specialty care through the Wells Fargo HIV Health Center, Riverside County's HIV-specialty dental clinic, food vouchers, housing assistance, case management, and an on-site pharmacy. CID funds will be used to support the client services.
3. Membership in the Palm Springs Hospitality Association allows the Fourth District to continue working closely with local businesses to develop the tourism industry in the desert. Tourism is a major driver of the Coachella Valley economy and hoteliers are reporting record business and increasing room rates. Close coordination between tourism businesses and local government officials has developed an atmosphere for attracting visitors. CID funds will be used to pay for membership in the organization.
4. The Mission of the Rancho Mirage Chamber of Commerce is to promote business and cultivate opportunities for its members through networking events, educational programs and community projects. CID funds will be used to pay for membership in the organization.
5. Community Improvement Designation funds will be allocated to the Economic Development Agency (EDA) Youth Protection Fund. The CID funds will be used to assist with the purchase of food, this will include breakfast, lunch and all refreshments for every attendee of the 2018 Youth summit. Attendance is free for high school students in Riverside County.
