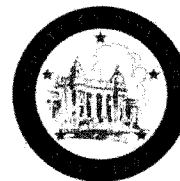



**BACKGROUND:**

**Summary**

CalMHSA Statewide MHSA Prevention and Early Intervention (PEI) initiatives enhance the ability of Riverside County to meet the needs of our communities through effective and cost-efficient suicide prevention and student mental health programs. Riverside County's partnership in California's nationally-recognized Stigma and Discrimination Reduction Campaign is critical to achieving the transformation of mental health services by communicating to all Californians that help is available and recovery is achievable, thereby removing barriers to seeking help.

On August 31, 2010 (Agenda Item 3.60) and June 4, 2013 (Agenda Item 3-41), the Board of Supervisors approved the Joint Exercise Powers Agreement and subsequent Amendment that authorized the Director of Behavioral Health to administer the terms and conditions of the Joint Powers Agreement and authorized the assignment of Riverside County's portion of funds to participate in statewide programs.

Since 2011, CalMHSA Member counties have worked together to implement statewide PEI programs to prevent suicides, reduce stigma and discrimination and improve student mental health. The strategies and activities implemented are considered to be more efficient and cost-effective to conduct at a statewide level. In FY16/17, the statewide programs had numerous significant impacts on Riverside County residents. For example:

- 72 local county agencies, schools and organizations (approximately 38,672 individuals) received training, technical assistance or participated in presentations about stigma reduction, suicide prevention and/or student mental health through the collective efforts of all programs implemented under the Statewide PEI Project.
- 56,493 hardcopy materials across Each Mind Matters programs and initiatives were disseminated throughout Riverside County. In addition, county contacts received numerous emails to access and share resources electronically via the Each Mind Matters Resource Center
- 6 CalMHSA mini-grants and sponsorships were awarded to organizations in Riverside County to grow the Each Mind Matters movement across the state through increasing reach and dissemination, and implementing community events and activities.

- The Directing Change program offers young people the exciting opportunity to participate in the movement by creating 60-second films about suicide prevention and mental health that are used to support awareness, education and advocacy efforts on these topics. 325 youth participated and 119 films were submitted and viewed during an awards event at the Fox Performing Arts Center.

**Impact on Residents and Businesses**


The statewide initiatives described in the three-year MHSA Program and Expenditure Plan are services of the department's PEI component and aimed at improving the health and safety of consumers and the community.
