Summary

Tentative Tract Map No. 30808 was originally approved by the Planning Commission on September 22, 2004.

The First Extension of Time was approved by the Planning Commission on November 19, 2008.

The Second and Third Extensions of Time were approved by the Planning Commission on April 5, 2017.

The Fourth Extension of Time was received on August 22, 2017, ahead of the expiration date of September 22, 2017. The applicant and the County discussed conditions of approval and reached consensus on August 31, 2017.

The County Planning Department, as part of the review of this Extension of Time request, recommends no further conditions of approval will be issued due to the seven (7) previous conditions of approval that were provided and approved on April 5, 2017. The applicant was informed of this recommendation and has agreed to accept it.

The Tentative Tract Map also benefited from Senate Bill No. 1185 (SB1185), Assembly Bill No. 333 (AB333), Assembly Bill No. 208 (AB208), and Assembly Bill No. 116 (AB116), which granted statutory extensions of time for tentative maps statewide.

The Planning Commission heard the Fourth Extension of Time for Tentative Tract Map No. 30808 on December 6, 2017. The Planning Commission approved the project by a 4-0 vote (Commissioner Hake absent).

Board Action

The Planning Commission's decision is final and no action by the Board of Supervisors is required unless the applicant or an interested person files a complete appeal application within 10 days of this notice appearing on the Board's agenda.

The applicant of the subject case has requested an extension of time to allow for the recordation of the final map to subdivide 128 acres into 346 residential lots with a minimum lot size of 6,000 sq. ft.; 8 open space lots; and 1 park in Planning Areas 28A and 28B of Specific Plan (SP) 293 (Winchester Hills).

PROJECT LOCATION MAP




Figure 1: Project Location Map

PROJECT BACKGROUND AND ANALYSIS

Background

Tentative Tract Map No. 30808 was originally approved at Planning Commission on September 22, 2004.

The First Extension of Time was approved at Planning Commission on November 19, 2008.

The Second and Third Extension of Time were approved at Planning Commission on April 5, 2017.

The Fourth Extension of Time was received August 22, 2017, ahead of the expiration date of September 22, 2017. The applicant and the County discussed conditions of approval and reached consensus on August 31, 2017.

The County Planning Department, as part of the review of this Extension of Time request, recommends no further conditions of approval will be issued due to the seven (7) previous conditions of approval that were provided and approved on April 5, 2017. The applicant was informed of this recommendation and has agreed to accept. Included in this staff report package is the recommendation of no further conditions of approval, and the correspondence from the Extension of Time applicant (dated August 31, 2017) indicating the acceptance of the determination.

Unless specifically requested by the applicant, this Extension of Time request will not be discussed at the time it is presented to the Planning Commission as a consent calendar item.

Riverside County Map Extensions

Pursuant to County of Riverside Ordinance No. 460 (Subdivision Regulations), tentative tract and parcel maps have an initial life-span approval of 3-years. Prior to September 12, 2017, a maximum of 5, 1-year extensions may have been approved, upon a timely filed extension request, allowing for a total tentative map life-span approval of 8-years. On September 12, 2017, the Board of Supervisors approved an amendment to Ordinance 460, replacing the extension time frames to allow for 2, 3-year extensions, for a total tentative map life-span of 9-years.

The total number years a map may be extended is 6 years. The First, Second, and Third Extension of Time granted 1 year each. This Fourth Extension will grant another 3 years. There will be no remaining number of years available to extend this tentative map after this approval.

State Bills

EFFECT OF Senate Bill No. 1185 (SB1185): On July 15, 2008, AB208 was signed into law, which grants a one-time extension of existing subdivision maps so developers can build immediately when the demand for housing goes up. It gives developers an automatic 12 month extension on previously approved subdivision maps set to expire between July 15, 2008 and January 1, 2011.

EFFECT OF Assembly Bill No. 333 (AB333): On July 15, 2009, AB333 was signed into law, which grants a one-time extension of existing subdivision maps so developers can build immediately when the demand for housing goes up. It gives developers an automatic 24 month extension on previously approved subdivision maps set to expire between July 15, 2009 and January 1, 2012.

EFFECT OF Assembly Bill No. 208 (AB208): On July 13, 2011, AB208 was signed into law, which grants a one-time extension of existing subdivision maps so developers can build immediately when the demand

for housing goes up. It gives developers an automatic 24 month extension on previously approved subdivision maps set to expire between July 13, 2011 and January 1, 2014.

EFFECT OF Assembly Bill No. 116 (AB116): On July 11, 2013, AB116 was signed into law, which grants a one-time extension of existing subdivision maps so developers can build immediately when the demand for housing goes up. It gives developers an automatic 24 month extension on previously approved subdivision maps set to expire between January 1, 2000 and July 11, 2013.

Therefore, upon an approval action by the Planning Commission, subsequent receive and file action by the Board of Supervisors, and the conclusion of the 10-day appeal period, the tentative map's expiration date will become September 22, 2020. If a final map has not been recorded prior this date, the next extension of time request must be filed 30-days prior to map expiration.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

The subject case has conformed to the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA"), and all impacts have been analyzed in order to protect the public health, safety, and welfare. No changes to the approved map are proposed and as a result, no new environmental documentation is required prior to an Extension of Time approval.

FINDINGS


In order for the County to approve a proposed project, the following findings are required to be made:


Extension of Time Findings

- 1. This Tentative Tract Map has been found to be consistent with the Riverside County General Plan, pursuant to the originally approved findings and conditions of approval. This Extension of Time proposes no changes to the map design and is therefore still found to be consistent.
- 2. This Tentative Tract Map has been found to be consistent with Ordinance No. 348 (Zoning Code) and Ordinance No. 460 (Subdivision Regulations), pursuant to the originally approved findings and conditions of approval. This Extension of Time proposes no changes to the map design and is therefore still found to be consistent.
- 3. No changes to the approved map are proposed in conjunction with this Extension of Time. All impacts have been analyzed in order to protect the public health, safety, and welfare.



The County Planning Department has determined it necessary to recommend no further conditions of approval in order to be able to make a determination that the project does not adversely affect the general health, safety and welfare of the public.

If this determination is acceptable, then submit a short written letter/memo/email that clearly references this case, and clearly state that you, the Extension of Time Applicant, accept the determination of no further conditions of approval. I am eager to move this case forward and continue the extension of time process. If you have not contacted me within thirty (30) days, I will begin preparing this case with a recommendation of denial. I need one of two items to proceed:

- 1) Correspondence from you, the EOT applicant, accepting the recommended conditions per the directions provided above; or,
- 2) Correspondence from you, the EOT applicant, advising me of the concerns with the recommended conditions. If the concern still exists after our discussion, then direction on how to approach the issue will be given and additional time will be provided until the issue is resolved.
