BACKGROUND:

As per Board Policy A-27, the purpose of Riverside County's Legislative Program is to secure legislation that benefits the county and its residents, and to oppose/amend legislation that might adversely affect the County. Recognizing the need for consistency in conveying official positions on legislative matters, the county has instituted a coordinated process involving interaction between the Board of Supervisors, the County Executive Office, County agencies/departments, and the County's legislative advocates in Sacramento and Washington, D.C.

If a policy position regarding pending legislation does not exist, it will require formal board action by the Board of Supervisors.

An act to amend Section 13001 of the Elections Code, relating to elections.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 1886, as introduced, Carrillo. Payment of expenses.

Existing law requires that all expenses authorized and necessarily incurred to prepare for and conduct an election be paid from the county treasuries, except as otherwise provided.

This bill would require the state to pay expenses authorized and necessarily incurred to prepare for and conduct certain vacancy elections, as specified.



The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section 13001 of the Elections Code is amended to read:
- 3 13001. All-(a) Except as provided in subdivision (b), all
- 4 expenses authorized and necessarily incurred in the preparation
- 5 for, and conduct of, elections as provided in this code shall be paid
- 6 from the county treasuries, except that when an election is called
- 7 by the governing body of a city the expenses shall be paid from
- 8 the treasury of the city. All payments under this subdivision shall

- be made in the same manner as other county or city expenditures are made. The
- 3 (b) (1) The state shall pay all expenses authorized and 4 necessarily incurred on or after January 1, 2017, in preparation 5 for, and conduct of, elections called by the Governor to fill a 6 vacancy in the following offices:
 - (A) State Senator.
 - (B) Member of the Assembly.
- 9 (C) United States Senator.
- 10 (D) Member of the United States House of Representatives.
- 11 (2) If a vacancy election for an office specified in this 12 subdivision is consolidated with a statewide or local election, the 13 state shall only pay those additional expenses directly related to 14 the vacancy election.
- 15 (c) The elections official, in providing the materials required 16 by this division, need not utilize the services of the county or city 17 purchasing agent.
