BACKGROUND:

Summary

By Minute Order dated October 31, 2017 (Agenda Item 3.29), the County of Riverside (County) Board of Supervisors approved the Harrison Street, Robert Road, Airport Blvd, Tyler Street, Chiriaco Road and Summit Road Resurfacing Project and authorized the Clerk of the Board to advertise for the construction of the Resurfacing Projects in the Communities of Thermal, Thousand Palms and Chiriaco Summit.

The Ramon Road Sidewalk Project was added to this group of streets during the advertisement period by addendum. These seven streets/roads were combined to bid as one project in order to accelerate construction of the needed work.

The table below shows the projects, limits of improvements and respective communities:

During the advertisement period, two addenda were issued to all registered plan holders as a supplement to the plans and specifications. Bidders were required to acknowledge and take into account the issued addenda on their contractor's Bid in order to be considered for award.

Addendum 1 was issued to add the Ramon Road sidewalk project (C4-0083) to the bid package in order to accelerate construction of the needed work, to extend the bid receipt date and to clarify bidder's inquiries regarding plans and specifications. Addendum 2 was issued to clarify and modify the approved contract documents. The addenda are attached and designated as Addendum No. 1 and Addendum No. 2.

Ramon Road sidewalk project (C4-0083) was added by addendum; however, the project title was not updated for all of the individual contract documents, including the bid bond. As a result, all bidders submitted a bid bond without reference to the Ramon Road portion of the project. The omission of this portion of the project, in title of the bid bond, is a minor irregularity that could be waived. The bid bond documents were submitted and executed properly by all bidders.

On April 28, 2017, Senate Bill 1 (SB1) was passed to improve the state's aging transportation infrastructure, particularly roads and bridges. Because of this, the County is now able to improve the condition of roads in need of resurfacing or reconstruction and has included them in the County's Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). Without SB1 these needed road repair projects would have been shelved until funding became available.

The resurfacing of Harrison Street, Robert Road, Airport Boulevard, Tyler Street, Chiriaco Road and Summit Road are some of Riverside County's priority projects approved for use of the new Gas Tax/SB-1 funds.

The easterly portion of Tyler Street from 54th Avenue to approximately 1300 feet southerly, is located within the jurisdiction of City of Coachella (City). The Transportation Department in coordination with the City has developed the scope of work to improve Tyler Street within the City limits along with the County's resurfacing project. A cooperative agreement to reimburse the construction and inspection cost between the County and City is being processed concurrently with the award of the project construction contract, and is a companion item on this same Board date.

The contractor, Matich Corporation, is qualified to perform the work as outlined in the bid, has executed the contract, and has provided bonds and insurance documents which meet the requirements of the Contract.

Environmental findings: Ramon Road Sidewalk Project

CEQA Guidelines Section 15301(c) describes the minor alteration of existing public facilities with negligible or no expansion of an existing use as a categorical exemption under CEQA; the project qualifies under this exemption because the extension of curb, gutter and sidewalk for 200 feet between two existing segments of sidewalk is a negligible expansion of an existing public facility. The Project is located within an existing dirt path that was constructed as part of the roadway approach to the adjacent railroad overcrossing and Interstate 10 overcrossing. Therefore, the Project is exempt under Section 15061(b)(3) (general rule) as it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the action may have a significant effect on the environment.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

The purpose of this project is to resurface these road segments to provide the public with a smooth paved roadway that will improve the safety and efficiency of vehicular traffic and to complete a gap segment of sidewalk on Ramon Road.

The work is scheduled to begin in spring 2018. The work will be phased to keep the roads open during construction as much as possible and will take approximately one month to complete.

SUPPLEMENTAL:

Additional Fiscal Information

The contract is recommended to be awarded to Matich Corporation for the total amount of \$3,123,386.

Construction will be funded with Gas Tax /SB1, SB-821, Gas Tax/HUTA and City of Coachella. There are no General Funds used in these projects.

The proposed budget as shown on Attachment "A" includes the contract award amount and other associated costs.

Contract History and Price Reasonableness

A total of six bids were received ranging from \$3,123,386 to \$3,696,446. All bids received are higher than the engineer's cost estimate. The bid review and analysis shows that a few unit prices are significantly higher than the engineer's cost estimate, in particular the asphalt related items and traffic control. The bids were determined to be reasonable since all six bidders were consistent in the valuation of these items.

The basis for the selection of a contractor is the lowest responsive and responsible bid. The lowest responsive and responsible bid was submitted by Matich Corporation in the amount of \$3,123,386, which is \$862,096 (38%) above engineer's cost estimate. However, it is \$230,000 (7%) below the average cost of the six submitted bids.

The Transportation Department recommends the award of the contract to the lowest responsive and responsible contractor, Matich Corporation.

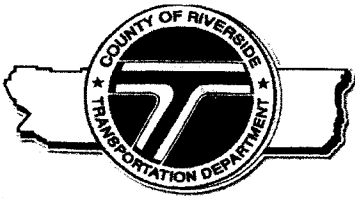

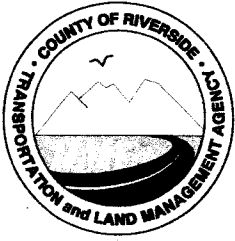

MEMORANDUM

NOTICE OF EXEMPTION

August 12, 2016

PROJECT TITLE: Ramon Road Sidewalk Project
Work Order #ZC4-0083, Task Code #Z1530

PROJECT SPONSOR: Riverside County Transportation Department

PROJECT LOCATION: Located in Eastern Coachella Valley, Thousand Palms Community

SUPERVISORIAL DISTRICT: Fourth

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

Riverside County Transportation Department (County) proposes to install concrete curb and 200 feet of 6 foot wide sidewalk on the south side of Ramon Road between the Union Pacific Railroad Bridge to the west and the I-10 Eastbound On-Ramp to the east, in the unincorporated area of Thousand Palms, east of the City of Rancho Mirage.

Currently, the south side of Ramon Road consists of a graded dirt shoulder with mostly sandy type soil which is difficult for pedestrians to walk on and places them adjacent to traffic without the protection of a raised curb and sidewalk.

The proposed sidewalk will provide a continuous ADA accessible pedestrian pathway along Ramon Road between Bob Hope Drive and the community of Thousand Palms to the east. This sidewalk project will improve safety and convenience for pedestrians walking between the City of Rancho Mirage and the Thousand Palms area.

Ramon Road is a two-lane urban arterial that travels in an east-west direction with a four-foot wide raised median. The area in the immediate vicinity has commercial development with no development adjacent to the proposed sidewalk.

Project construction will include minor pavement reconstruction, curb ramp replacement, concrete curb installation, retaining wall, slope grading and sign relocations. An encroachment permit from Caltrans will be needed for the portion of the project within State right of way.

ENVIRONMENTAL ANALYSIS:

The Transportation Department prepared a Categorical Exemption (CE) with technical studies to comply with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA).

A Cultural Resource Assessment (Dokken August 2016) indicated that the project has no impact to archaeological or historic resources.

An Initial Site Assessment Checklist (Dokken August 2016) indicated there is no potential for hazardous waste involvement.

A Natural Environmental Study – No Effect Memo (Caltrans June 2016) identified no biological issues.

Under Section 7.1 of the Coachella Valley Multiple Species Habitat Conservation Plan, all public facility construction and operation and maintenance activities outside conservation areas are covered activities and have been granted take authorization.

If tree trimming and removal take place during the migratory bird breeding season (March 1 through September 1) a pre-construction nesting survey is required pursuant to the Migratory Bird Treaty Act (MBTA).

The Riverside County Transportation Department Staff conducted a review of the above referenced Project and has determined that the proposal qualifies for a Categorical Exemption per the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines.

Section 15301 (c) - Existing Facilities - The project proposes to extend concrete curb, gutter, sidewalk and associated improvements for a distance of 200 feet along existing Ramon Road between two existing segments of sidewalk. The project area is currently in use as a dirt path which was constructed as part of the adjacent railroad overcrossing and the Interstate 10 overcrossing. The project involves a negligible expansion of an existing use and is therefore exempt under Section 15301 (c).

Section 15061(b) (3)-General Rule –The project is located within an existing dirt path that was constructed as part of the roadway approach to the adjacent railroad overcrossing and Interstate 10 overcrossing. The project consists of installing concrete sidewalk and curb and associated improvements, and is exempt under Section 15061 (b) (3) as it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the action may have a significant effect on the environment.

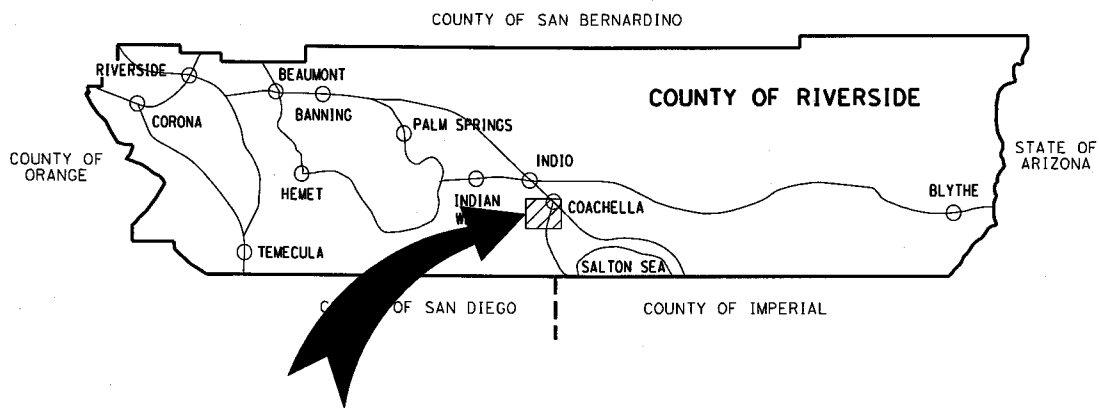

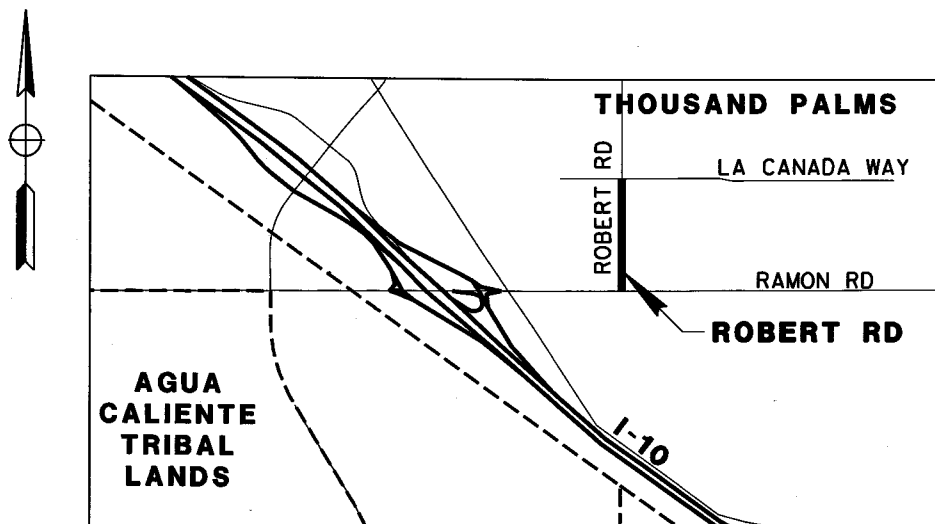
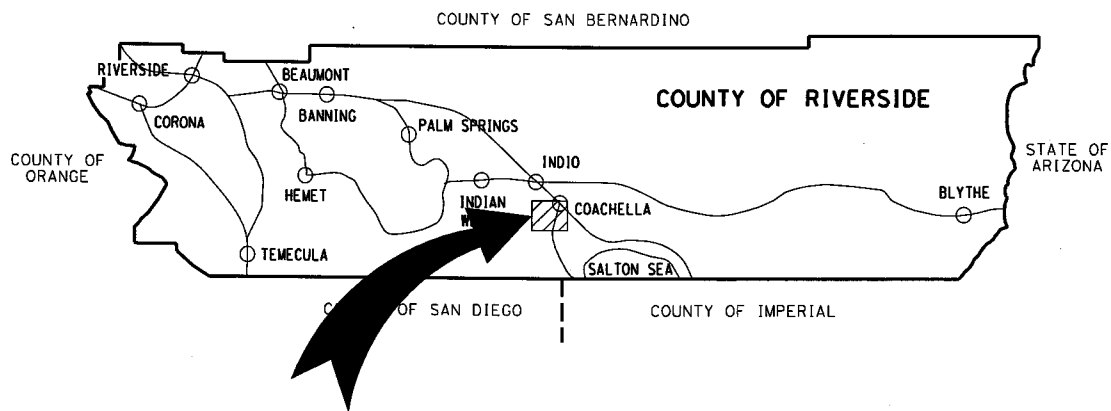


VICINITY MAP - HARRISON

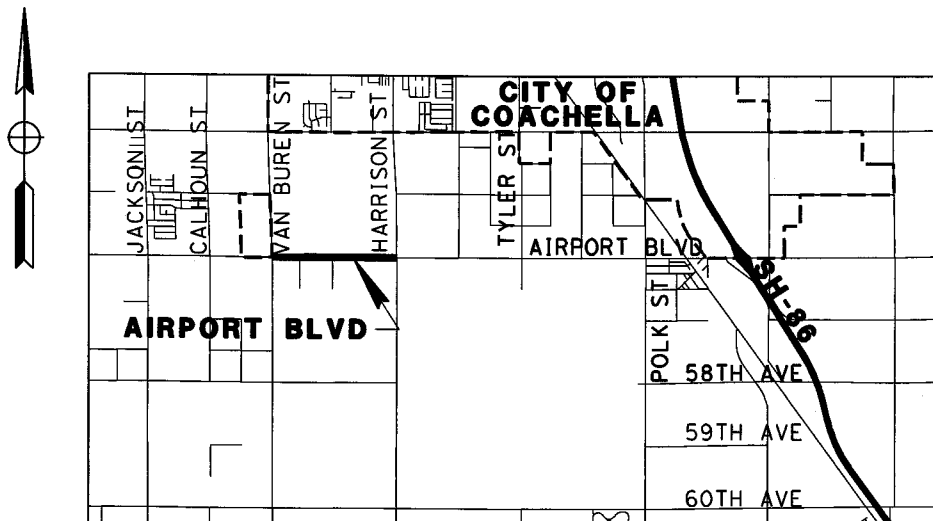
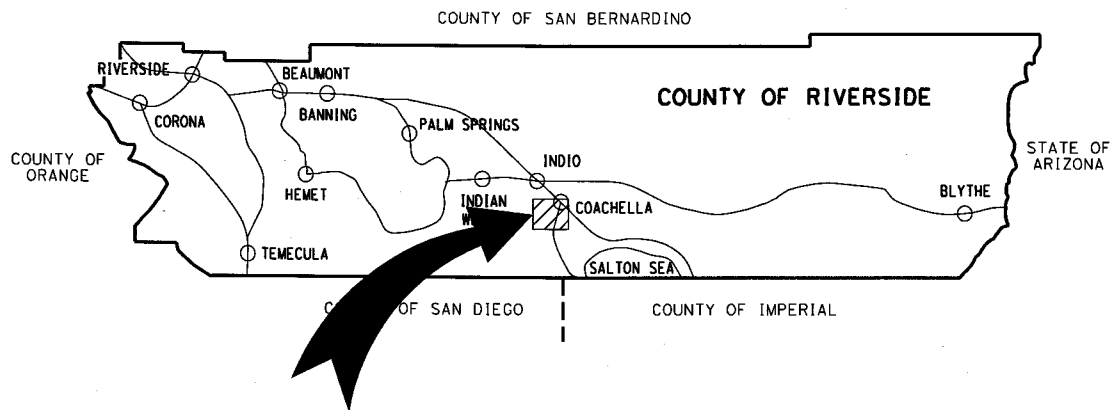


VICINITY MAP - ROBERT

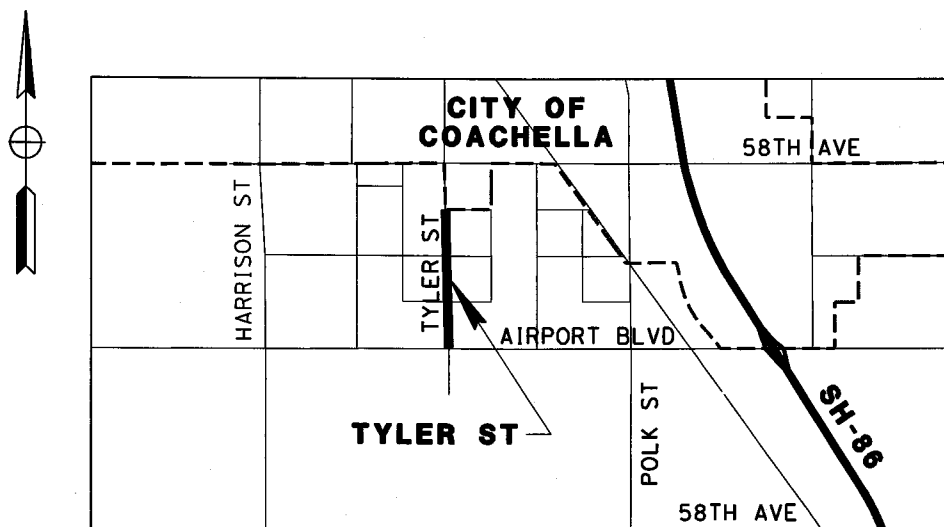
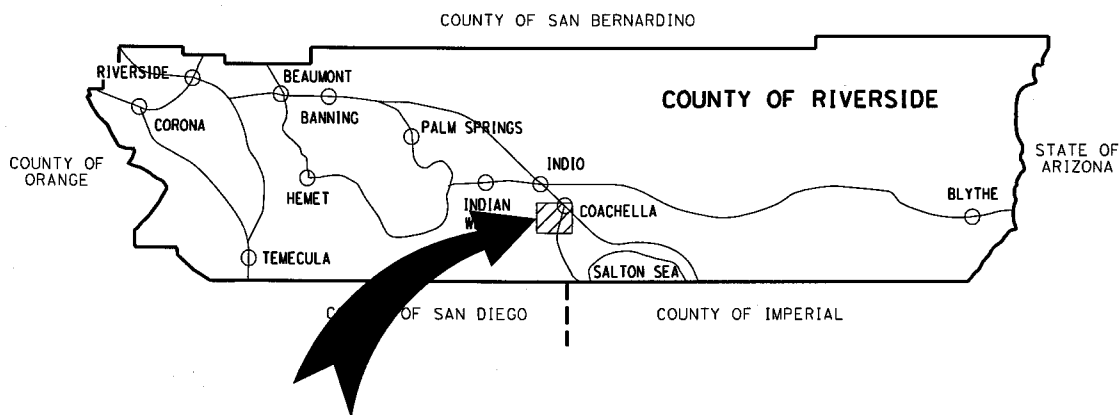


VICINITY MAP - AIRPORT

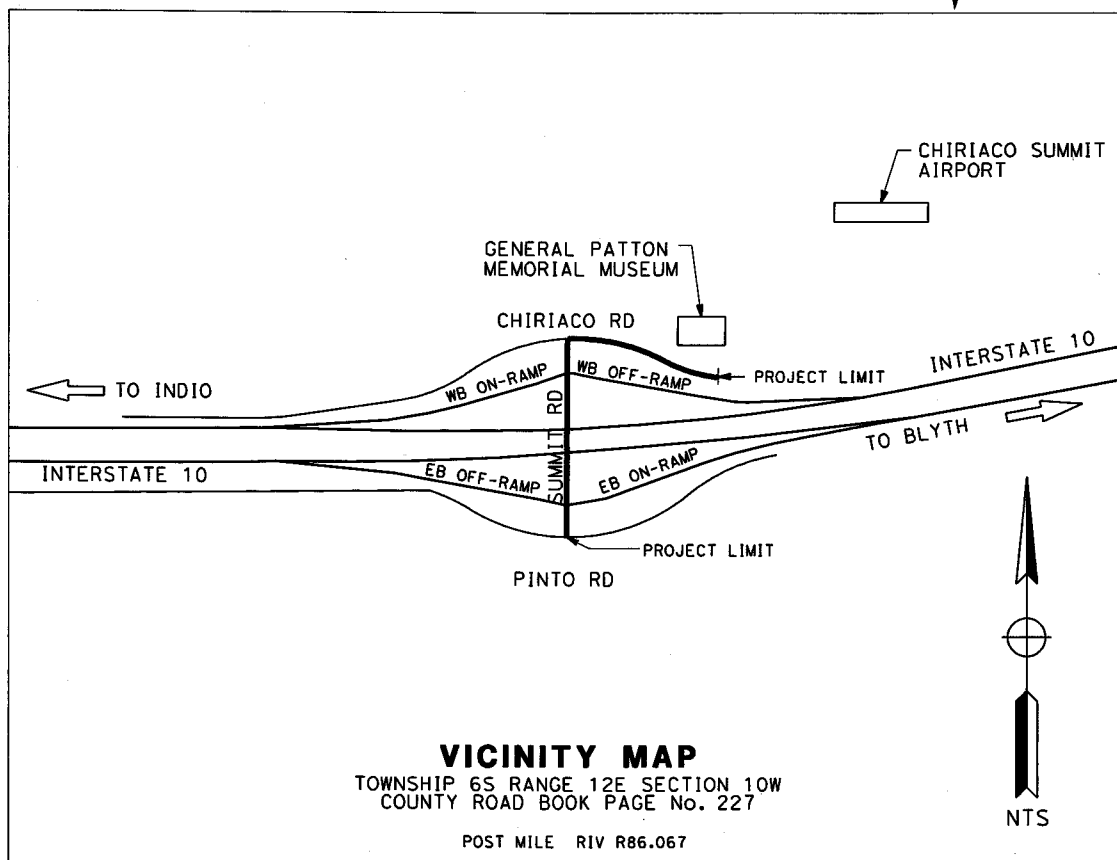
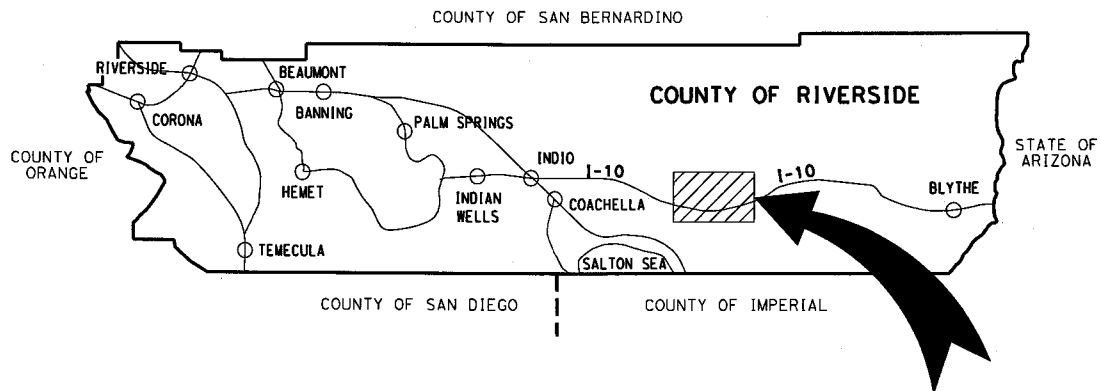


VICINITY MAP - TYLER

For all sums which the insured becomes legally obligated to pay as damages caused by "occurrences" under Section I – Coverage A, and for all medical expenses caused by accidents under Section I – Coverage C, which can be attributed only to ongoing operations at a single designated construction project shown in the Schedule above:
1. A separate Designated Construction Project General Aggregate Limit applies to each designated construction project, and that limit is equal to the amount of the General Aggregate Limit shown in the Declarations.
 2. The Designated Construction Project General Aggregate Limit is the most we will pay for the sum of all damages under Coverage A, except damages because of "bodily injury" or "property damage" included in the "products-completed operations hazard", and for medical expenses under Coverage C regardless of the number of:
 - a. Insureds;
 - b. Claims made or "suits" brought; or
 - c. Persons or organizations making claims or bringing "suits".
 3. Any payments made under Coverage A for damages or under Coverage C for medical expenses shall reduce the Designated Construction Project General Aggregate Limit for that designated construction project. Such payments shall not reduce the General Aggregate Limit shown in the Declarations nor shall they reduce any other Designated Construction Project General Aggregate Limit for any other designated construction project shown in the Schedule above.
 4. The limits shown in the Declarations for Each Occurrence, Damage To Premises Rented To You and Medical Expense continue to apply. However, instead of being subject to the General Aggregate Limit shown in the Declarations, such limits will be subject to the applicable Designated Construction Project General Aggregate Limit.

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c. Method Of Sharing

If all of the other insurance permits contribution by equal shares, we will follow this method also. Under this approach each insurer contributes equal amounts until it has paid its applicable limit of insurance or none of the loss remains, whichever comes first.

If any of the other insurance does not permit contribution by equal shares, we will contribute by limits. Under this method, each insurer's share is based on the ratio of its applicable limit of insurance to the total applicable limits of insurance of all insurers.

5. Premium Audit

2. "Advertising injury" means injury, other than "bodily injury", "property damage" or "personal injury", sustained by a person or organization and caused by an offense of infringing, in that particular part of your "advertisement" about your goods, products or services, upon their:
 - a. Copyrighted "advertisement"; or
 - b. Registered collective mark, registered service mark or other registered trademarked name, slogan, symbol or title.

3. "Asbestos" means asbestos in any form, including its presence or use in any alloy, by-product, compound or other material or "waste".

4. "Auto" means:
 - a. A land motor vehicle, trailer or semitrailer designed for travel on public roads, including any attached machinery or equipment; or
 - b. Any other land vehicle that is subject to a compulsory or financial responsibility law or other motor vehicle insurance law in the state where it is licensed or principally garaged.

However, "auto" does not include "mobile equipment".

5. "Bodily injury" means physical:
 - a. Injury;
 - b. Sickness; or
 - c. Disease;

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- B. For all sums which the insured becomes legally obligated to pay as damages caused by "occurrences" under Section I – Coverage A, and for all medical expenses caused by accidents under Section I – Coverage C, which cannot be attributed only to ongoing operations at a single designated construction project shown in the Schedule above:

- b. 60 days before the effective date of cancellation if we cancel for any other reason.

2. BROAD FORM INSURED

A. Subsidiaries and Newly Acquired or Formed Organizations As Insureds

The Named Insured shown in the Declarations is amended to include:

- 1. Any legally incorporated subsidiary in which you own more than 50% of the voting stock on the effective date of the Coverage Form. However, the Named Insured does not include any subsidiary that is an "insured" under any other automobile policy or would be an "insured" under such a policy but for its termination or the exhaustion of its Limit of Insurance.
- 2. Any organization that is acquired or formed by you and over which you maintain majority ownership. However, the Named Insured does not include any newly formed or acquired organization:
 - (a) That is an "insured" under any other automobile policy;
 - (b) That has exhausted its Limit of Insurance under any other policy; or
 - (c) 180 days or more after its acquisition or formation by you, unless you have given us written notice of the acquisition or formation.

Coverage does not apply to "bodily injury" or "property damage" that results from an "accident" that occurred before you formed or acquired the organization.

B. Employees as Insureds

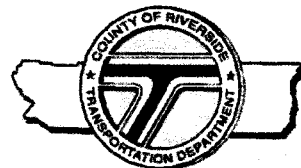

Refer to Section 37-3, Slurry Seal on page 29-33 of the Bid Book. Following additional requirement is included in the Special Provisions and made part thereof.

Before applying slurry seal, the Contractor shall treat cracks in conformance with section 37-5 "Crack Treatment" of the Standard Specifications and as directed by engineer.

Full compensation for crack treatment shall be considered as included in the bid price paid for slurry seal bid item where shown on the bid proposal and no additional compensation will be allowed.

Curb, Gutter, and Spandrel adjacent to curb ramps on Airport Boulevard/ Van Buren Street shall be considered as included in the bid price paid for Minor Concrete (curb ramp) (Bid Item 53) and no additional compensation will be allowed.

Item 21: Section 73-1.04, Payment

Existing roadside signs and posts, shall be removed, and relocated behind the sidewalk on Ramon Road project as shown on the plans in conformance with Section 82-9, "Existing Roadside Signs and Markers", of the Standard Specifications these Special Provisions and as directed by the Engineer.

Relocated Roadside Signs shall be installed per Section 82-3, "Roadside Signs," of Standard Specifications.

All Relocated Signs in County right-of-way shall be installed on new square perforated steel tube posts in accordance with County Standard No. 1222.

Existing roadside signs at locations shown on the plans to be removed shall not be removed until replacement signs have been installed or until the existing signs are no longer required for direction of public traffic, unless otherwise directed by the Engineer.

Payment

The contract unit price paid per each for Relocate Roadside Sign including signal standard mount, and street name signs, shall include full compensation for furnishing all labor, materials, tools, equipment, and incidentals and for doing all the work including all necessary concrete excavation and backfill as specified in the Standard Specifications.

Item 23: Section 83-1.02G Metal Railing

Following additional Special Provisions are included and made part hereof.

Add to Section 83-1.02G Metal Railing:

Metal hand railing shall conform to the APWA (Greenbook) Standard Plan 606-3, Type C, these Special Provisions, the details on the plans, the applicable portions of Sections 55, 75 and 83 of the Standard Specifications, and as directed by the Engineer.

Metal railing shall consist of metal elements mounted on concrete members as shown on the plans.

Steel railing material shall be welded or seamless steel pipe.

Materials and construction for the railings shall conform to the following requirements:

The edges and center of the rail element shall contact each post or block. Rail element joints shall be lapped not less than 12-1/2 inches and bolted.

The ends of each length of railing shall be fitted with terminal sections.

Workmanship shall be equivalent to commercial practice and all edges, bolt holes, and surfaces shall be free of torn metal, burrs, sharp edges, and protrusions.

Bolts shall have shoulders of such shape that will prevent them from turning.

Unless otherwise specified, the rail elements, terminal sections, bolts, nuts, and other fittings shall be galvanized.

Installation

The railing shall be erected in accordance with the Plans on anchor bolts, or in holes formed by inserts provided in the concrete railing base to receive the railing posts. Sheet metal inserts shall be removed before the erection of the railing.

No railing shall be erected on the structure until the wall to which it is to be attached is completed and all falsework supporting the system is released.

The railing shall be carefully erected, true to line and grade. Posts and balusters shall be vertical with the deviation from the vertical for the full height of the panel not exceeding 1/8 inch.

After erecting the railing, any abrasions or exposed steel shall be repaired by Hot-Dip process or Metalizing Process as approved by the Resident Engineer.

Payment

The contract price paid per linear foot for Metal Railing shall include full compensation for furnishing all labor, materials, tools, equipment, and incidentals, and for doing all the work involved in constructing the railing, complete in place, including, but not limited to, any work and materials necessary to secure railing on top of retaining wall, excavation, backfill and disposal of surplus material, concrete and reinforcing steel, as shown on the plans, as specified in these special provisions and as directed by the Resident Engineer.

Item 24: Section 87-1, Signal Modification

Following additional Special Provisions are included and made part hereof.

Add to section 87-1 in the Revised Standard Specifications:

Signal Modification

A. General

Furnishing and installing traffic signal and highway lighting systems, and payment for furnished material and work performed shall conform to the provisions in Section 86, "General" and Section 87, "Electrical Systems", of the 2015 edition Standard Specifications, amendments to the 2015 Standard Specifications, and these Special Provisions.

B. Maintaining Existing and Temporary Electrical Systems

Maintaining existing electrical systems shall conform to the provisions in Section 86-2.21C(2), "Maintaining Existing Electrical Systems", of the Standard Specifications and these Special Provisions.

Authorization and coordination from the Engineer is required for each traffic signal system shutdown. Traffic signal system shutdown shall be limited to hours between 9:00 A.M. and 3:00 P.M.

The Contractor may request authorization from the Engineer to use temporary overhead conductors for temporary traffic signal operation.

Equip existing flashing beacons with portable flashing beacons during flashing beacon shutdown. Portable flashing beacons shall conform to the provisions in Section 12-3.05, "Portable Flashing Beacons" of the Standard Specifications or as directed by the Engineer.

If directed by the Engineer, a generator shall be furnished, connected, and maintained to keep traffic signal or flashing beacon system running in normal operation. All matters pertaining to the operation of existing traffic signal equipment shall be coordinated and cooperated with Riverside County's traffic signal operation division.

Temporary "Stop" signs furnished and installed when traffic signal system is shutdown shall be 48 inches in size.

Temporary "Stop Ahead" signs furnished and installed when traffic signal system is shutdown shall be equipped with portable flashing beacons.

C. Relocating Existing Electrical Equipment

The Contractor shall relocate existing electrical systems as shown on plan(s).

D. Foundations

Foundations shall conform to the provisions in Section 51, "Concrete Structures", Section 56-3, "Standards, Poles, Pedestals, and Posts", and Section 87-1.03E (3), "Concrete Pads, Foundations, and Pedestals", of the Standard Specifications and these Special Provisions.

Portland cement concrete shall conform to Section 90-2, "Minor Concrete", of the Standard Specifications and shall be Class 3 except pole foundations shall be Class 2.

Use Type V Portland cement with a maximum W/C ratio of 0.4 when the soil type is determined by the County Engineer to have high alkalinity content and place an impermeable membrane (6-mil visqueen) under and around the concrete foundation for signal pole.

Vibrate all foundation concrete to eliminate air pockets.

E. Standards, Poles, Pedestals and Posts

Standards, poles, steel pedestals, and posts shall conform to the provisions in Section 56-3, "Standards, Poles, Pedestals, and Posts", and Section 87-1.03J, "Standards, Poles, Steel Pedestals and Posts", of the Standard Specifications and these Special Provisions.

F. Conduits

Conduit shall conform to the provisions in Section 86-1.02B, "Conduit and Accessories", and 87-1.03B, "Conduit Installation", of the Standard Specifications and these Special Provisions.

Conduits shall be Type 3, Type A, extruded, rigid Polyvinyl Chloride (PVC) conforming to UL Publication 651 requirements for underground installation only.

Conduits shall be installed via jacking or drilling method.

Conduit depth shall be at a minimum of 30 inches and not exceed 60 inches below finish grade.

Conduit size shall be 2-inch minimum unless otherwise specified.

Conduit bends shall be factory bends. Bend radius for conduits contain communication cable(s) (signal interconnect, Ethernet or fiber optic) shall be 3-feet minimum.

A pull rope and a bare #12 AWG wire shall be installed in conduits intended for future use.

Bell bushings are required for all conduit ends. The ends of conduits terminating in pull boxes and controller cabinets shall be sealed with sealing compound approved by the Engineer after conductors have been installed.

G. Pull Boxes

Pull boxes shall conform to the provisions in Section 86-1.02C, "Pull Boxes", of the Standard Specifications and these Special Provisions.

No. 5 Pull box shall be J&R Concrete Products, P-E5-2 polymer concrete gray, with fiberglass body, polymer concrete ring and polymer cover with bolt down design or approved equal.

No. 6 Pull box shall be J&R Concrete Products, P-E6B-12 polymer concrete gray, with fiberglass body, polymer concrete ring and polymer cover with bolt down design or approved equal.

No. 6E Pull box shall be J&R Concrete Products, P-E6B-24 polymer concrete gray, with fiberglass body, polymer concrete ring and polymer cover with bolt down design or approved equal.

Pull box covers shall be marked in accordance with Standard Plans ES-8A without the word "CALTRANS" unless the project is on State of California right of way.

Pull boxes shall be placed with their tops flush with surrounding finish grade or as directed by the Engineer.

Pull boxes shall be installed behind the curb or as shown on the plans and shall be spaced at no more than 500 feet intervals. The Engineer shall determine the exact locations.

Pull boxes installed in unimproved areas, locations not protected by concrete curb and gutter, shall be traffic pull box.

H. Conductors and Cables

Conductors and Cables shall conform to the provisions in Section 86-1.02F, "Conductors and Cables", of the Standard Specifications and these Special Provisions.

Specific cabling and wiring requirements for various systems or components shall be in accordance with the Special Provisions entitled to each herein.

Signal cable shall be installed continuously without splicing from the controller cabinet to each traffic signal pole. Traffic signal conductors, multiple circuit conductors, and signal cable conductors shall not be spliced unless otherwise shown.

All outer cable jacket for 12 conductors signal cable shall be removed from the traffic signal standard hand hole to the terminal block located at the side-mount traffic signal head.

No splicing is allowed on conductors signal cables.

When splicing lighting cables, Type C or Type T splice shall be used and insulated as shown in the Standard Plans, ES-13A.

Minimum conductor size for luminaire shall be No. 10 AWG, including wiring within poles and mast arms.

I. Bonding and Grounding

Bonding and grounding shall conform to the provisions in Section 86-1.02F (1)(c)(ii), "Bonding Jumpers and Equipment Grounding Conductors", of the Standard Specifications and these Special Provisions.

Grounding jumper shall be attached by a 3/16 inch or larger brass bolt in the signal standard or controller pedestal and shall be run to the conduit, ground rod or bonding wire in the adjacent pull box.

Grounding jumper shall be visible after cap has been poured on foundation.

For equipment grounding jumper a No. 8 bare copper wire shall run continuously in all circuits except a No. 12 bare copper wire shall run continuously in conduits that contain only signal interconnect cable and/or loop detector cable.

J. Pedestrian, Bicycle and Equestrian Push Buttons

Pedestrian, bicycle, and equestrian push buttons shall conform to the provisions in Section 86-1.02U, "Push Button Assemblies", of the Standard Specifications and these Special Provisions.

Accessible pedestrian signal shall be Type A and push button assembly shall be Type B per Standard Plans ES-5C.

Push button housing shall be die-cast or permanent mold cast aluminum powder coated frame with stainless steel inserts and sign screws.

Push button sign shall be white powder coat base with black heat cured ink. Right and left arrow signs shall be doubled sided.

Push button shall be Polara Engineering, Inc. model BDLM2-Y or approved equal.

Push button shall utilize solid-state Piezo switch technology, pressure activated, two-tone audible, visual LED confirmation of actuation and shall be A DA compliant.

The equestrian push buttons (EPB) shall be installed at 6 feet above finish grade or as directed by the Engineer. The Engineer shall approve the EPB placement on each pole prior to installation.

K. Detectors

Detectors shall conform to the provisions in Section 86-5, "Detectors", of the Standard Specifications and these Special Provisions.

Delay timers shall delay calls only during display of the associated red or yellow indications. If a vehicle departs the area of detection prior to expiration of the assigned delay period, the timer shall reset and no call shall be placed upon the controller. During display of the associated green indication, detectors shall operate in the present mode and calls shall not be delayed.

L. Inductive Loops

Detector loop configuration shall be Type E per Standard Plans ES-5B unless otherwise shown on the construction plan, in the Special Provisions, or as directed by the Engineer.

Limit Line detector loops shall be installed to detect bicycles per County Standard 1203.

Detector loop wire shall be Type 2.

Detector loop lead-in cable shall be Type B.

Detector loop curb terminations shall be Type A in accordance with Standard Plans ES-5D.

Loop sealant shall be the Hot-Melt Rubberized Asphalt sealant type conforming to the provisions in Section 86-1.02W (4), "Hot-Melt Rubberized Asphalt Sealant", unless directed otherwise by the Engineer. Loop conductors and sealant shall be installed on the same day the loop slots are cut.

All detector loops shall be tested sequentially by the following methods:

- impedance (measured by megohms)
- resistance (measured by ohms)
- inductance (measured in microhenries)

M. Payment Method

The contract **Lump Sum** price paid for Modify Signal on Ramon Road project shall include full compensation for furnishing all labor, materials, tools, equipment, foundations, traffic signal standards and poles, potholing required for utility verification prior to all conduit installation and for doing all the work specified herein, elsewhere in these Special

Provisions, and plans including the maintenance of existing traffic signal and lighting system and no additional compensation shall be allowed therefor.

Any other project where replacement of detector loops is required, shall be paid per unit as listed on bid proposal for the specific project.
