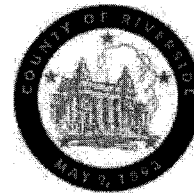



BACKGROUND: Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

1. The 4ShayJ Foundation is a non-profit agency that provides safety helmets to children who cannot afford them. Their mission is to change the way children think about helmet safety. The foundation is hosting their annual fundraiser on April 4, 2018. All funds raised will help support the organization and the purchase of helmets. CID funds will be used to help cover the cost of the event.

2. Established in 1963, ABC Recovery Center provides treatment programs for people who suffer from alcohol & drug addiction. The programs include Detoxification; three types of Residential Treatment including, Clinical, Therapeutic Community and Perinatal; and individualized day and evening Outpatient treatment. CID funds will be utilized to install a fire sprinkler system in the McGovern House, which will be used to expand their services in response to the opioid epidemic.
3. ACT for Multiple Sclerosis offers comprehensive, evidence-based programs to help people cope with their MS, fulfill their potential as human beings, and attain a high quality of life. Enhanced Strength Training, Flexibility and Circulation Therapy is a program ACT for MS offers to help clients maintain or improve their strength, balance, flexibility, mobility and overall circulation and independence. All programs, services and resources are provided free of charge to clients and their family members. CID funds will be utilized towards the Enhanced Strength, Training, Flexibility and Circulation Therapy program.
4. The American Outreach Foundation is a non-profit organization that provides electric wheelchairs and scooters, in perfect condition to veterans, low-income seniors and those who do not have insurance or those whose health insurance policy does not cover this type of assistance. CID funds will be utilized to help cover the cost of pickup/ delivery of power chairs, batteries and other program costs.
5. The Blythe Harmony Kitchen provides hot meals five days a week for senior citizens, low-income and homeless people in the community of Blythe and the surrounding communities of Mesa Verde and Ripley. Blythe Harmony Kitchen serves approximately 100 meals each day and 23,000 meals per year. CID funds will be used toward the cost of food and operating expenses.
6. The Calicinto Ranch provides year-round programs and events for children whose parents are incarcerated. The ranch aims to help at risk children learn how to be responsible, respectful, and productive youth by educational encouragement; different activities including horseback riding, fishing archery, hayrides, cooking class, music class. CID funds will be used to cover the cost of 10 children of prisoners from the 4th district to camp this year.
7. CVAG's Homelessness Committee enters in its 9th year of managing the Alan Seman Bus Pass Program. The program distributes passes to non-profit agencies throughout the Coachella Valley which provides homeless or near homeless individual's transportation to and from services such as DMV, medical appointments, mental health, social and court services etc. CID funding will be utilized to purchase the bus passes.
8. Coachella Valley Community Trust (CVCT) mission is to foster productive and responsible young people through effective community collaborations. CVCT offers an after school Kids Club. CID funds will be used for Mini-Grant Program, which provides low-income at-risk youth the opportunity to participate in extracurricular activities, field trips, classes and other educational opportunities families can't afford.
9. The Coachella Valley Historical Society's mission is to preserve, interpret, and share artifacts that create a dialogue about the evolving history of the Coachella Valley. The museum offers different programs including; free tours for 3rd grade students in the Indio area, Summer Art Camps, monthly Cultural Chats, nationally recognized Junior Historian program, Dia de Los Muertos Celebration and more. The CID funding will be utilized to fully

equip the outdoor campus with a CCTV System (video surveillance), to provide a more secure and safe environment for museum guests, local youth, and staff.

10. The Joslyn Center will host the 9th Annual Runway Fashion Show on April 12, 2018. The Joslyn Center provides critical services, care, support and programs to local seniors in Palm Desert. The funds raised at this event will continue to provide services. CID funds will be used toward the cost of the event such as food, equipment and marketing.
11. The Colorado River Senior Center provides a place for the seniors to be able to enjoy getting together with other seniors in the area. They offer nutritional lunches and meals for special occasions. They also offer Meals on Wheels program for the home bound and those who have trouble getting a nutritional meal. The center is designated an emergency center by the Red Cross, as well is a Cool Center during the summers. CID funds will be utilized to help cover the utilities expense (Electric Bill, Insurance, Auto Insurance; water phone service, trash pick-up, internet)
12. Desert Hot Springs Community Task Force is in the process of opening a facility (Shea's Veterans Center) to house programs and services to veterans and individuals over the age of 18, in the Western Coachella Valley. It will benefit those who lack housing and will provide much needed emergency shelter relief services, counseling referrals, and support for sober living. CID funds will be utilized to cover initial rent costs, utilities (electricity).
13. The Family YMCA of the Desert provides childcare services and programs for over 3,800 kids and families each day at 41 sites throughout the Coachella Valley. Services include preschool, sports, Youth and Government program for teens. The YMCA has a tuition assistance program to ensure low-income families receive financial assistance to participate in the programs. CID funds will be utilized to support the Program/Curriculum Development and Tuition Assistance Fund.
14. Fire & Burn Foundation is a non-profit health agency dedicated to reducing burn injuries and deaths through fire and burn education, burn survivor support programs and the funding of burn care research and treatment. The foundation is hosting a 4-day winter camp session, which is available to burn survivor children ages 5-17. CID funds will be used to benefit children of Riverside County and the 4th District to camp during the holiday weekend.
15. The Friends of the Date Festival was created in 2013 by a group of volunteers at the Riverside County Fair and National Date Festival to raise funds in support of the Magic Carpet Scholarship. The Magic Carpet Music Competition is one of the scholarship programs the fair holds annually, awarding \$4,500 (8 scholarships) which benefits Riverside County residents. Applications are sent to RC High Schools, Music Schools and Community Colleges as well as posted on the Fair website. CID funds will be utilized to help support the Magic Carpet Music Competition.
16. The Galilee Center helps provide food, clothing, senior services and other basic needs for more than 2,500 unduplicated families per year, residing in the eastern Coachella Valley, Thermal, Mecca, North Shore, and Oasis. They also operate a Farm Worker Comfort Station which this facility offers restrooms, showers, laundry facility, a hot meal and a cooling center to seasonal/migrant farm workers. The CID funding will be used to provide food, hot meals, and other services.

17. PHMS-PTSA mission is to positively impact the lives of all students and families by developing family oriented, fun and educational programs. The Emergency Preparedness and Recovery Presentations Project is being developed in the Coachella Valley with Concepts for how to adequately prepare and appropriately react to disasters and emergencies. CID funds will be used for the purchase of survival first aid and/or emergency kits.
18. Coachella Valley High School will hold its Annual College & Career Night formerly known as College Voc-Tech Night on October 10, 2018 at the Fullenwider Auditorium. The college fair offers students and their parents an opportunity to visit with representatives from post-secondary options and gain more information on what option might be best for their son or daughter. CID funds will be utilized for the cost of the venue.
19. The Riverside County Sheriff's Department will host its Annual Awards Ceremony on April 11, 2018 to honor members of the department sworn and non-sworn staff, as well as volunteers. All recipients are presented medals, plaques, and other significant recognition awards. CID funds will be used to support the cost of this event.
20. Rotary is an international organization with clubs around the world, its members' main objective is to serve their communities through their personal, business and community life. Indio Rotary is hosting it's Annual Rotary Math Field Day, which provides middle school students with an opportunity to participate in a math competition. CID funds will be used to purchase awards, including trophies, ribbons, and prizes for winners.
21. U.S Veterans Initiative operates two residential programs, a community service center, and 184 low-income affordable housing apartments units. Services include: case management, employment training & assistance, life skills classes etc. The U.S Vets SSVF (Supportive Services for Veteran Families) program offers temporary assistance to at-risk, low income families in an effort to keep them from becoming homeless. The program provide legal counseling and financial aid for rent, utilities, moving costs, childcare, and bus transportation, employment assistance and benefits counseling. CID funding will be utilized towards providing services to approximately 7-15 homeless and at-risk veteran households who reside in the 4th District.
22. The United Way of The Desert is hosting the 28th annual United Way of the Desert Gala on May 11, 2018. All funds raised at this Gala will benefit the Community Impact Fund, which supports 25 programs in the Coachella Valley, working within the mission to break the cycle of poverty in the Coachella Valley. CID funds will be used towards the cost of the event such as food, marketing, entertainment and audio-visual needs.
