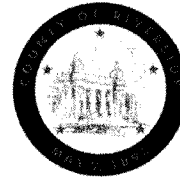

SUBJECT: RIVERSIDE UNIVERSITY HEALTH SYSTEM-BEHAVIORAL HEALTH: Authorize and Approve an Increase to the Contract Aggregate to Provide Substance Abuse and Prevention Treatment Services (District: All) [\$40,000,000 Annually; up to \$4,000,000 in additional compensation], [\$80,000,000- Total for 2 years 89% Federal, 11% State]

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Supervisors:

1. Authorize and approve increasing the annual contract aggregate amount from \$30,000,000 to \$40,000,000 for substance abuse and prevention treatment (SAPT) service providers through FY18/19;
2. Authorize the Purchasing Agent, in accordance with Ordinance No. 459, based on the availability of fiscal funding and as approved by County Counsel to: a) move the allocated funds among the vendors for SAPT services listed in Attachment A; b) sign amendments that do not change the substantive terms of the agreements; c) sign annual renewals and amendments to the amount of compensation provisions that do not exceed 10% annually; and, d) exempt the Purchasing Agent from the sole source requirement when adding new vendors not to exceed \$100,000 without securing competitive bids while staying within the Board approved aggregate amount of \$40,000,000 through June 30, 2019.

BACKGROUND:

Summary

Riverside University Health System- Behavioral Health (RUHS-BH) operates a continuum of care system that consists of County-operated clinics and contracted service providers delivering a variety of SAPT services within each geographic region of Riverside County. On December 13, 2016 (#3-37), the Board approved Agreement #16-93238 with the Department of Health Care Services (DHCS), which provides funding and service provisions for DMC-ODS. On February 27, 2018 (#3-43), the Board approved and signed Amendment A01 to the DHCS Agreement #16-93238, which increases the Agreement maximum from \$126,640,221 to \$208,781,179. As a result, RUHS-BH is seeking an increase in the contract aggregate by \$10,000,000 for the remainder of FY 17/18 and for FY 18/19 to accommodate an increase in services in both the County-operated clinics and contracted service providers. Drug Medi-Cal Services are funded by Federal and State sources, and do not require any County funds.

SAPT services include Outpatient, Intensive Outpatient, Residential, Peri-natal Residential, Medication Assisted Treatment, Opioid Treatment, Withdrawal Management, Case Management, and Recovery Services. Since the implementation of DMC-ODS, the program has increased the number of consumers receiving services by 34%, serving 4,565 consumers compared to 3,384 consumers in the same period prior to the DMC-ODS implementation.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

These services are a component of Behavioral Health's system of care aimed at improving the health and safety of consumers and the community.

Contract History and Price Reasonableness

On October 7, 2016, RUHS-BH in conjunction with Riverside County Purchasing issued the Request for Qualifications (RFQu) #MHARC-196 for DMC-ODS service. Bid responses were received by 17 organizations, and RUHS-BH contracted with 16 of those bidders. On February 7, 2017 (#3-26), the Board approved the award recommendations and the \$30,000,000 contract aggregate for SAPT services. Subsequently, two providers are no longer contracted with the County.

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STATE OF CALIFORNIA**

RUHS-BH is preparing an RFQu for release to expand DMC-ODS services throughout the County. Any resulting agreements in excess of \$100,000 will be brought to the Board of Supervisors for approval. In the interim, RUHS-BH is seeking sole source exemption for contracts under \$100,000 for services required to improve network adequacy standards for time and distance (access to services) as required by the State.
