

SUBJECT: TRANSPORTATION AND LAND MANAGEMENT AGENCY/ TRANSPORTATION DEPARTMENT: Approval of the Plans and Specifications and Authorization to Advertise for Bid for the Wood Road and Parsons Road Reconstruction Projects, in the Community of Glen Valley, CEQA Exempt. 1st District (Clerk to Advertise); [\$1,963,059 Total]; Local Funds 100%.

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Supervisors:

1. Find that the Wood Road and Parsons Road Reconstruction Projects are categorically exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15301 (c) - Existing Facilities; and
2. Approve the plans and specifications for the construction of the Wood Road and Parsons Road Reconstruction Projects, in the Community of Glen Valley; and
3. Authorize the Clerk of the Board to advertise for bids to be received by the office of the Director of Transportation and Land Management at the Transportation Annex located at 3525 14th Street, Riverside, CA 92501. All bids must be received up to the hour of 2:00 p.m., Wednesday, May 16, 2018 at which time bids will be opened; and
4. Direct the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors to file the Notice of Exemption with the County Clerk for posting within five (5) working days.



BACKGROUND:

Summary

The Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) provides for the construction of the Wood Road and Parsons Road Reconstruction Projects both from Markham Street to Mariposa Avenue an approximately 1 miles segment respectively, in the Community of Glen Valley.

Two projects are being combined to bid as one project in order to gain efficiencies by eliminating multiple bidding and administrative procedures, and to seek more favorable bids associated with larger bid quantities.

The existing pavement on Wood Road currently ranges between 36' and 40' wide. The project proposes to reconstruct the existing roadway and widen the pavement between Dallas Avenue and Granite Avenue to provide a uniform 40' wide paved roadway throughout the project limits. The widened roadway would accommodate (2) 12' lanes and 8' wide paved shoulders. The Wood Road project will also include the reconstruction of non-ADA compliant curb ramps at Markham Street and the replacement of detector loops for the traffic signal at this location.

The existing pavement on Parsons Road currently ranges between 22' and 24' wide. The project proposes to reconstruct the existing roadway and widen one to two feet on each side of the roadway to provide a uniform 26' wide paved roadway throughout the project limits. The widened roadway would accommodate (2) 12' lanes and 1' wide paved shoulders. Parsons Road will also include the construction of (3) bus turnouts so buses can stop without impacting through traffic.

Roadway reconstruction is needed on both projects due to the deteriorated pavement conditions. The proposed reconstruction will consists of grinding the existing pavement, re-grading the surface and the placement of new asphalt concrete pavement.

Additional improvements on both projects include driveway tie-ins, upgrading signage, and the replacement of striping, thermoplastic pavement markings, and other associated work.

**SUBMITTAL TO THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE,
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On April 28, 2017, Senate Bill 1 (SB1) was passed to improve the state's aging transportation infrastructure, particularly roads and bridges. Because of this, the County is now able to improve the condition of roads in need of resurfacing or reconstruction and has included them in the County Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). The Wood Road and Parsons Road reconstruction projects are urgently needed to improve aging roads in a state of disrepair.

The submitted plans and specifications have been approved as to form by County Counsel.

The bid documents include the following bid schedules of work:

- Base Bid Schedule 1: Wood Road Reconstruction Project
- Base Bid Schedule 2: Parsons Road Reconstruction Project
- Alternate Bid Schedule 1: Wood Road Reconstruction Project - Utility adjustments to grade (Western Municipal Water District)
- Alternate Bid Schedule 2: Wood Road Reconstruction Project - Utility adjustments to grade (AT&T)
- Alternate Bid Schedule 3: Wood Road Reconstruction Project - Utility adjustments to grade (Level-3 Communication)
- Alternate Bid Schedule 4: Slurry Seal (Microsurfacing), Wood Road, between Cajalco Road and Markham Avenue
- Alternate Bid Schedule 5: Parsons Road Reconstruction Project - Utility adjustments to grade (Western Municipal Water District)

The adjustment of manholes and utility covers owned by the Western Municipal Water District (WMWD), AT&T, and Level-3 Communications (Level-3), respectively, are included in the bid package as alternate bid schedules. If WMWD, AT&T, and Level-3 approve the award of their respective alternate bid schedules, as bid by the apparent low bidder, the costs for the work will be funded by the utility owners through a reimbursement agreement, which will be submitted to the Board of Supervisors for approval prior to or concurrent with the award of the construction contract.

The Slurry Seal Treatment (Microsurfacing) to Wood Road from Cajalco Road to Markham Street, approximately 1.5 miles, will be selected for award if the low bid is favorable. The slurry seal treatment is provided as preventative maintenance to extend the life of the pavement and postpone more costly pavement rehabilitation. The slurry seal treatment seals small cracks, restores lost flexibility to the pavement surface and helps preserve the pavement structure.

The Transportation Department will select the contractor based upon the lowest responsive and responsible bid of the sum of all bid schedules.

Environmental Findings

The County Transportation Department is requesting that the Board approve the Notice of Exemption which documents that the project consists of the maintenance, repair and minor alteration of an existing public facility and is exempt under Section 15301 (c) of the CEQA Guidelines.

Impact on Citizens and Businesses

The purpose of this project is to rehabilitate deteriorated segments of Wood Road and Parsons Road both from Markham Street to Mariposa Avenue to provide the public with a smooth paved roadway that will improve the safety and efficiency of vehicular traffic.

The slurry seal treatment on Wood Road between Cajalco Road and Markham Street will improve traffic safety for motorists and will extend the life of the pavement thereby reducing the need for more extensive types of resurfacing that can be up to ten times more costly.

The work is scheduled to begin in summer of 2018. The work will be phased to keep the road open during construction as much as possible and will take approximately two months to complete.

The construction contract is estimated to cost approximately \$1,963,059 and will be funded with Gas Tax/SB-1 funds.

PROJECT SPONSOR: Riverside County Transportation Department

PROJECT LOCATION: The Community of Glen Valley

SUPERVISORIAL DISTRICT: First Supervisorial District

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The County of Riverside Transportation Department is proposing to resurface approximately 1 mile of Wood Road from Markham Street to Mariposa Avenue. Wood Road is classified as a Secondary Highway in the County of Riverside General Plan. Wood Road currently ranges from a 34-40 feet pavement width with dike and dirt shoulder on each side of the roadway. The proposed project will include pulverizing the roadway width and overlaying the pulverized material with Hot Mix Asphalt (HMA). Additionally, in order to provide a consistent 40 foot roadway width, up to 4 feet of the dirt shoulder from Dallas Avenue to Granite Avenue will be pulverized and overlaid with HMA.

The proposed project will include:

- Construction of some driveways and driveway tie-ins
- Asphalt concrete over-side drains
- Placement of asphalt concrete dike and shoulder grading
- Utility adjustments
- Striping of roadway, including pavement markers and reflectors
- Replacement of signs and detector loops

No additional right-of-way will be required to construct the proposed improvements. The project improvements will widen Wood Road within existing right of way to provide a consistent 40 foot road and the proposed Project will raise the existing roadway profile by 0.40 feet.

ENVIRONMENTAL ANALYSIS:

Because the Project consists of operation, maintenance and repair of an existing public facility; and there is no expansion of an existing roadway, as addition of 4 feet of overlay on dirt shoulders is a roadway gap width closure measure; this Project qualifies for a Class 1 Categorical Exemption under Section 15301 (c) of the CEQA Guidelines. Furthermore, for public safety, existing public facilities (e.g. street lights, fire hydrants) will be protected in place and the resurfacing of the facility will consist of maintenance and repair without expansion of highway capacity. Construction of driveway tie-ins, asphalt concrete over-side drains, roadway striping, installation of pavement markers and reflectors, and replacement of signs and detector loops will be included to address safety of residents and pedestrians.

CEQA Finding:

The Transportation Department staff conducted a review of the project and determined that the project qualifies for a Class 1 Categorical Exemption under Section 15301 (c) of the CEQA Guidelines, Article 19 commencing with Section 15300. In accordance with Section 15301 (c), Class 1 projects consist of the operation, repair and maintenance of existing public facilities, such as highways, streets, sidewalks, gutters, bicycle and pedestrian trails and similar facilities.

The Riverside County Transportation Department has found that the above-described project is exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), based on the following:



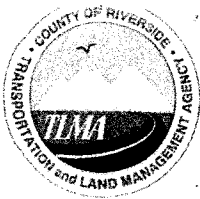

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The County of Riverside Transportation Department is proposing to Microsurface approximately 1.5 miles of Wood Road from Cajalco Road to Markham Street. Wood Road is classified as a Secondary Highway in the County of Riverside's General Plan. Wood Road currently ranges from 26-48 feet wide with dike, curb & gutter, and sidewalk throughout various segments of the roadway. The proposed project will include applying crack treatment and microsurfacing¹ treatment across the entire width of the roadway. The proposed project will include:

- Reconstruction of non-ADA (Americans with Disabilities Act) compliant curb ramps
- Removal of existing striping, including pavement markers and reflectors
- Striping of roadway and installing pavement markers and reflectors

No additional right-of-way will be required to construct the proposed improvements. The project improvements will be done on the existing footprint of the roadway and the profile will not be raised.

¹ Micro surfacing is similar to slurry seal. It consists of the application of a mixture of water, asphalt emulsion, aggregate (very small crushed rock), and chemical additives to an existing asphalt concrete pavement surface. The major difference between slurry seal and micro surfacing is in how they "break" or harden. Slurry relies on evaporation of the water in the asphalt emulsion. The asphalt emulsion used in micro surfacing contains chemical additives which allow it to break without relying on the sun or heat for evaporation to occur.

ENVIRONMENTAL ANALYSIS:

Because the Project consists of operation, maintenance and repair of an existing public facility, and there is no expansion of an existing roadway; this Project qualifies for a Class 1 Categorical Exemption under Section 15301 (c) of the CEQA Guidelines. Furthermore, for public safety, existing public facilities (e.g. street lights, fire hydrants) will be protected in place and the slurry seal and microsurfacing processes of the facility will consist of maintenance and repair without expansion of highway capacity. Roadway striping, installation of pavement markers and reflectors, and reconstruction of non-ADA compliant ramps will be included to address safety of residents and pedestrians.

CEQA Finding:

The Transportation Department staff conducted a review of the project and determined that the project qualifies for a Class 1 Categorical Exemption under Section 15301 (c) of the CEQA Guidelines, Article 19 commencing with Section 15300. In accordance with Section 15301 (c), Class 1 projects consist of the operation, repair and maintenance of existing public facilities, such as highways, streets, sidewalks, gutters, bicycle and pedestrian trails and similar facilities.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The County of Riverside Transportation Department (RCTD) is proposing to resurface approximately one mile of roadway of Parsons Road from Markham Street to Mariposa Avenue. Parsons Road is classified as a Local Road in the County of Riverside's General Plan. Parsons Road currently ranges from 22-24 feet wide from edge of pavement to edge of pavement with a dirt shoulder on each side of the roadway. The proposed project will include pulverizing the roadway width as well as 1-2 feet of the dirt shoulder and overlaying the pulverized roadway and shoulder to provide a 26 feet paved roadway.

The proposed project will include:

- Construction of some driveways and driveway tie-ins
- Construction of bus turnouts at bus stops (3 locations)
- Asphalt concrete over-side drains
- Placement of asphalt concrete dike, safety edge, and shoulder backing
- Utility adjustments
- Striping of roadway, including pavement markers and reflectors
- Replacement and relocations of signs

The improvements will widen Parsons Road by 1-2 feet on each side of the roadway. No additional right-of-way will be required to construct the proposed improvements. The project improvements will raise the existing roadway profile by 0.30 feet.

Because the Project consists of operation, maintenance and repair of an existing public facility; and there is no expansion of the existing roadway capacity, this Project qualifies for a Class 1 Categorical Exemption under Section 15301 (c) of the CEQA Guidelines. Furthermore, for public safety, existing public facilities (e.g. street lights, fire hydrants, pull boxes, power poles, and utilities) will be protected in place and the resurfacing of the facility will consist of maintenance and repair without expansion of highway capacity. Construction of driveway tie-ins and bus turn outs will be included to ensure safety of residents and pedestrians.

CEQA Finding:

The Transportation Department staff conducted a review of the project and determined that the project qualifies for a Class 1 Categorical Exemption under Section 15301 (c) of the CEQA Guidelines, Article 19 commencing with Section 15300. In accordance with Section 15301 (c), Class 1 projects consist of the operation, repair and maintenance of existing public facilities, such as highways, streets, sidewalks, gutters, bicycle and pedestrian trails and similar facilities.

The Riverside County Transportation Department has found that the above-described project is exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), based on the following:

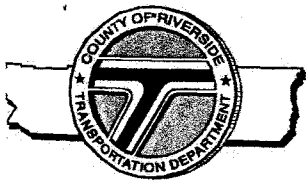
