BACKGROUND:

The Riverside County Workforce Development Board (WDB) is a private sector led policy and oversight body that supports economic expansion and the development of the regional workforce. The WDB is governed by the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act of 2014 (WIOA) which mandates that 50% of the members must come from the business community. In addition, WDBs are required to have representation from local community colleges and other training providers, as well as economic development and workforce program leaders. This ensures that federal funds for workforce development activities are expended on training and career coaching that meets the needs of the business community. Pursuant to WIOA, the Board of Supervisors, led by the Board Chairman who serves as the Chief Local Elected Official (CLEO), is responsible for appointing the WDB members for two year terms.

Ms. Wetton's extensive experience in healthcare management has played an important role for the WDB. As Chief Executive Officer, Ms. Wetton has brought Temecula Valley Hospital to be honored as one of the Inland region's top workplaces for 2017. She provides insight to

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address the workforce needs of the Healthcare Industry, as one of the five in demand industries identified by the WDB. Her membership on the WDB brings the perspective of a Healthcare Industry expert as well as a large employer who can expose the needs of the industry and the region. Ms. Wetton's continuing membership will help further the WDB's efforts in the healthcare sector, as the WDB continues to address industry and workforce needs, and increase opportunities for partnerships with businesses, community-based organizations, and educational institutions.

Ms. Wetton has expressed an interest in continuing to serve on the WDB as a private sector representative for the Third District. If reappointed she will serve a two-year term commencing March 22, 2018 and ending March 22, 2020.
