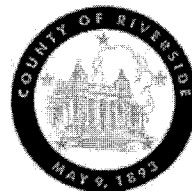

SUBJECT: HOUSING AUTHORITY: Ratify and Approve Amendment No. Six to Memorandum of Understanding CW-03145 between the Housing Authority of the County of Riverside and the County of Riverside Department of Public Social Services to provide Rapid Re-Housing Services to CalWorks Customers, [All Districts]; [Total Cost for FY 17/18 \$1,435,000, FY 18/19 \$1,175,000 - 43% State Funding, 57% Federal Funding]; Project is CEQA Exempt

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Commissioners:

1. Find that the project is exempt from California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15061(b)(3);
2. Ratify and approve the attached Riverside County Department of Public Social Services Amendment #6 Memorandum of Understanding with Housing Authority of the County of Riverside Rapid Re-Housing Services to CalWORKS Customers (Amendment) identified as #CW-03145-06, between the County of Riverside on behalf of its Department of Public Social Services (DPSS) and the Housing Authority of the County Of Riverside (Housing Authority) (i) increasing the maximum reimbursement amount for fiscal year 17/18 by \$260,000 from \$1,175,000 to \$1,435,000, (ii) extending the contract term for one additional year from July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019, with a one-year renewable option, and (iii) adding an additional maximum reimbursement amount for fiscal year 18/19 in an amount not to exceed \$1,175,000, for a total maximum reimbursement amount of \$2,610,000 for the contract term;

BACKGROUND:

Summary

The Department of Public Social Services (DPSS) has received funding from the California Department of Social Services (CDSS) to implement a CalWORKs Housing Support Program for the County of Riverside. The goal for the DPSS CalWORKs Housing Support Program (HSP) is to help homeless families receiving CalWORKs secure permanent housing by removing barriers. DPSS has selected the Housing Authority of the County of Riverside (HACR) to administer the housing service component of the CalWORKs HSP based on HACR's experience, fiscal capacity and the agency's ability to quickly implement the program for the last four years.

On September 1, 2015 the Board of Commissioners approved Memorandum of Understanding #CW-03145 (Original MOU) between DPSS and HACR with a term from July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016, in which HACR agreed to leverage existing housing resources and landlord connections to partner with DPSS to quickly implement the HSP. Housing services include, but are not limited, to landlord recruitment, tenant education, housing navigation, housing placement and housing oriented case management services. The Original MOU provided up to

\$700,000 in funds to HACR for the duration of the term, with automatic renewals for 1 year periods, through June 30, 2020, contingent upon the availability of funding. The Original MOU was thereafter amended five times as discussed below:

1. Amendment #1, effective July 1, 2015, increased the maximum reimbursement amount to \$1,500,000;
2. Amendment #2, effective July 1, 2016, exercised the first one-year renewable option and extended the contract term to June 30, 2017;
3. Amendment #3, effective May 1, 2017, reduced the maximum reimbursement amount to \$775,000;
4. Amendment #4, effective July 1, 2017, exercised the second, one-year renewable option and extended the contract term to June 30, 2018; and
5. Amendment #5, effective July 1, 2017 increased the maximum reimbursement amount to \$1,175,000.

DPSS recently awarded HACR an additional \$260,000 in state and federal funds to meet the needs of additional CalWORKs families that are currently homeless and receiving services through the DPSS Family Stabilization Unit for FY 2017-18. Additionally, DPSS is awarding HACR with an amount not to exceed \$1,175,000 (with a one-year renewable option) for the FY 2018-19. The increase in award amount and extension for FY 2017-18 and FY 2018-19 are memorialized in the attached Riverside County Department of Public Social Services Amendment #06 Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with Housing Authority of the County of Riverside Rapid Re-Housing Services to CalWORKS Customers (Amendment #6) identified as #CW-03145-06. HACR staff recommends the Board of Commissioners approve the attached Amendment #6.

This project will provide much needed assistance to meet the needs of additional CalWORKs families that are currently homeless and receiving services through the DPSS Family Stabilization Unit for FY 2017-18 and FY 2018-19. As detailed in the line item program budget attached to Amendment # 6, the DPSS funding will be used to provide direct housing assistance to participating families in the form of security deposits, utility deposits, and short term rental subsidies to support housing stabilization, cover transportation costs to assist families in locating an appropriate rental unit, and postage. Funds will also be utilized to cover Housing Navigator staff who will provide housing locator and stabilization services to participating families. HACR staff recommends the Board of Commissioners approve the attached Amendment #6 which has been approved as to form by County Counsel.

Pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), Amendment #6 was reviewed and determined to be categorically exempt under State CEQA Guidelines Section 15061(b)(3), General Rule or "Common Sense" Exemption. The project relates to the award of grant funds to CalWORKs families that are currently homeless and receiving services from DPSS (Project). It can be seen with certainty there is no possibility that the Project may have a significant effect on the environment, as the grant of funds awarded in Amendment #6 will only have financial affects, and will not lead to any direct or reasonably indirect physical environmental impacts. 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Notice of Exemption will be filed by staff with the County Clerk within five days of the approval of Amendment #6.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

This project is designed to address the most critical need of homeless families who are receiving CalWORKS services – housing. With stable housing, these families can take full advantage of CalWORKS wrap around services including employment services and other community resources which improve the well-being and self-sufficiency levels of low income families. It is estimated that over 3,790 CalWORKS families are homeless or near homeless within the County of Riverside. Participating families and the community will benefit from reductions in the number of families experiencing homelessness; reductions in the duration of time a family is homeless; and reducing the amount and duration of CalWORKS financial assistance by rapidly stabilizing families in crisis. In summary, the program will reduce the trauma and individual financial cost of homelessness for families and reduce the public cost associated of homelessness and extreme poverty. Families who are stably housed have a much higher success rate in obtaining employment and higher wages.

Additional Fiscal Information

The Housing Authority's housing services will be covered 100% by State funding. No general funds or Housing Authority administrative funds will be expended on this project.

Contract History and Price Reasonableness


The Housing Authority has a historical partnership with the Department of Public Social Services to provide housing and supportive services to homeless individuals and families. The two departments currently partner on five existing housing programs via contracts funded through U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's Continuum of Care program.

This Amendment # 06 to the Memorandum of Understanding # CW-03145 (hereinafter "Amendment # 06"), effective May 1, 2018, is made by and between the County of Riverside, a political subdivision of the State of California, on behalf of its Department of Public Social Services (hereinafter referred to as "DPSS"), and the Housing Authority of the County of Riverside (hereinafter referred to as "Housing Authority").

WHEREAS, DPSS and Housing Authority have entered into that certain MOU, approved by the Riverside County Board of Supervisors on August 18, 2015, Agenda Item 3-55, and effective July 1, 2015; and,

WHEREAS, the MOU has been amended by that certain Amendment # 1, effective July 1, 2015, increasing the maximum reimbursement amount to \$1,500,000; by that certain Amendment # 2, effective July 1, 2016, exercising the first one-year renewable option and extending the contract term to June 30, 2017; by that certain Amendment # 03, effective May 1, 2017, reducing the maximum reimbursement amount to \$775,000; by that certain Amendment # 04, effective July 1, 2017, exercising the second, one-year renewable option and extending the contract term to June 30, 2018; and by that certain Amendment # 05, effective July 1, 2017, increasing the maximum reimbursement amount to \$1,175,000;

NOW THEREFORE, DPSS and Housing Authority agree as follows:

1. On page 1, and every page thereafter, all references to the MOU number CW-03145-05 is hereby replaced with CW-03145-06.
2. On page 1, MAXIMUM REIMBURSABLE AMOUNT is hereby amended to read:

 \$1,175,000.00 for FY 18/19"

3. On page 7, IV. HOUSING AUTHORITY RESPONSIBILITIES, C. FISCAL, 1. MAXIMUM REIMBURSABLE AMOUNT, is hereby amended to read:

“Total payment under this MOU shall not exceed \$1,435,000.00 for the period July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2018 and \$1,175,000.00 for the period July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019.”




