Born on May 10, 1947 and raised in Newport News, Virginia, Mary Pat graduated from Warwick High School in 1965. She earned a Bachelor's Degree in 1969 at Mary Washington College of the University of Virginia and a Master's in Education from the College of William and Mary in Virginia in 1979.

Mary Pat began her long life of service teaching fourth grade at Saunders Elementary in Newport News, Virginia. She married Fighter Pilot Gordon Louis Jenkins in 1978, and they moved to George Air Force Base in Apple Valley, California the year after. While at George Air Force Base, Mary Pat was promoted to Principal at Yucca Loma Elementary. She was called upon as Squadron First Lady for the 526nd TFS, 562nd TFTS, and 561st Tac Ftr Squadron from 1980 to 1983. Mary Pat was the founding Principal at Rio Vista Elementary School in Apple Valley and named Administrator of the Year in 1997. She was selected and served as Director of Special Education of the Apple Valley Unified School District and retired two years later.

Active in the community, Mary Pat was the First Lady Rotarian in Apple Valley and Named Rotarian of the Year of the Palm Desert Chapter in 2014. She was also an amazing hostess, decent golfer, and avid beach-goer.

Mary Pat was a loving and devoted wife, mother, aunt, and friend. She is survived by her husband Gordon Louis Jenkins, her brother Dr. Jay Tull and his wife Donna, her sister-in-law Jan Jenkins, four nieces, two nephews, and her two adored cats.
