He also taught courses at the University of Redlands and the University of California, Riverside.

In addition to college teaching and administration, Gordon founded his geological consulting firm, Clopine Geological Services. He was a member of the American Institute of Professional Geologists and a Fellow with the Geological Society of America.

Gordon and his wife Sara Rose Lapinski were married in 1979 and spent 39 years enjoying dreams, family, geology, and ideas. They traveled the world, leading educational groups studying geology and natural history. Hawaii and the Polynesian were especially important to Gordon. After spending many years leading summer geology classes in Hawaii, they purchased property on the Big Island and built their cabin Hale Kahua.
