



BACKGROUND: Community Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

1. City of Perris Senior Center support will be used towards various programs and services that will serve the senior community. Some of the programs include; nutrition services, active living support services and special events to assist with the "second" home atmosphere.
2. Moreno Valley Hispanic Chamber of Commerce will use their support towards economic development, programs and services that are provided to the community and small businesses.
3. St. Carries Center for Human Development will utilize their funding for the SMART Academy Hydroponics Garden that they will be establishing for the youth in the community. The garden will serve roughly 100 elementary school students in the Mead Valley and Perris communities during this summer. They will learn project-based skills that include; science, math, art, reading and technology.
4. Edward Dean Museum will be utilizing their funds to assist with various programs and services that will provide engagement for the community and students from all school

districts. The museum serves as a cultural resource and a historic landmark of the Fifth District.

5. Operation Safe House will use their funding to continue to assist with services for run away, homeless and at-risk youths by providing shelter and comprehensive programs designed to assist that youth and their families in opening the lines of communication and creating intervention points within the district.
6. United States Veterans Initiative will use their support for programs and services to assist the Veteran population such as; outreach, case management and benefit services. This will reach about 150 veteran households and serve over 50 wounded veterans and their families.
7. Perris Valley Historical & Museum Association will be using their funding for newly inspired programs and services that will showcase the new exhibit "Tools That Built America" for the public. The local school districts and community use the museum for education purposes as well as enjoyment.
