BACKGROUND:

Summary

Val Verde Unified School District has three high schools, four middle schools and twelve elementary schools in Perris, Moreno Valley, and the unincorporated area of Riverside County. In November 2017, the district voted to form its own police force. The Val Verde Police Department will have the same law enforcement authority as any city police department. The start-up of this new department is anticipated to take 12-18 months from the date of approval by the district board. The district recently contacted the county to request three surplus patrol vehicles. Fleet Services will transfer the vehicles, when available, to the district.
