

BACKGROUND:

Summary

On July 31, 2018, the Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) under the State of California – Health and Human Services Agency, had released the application and funding allocations for One-Time Homeless and Mentally Ill Outreach and Treatment monies authorized as part of the State's 2018-19 Budget Act as a result of SB 840 (Chapter 29, Statutes of 2018).

The Homeless Mentally Ill Outreach and Treatment Program is designed to provide flexible one-time funding for county activities involving individuals with serious mental illness and who are homeless or at risk of homelessness. All counties are eligible to receive this funding, and counties are encouraged to leverage this funding with other funding sources and initiatives, including Whole Person Care pilots and efforts to address mental illness among populations with a high likelihood of homelessness, including those with recent involvement in the criminal justice system or release from incarceration.

A funding allocation schedule was developed for the Application for One Time Funding Homeless Mentally Ill Outreach and Treatment Program. The California State Association of Counties (CSAC) worked with DHCS and the California Department of Finance to develop the \$50 million funding allocation. Riverside County was allocated \$1.1 million which was based on the percentage of homeless within that group of counties using the 2017 Point-in-Time count.

RUHS-BH, on behalf of Riverside County, must submit a letter of intent and Board resolution affirming participation to DHCS by September 25, 2018. Therefore, RUHS-BH is requesting the adopting of Resolution 2018-167 in order to submit an application.

Impact on Citizens and Businesses

These services are a component of the Department's system of care aimed at improving the health and safety of consumers and the community.

Additional Fiscal Information

One Time Funding for Homeless Mentally Ill Outreach and Treatment Program are one hundred percent (100%) State funded. All funds must be encumbered or expended no later than June

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30, 2020. There are sufficient funds in the Department's FY18/19 budget and no additional County funds are required.

4 **AUTHORIZE THE RIVERSIDE UNIVERSITY HEALTH SYSTEM-BEHAVIORAL**
5 **HEALTH, ON BEHALF OF THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE, TO PARTICIPATE IN THE**
6 **ONE-TIME HOMELESS MENTALLY ILL OUTREACH AND TREATMENT FUNDING**
7 **OPPORTUNITY AVAILABLE AS A RESULT OF SB 840 (CHAPTER 29, STATUTES OF 2018)**

9 **WHEREAS**, California's Governor Edmund G. Brown, Jr. and the California Legislature have
10 recognized the critical need for funding at the local level to combat homelessness;

11 **WHEREAS**, the Governor, Legislature, and this County recognize the need for outreach and
12 treatment to those who are living with a severe mental illness who are also homeless or at risk of
13 homelessness, including persons participating in Whole Person Care pilots or who have had recent
14 involvement with the criminal justice system or release from incarceration, as well as other special
15 populations within the county;

16 **WHEREAS**, the Governor and Legislature have allocated \$50 million dollars in one-time
17 funding for Fiscal Year 2018-19 to counties and four eligible cities for the Homeless Mentally Ill
18 Outreach and Treatment allocation;

19 **WHEREAS**, the Governor and Legislature have directed counties to leverage other available
20 funding for this purpose and prohibited any supplantation of existing funding or services in order to
21 maximize the impact of Homeless Mentally Ill Outreach and Treatment allocation dollars locally;

22 **WHEREAS**, the Governor and Legislature require counties that receive Homeless Mentally Ill
23 Outreach and Treatment allocation funding to expend the funding no later than June 30, 2020, and further
24 require counties to report to the Department of Health Care Services the disposition of funds, the services
25 provided, and the number of individuals who received services no later than 90 days after the full
26 expenditure of funding;

27 **WHEREAS**, the County of Riverside designates the Riverside University Health System-
28 Behavioral Health (RUHS-BH), Director of Behavioral Health, or his or her designee, as the point of
contact to the Department of Health Care Services for the Homeless Mentally Ill Outreach and Treatment
allocation;

1 **WHEREAS**, the County of Riverside affirms the county's commitment to combating
2 homelessness and improving outreach and treatment for those living with severe mental illness in our
3 communities pursuant to the provisions of SB 840 and the receipt of Homeless Mentally Ill Outreach and
4 Treatment funding;

5 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, FOUND, DETERMINED AND ORDERED** by
6 the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside, in regular session assembled on September 18,
7 2018, does hereby, resolve, find, determine and order as follows:

8 Section 1. The recitals set forth herein are correct and true;

9 Section 2. Approve RUHS-BH to apply for the Homeless Mentally Ill Outreach and
10 Treatment funding for fiscal year 2018-19.

11 Section 3. The Board of Supervisors authorizes the Director of Behavioral Health, or his or
12 her designee, to sign any future agreements for Homeless Mentally Ill Outreach
13 and Treatment. This authority shall include signature of acceptance documents,
14 agreements, and/or subsequent ministerial amendments, and related documents.
15 Agreements and amendments shall be approved by County Counsel.

16 Section 4. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by the Board of
17 Supervisors.
