SUBJECT: RIVERSIDE UNIVERSITY HEALTH SYSTEM - BEHAVIORAL HEALTH: Approval of the Screening, Evaluation and Treatment Program Contract Aggregate and Agreements Without Seeking Competitive Bids. Districts: All; [\$971,250 Annually; Up to \$97,125 in Additional Compensation, \$2,913,750 for 3 Years]; 100% State

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Supervisors:

1. Ratify the Screening, Evaluation and Treatment Program (SET-4-School) Contract Aggregate in the amount of \$971,250 annually through June 30, 2021;
2. Ratify and authorize the Purchasing Agent to sign the FY18/19 agreements for the Set 4 School Providers listed in Attachment A without seeking competitive bids; and
3. Authorize the Purchasing Agent, in accordance with Ordinance No. 459, based on the availability of fiscal funding and as approved by County Counsel to: a) exempt the Purchasing Agent from the sole source requirements when adding new vendors, not to exceed \$100,000 without seeking competitive bids; b) shift fund among the provider listed in Attachment A; and c) sign renewals and amendments that do not change the substantive terms of the agreement including amendments to the compensation provisions that do not exceed 10% annually through June 30, 2021.

BACKGROUND:

Summary

Riverside University Health System – Behavioral Health (RUHS-BH) was awarded \$7,500,000 in funding by the Riverside County Children and Families Commission, First 5 over a three (3) year period to work with collaborative partners to provide a comprehensive continuum of early identification, early intervention, and treatment services in addition to developing an integrated system of care across Riverside County for children ages 0 to 5. Existing partnerships will be leveraged to develop a multi model system to expand services, strengthen workforce capacity, and create a network to address the broad needs of young children and their families.

Since 2011, First 5’s Mental Health Initiative has supported the Screening, Evaluation and Treatment (SET-4-School) program. The program creates a comprehensive continuum of information and supportive services that fosters social competence by preventing, identifying and treating social, emotional, and behavioral problems in young children. The new award will seek to expand existing effective services and focus on establishing a single point of entry for linkage with outcome based, integrated services. Services will include mild to moderate intervention and mental health treatment to address a range of concerns including social and emotional development. The goal will be to utilize the established SET-4-School program as a model for implementation in school districts across the county.

RUHS-BH is seeking approval to enter into agreements with the sub-recipients to their First 5 grant application. The sub-recipients were previously Set-4-School contractors for First 5 and are collaborative partners who are established early intervention service providers. Therefore, no competitive bids were released for the services as this is a continuation of the services previously provided under First 5. The funding allocations are as follows: Catholic Charities in the amount of \$100,000, VCSS in the amount of \$150,000, and FSA in the amount of \$318,678 to provide early intervention services at partner school district sites. RUHS-BH is seeking additional school districts to participate and implement the program at school sites, therefore RUHS-BH is requesting approval to contract with these school districts not to exceed \$100,000 annually.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

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These services are a component of RUHS-BH system of care aimed at improving the health and safety of consumers and the community.

Additional Fiscal Information

The agreements with Catholic Charities, VCSS and Family Service Association are fully funded by the First 5 grant. No additional County funds are required.

Contract History and Price Reasonableness


