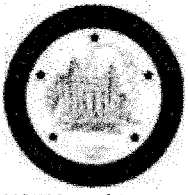

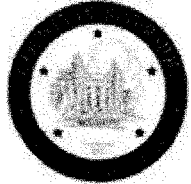

The Community of Interest designation for Cherry Valley was granted by Riverside County because we proved that the *people here actually form a community whose interest is to keep our area rural.*

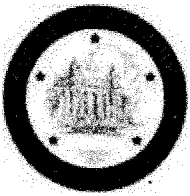
I feel that opening up our area to more urban development would be in essence... evicting us from our homes... because *you would be moving us to a new kind of neighborhood.*

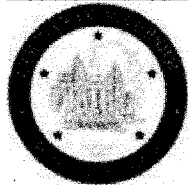

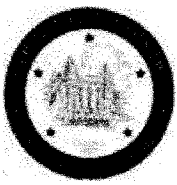

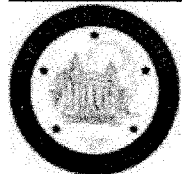

Dear Sirs:

How much do rural residents contribute to incorporated areas?

There is county sales tax generated from residents that live in rural areas. The residents do purchase groceries, gas, and other goods and services, just as those in more urban areas do.

Adding more commercial that doesn't fit in rural areas will only change where some of that sales tax revenue is generated-it won't create more revenue.

It will effectively erode the rural lifestyle that so many in the unincorporated areas appreciate. Many of us have already lived through this in other areas, and have experienced first hand how zoning changes such as this irreparably destroy(ed) the ability to live in a rural area.

While at the same time, also creating additional traffic issues, crime issues, noise, pollution and maintenance issues and more, that will only further stretch available resources.

Rural areas don't need (and generally do not want) more streetlights, sidewalks, curbs and gutters, or street sweeping. They typically do not need urban "parks" - when you have acreage, there is room for the neighborhood kids to get together and play, and the costs of land, maintenance, liability and insurance and other expenses are borne by the individual property owners, not the county. Less strain on other resources such as law enforcement, as crime rates tend to be lower than more urban areas. Yes, law enforcement is still necessary, but requires fewer resources overall because the total capita is lower.

Rural residents appreciate the relative quiet, the visible night skies, the wildlife, the significantly lower crime rates, the cleaner air. The ability to keep a few large animals and other things that simply aren't possible in an urban environment. They intentionally choose a home where the urban "amenities" aren't on every street corner. These are accepted trade offs for the desired lifestyle.

More commercial and more high density truly isn't compatible in a rural area.

A large percentage of residents of Riverside County do not actually work in Riverside County. Significantly more sales tax income could be generated within Riverside County if fewer Riverside County residents had to commute to other counties for jobs that pay a salary that can pay a mortgage. Very few fast food, mini mart and relatively few of warehouse positions meet that need (and more and more warehouse positions will become automated in the future, of course, resulting in the significant loss of those jobs over time). It would also reduce the need for more, and cost of the maintenance, of roads and other infrastructure as it would reduce wear and tear. It makes sense that those who travel out of Riverside County for work, whether they live in a rural or urban or suburban area, make many of their purchases outside of the county, from convenience, coinciding with that travel.

I believe that concentrating efforts on attracting more businesses with historically higher salary levels and greater stability would be far more beneficial to Riverside County in the long run. Residents could work within the county, pay their rent or mortgages, and spend more of their income in Riverside County, resulting in far greater sales tax revenues.

Another impact: the disruption that additional lighting, noise, traffic and pollution has on the rapidly diminishing, available wildlife corridors.

And please consider that many residents living in rural areas are within "County Service Areas" -formed voluntarily- and thus many already pay additional taxes to the county for some of the various services. And the county administration automatically collects around 6% off the top from those amounts collected before the balance is used towards those services - many of which are services already provided to urban or suburban residents without additional fees or taxes.

Rural residents may be further from urban "conveniences", but when they are needed, they plan accordingly. They also coordinate with neighbors, and this helps to create a community.

When the county General Plan "Blueprint For Tomorrow" was originally proposed, the county representatives, who wanted and needed the support of the rural areas, made promises to rural residents that their areas would be protected. Examples - the Lake Mathews General Plan and the Rancho El Sobrante Policy Area were promised that those plans would be protected under the "new" County General Plan, if residents would agree to support it.

Please don't open the door to destroy (or further destroy) the rural areas. Please don't penalize those of us who do not - or can not - live in an urban area. (I myself have asthma, and cannot live full time in an urban area, yet I must still live within reasonable reach of my income source).

I believe that all could benefit from more time -and communication- to explore additional options. 28 days is not nearly enough time for residents to gather input, inform and respond, especially for something that has obviously been in the works on the county level for much longer.

It would be so helpful if developers and county officials could reach out to the long established community groups that residents choose to represent them, at an early stage, for input, and they could be included in the actual negotiating process. It would go a very long way towards smoothing the process, and could save tons of time, energy, and frustration on all sides if the unincorporated communities as a whole could be included and have representation, and understanding how a proposal comes to be, from point A to point E, for example.

Those who live in an urban or suburban environment and may never have lived otherwise do not necessarily have a full understanding as to why, or how those who choose to-or need to-live differently than they themselves do. And they don't necessarily understand all of the concerns and the full impacts of decisions and how they may affect others. The key is to involve them from the beginning-long before the hearing stages where residents are left feeling that their backs are up against the wall. It's now or never.

Previous Boards of Supervisors and planning personnel have strongly recommended that developers contact the local associations and residents - actually talk to them about how they can work together for projects that can work for everyone.

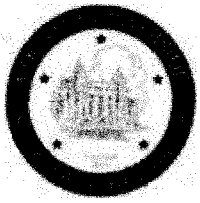
In the past, this has helped save resources and time for the county, because many developers and residents are able to work out compromises ahead of time, and reach the planning commission hearing stage in agreement, with residents supporting the efforts of the developers at that time.

On September 25, I ask that you please reject GPA 1227. There are other alternatives available.

Or delay action for a reasonable period, until more input is received and alternatives further explored.

Honorable Supervisors,

Residents of Anza, CA., opposed to GPA 1227, bring to your attention some of the Environmental issues, conflicts and threats created by this proposed Amendment:

1. **Existing Statute mandates that Commercial zoned land-uses pave vehicle parking areas.**

Paving creates 'sheet-flow' drainage run-off posing threats of water and eolian erosion to adjacent properties. Paving for vehicles is appropriate in Cities having drainage facilities.

Parking accommodation is necessary for both customers and employees.

Paved parking facilities in Rural Areas lacking drainage facilities is inappropriate, posing a serious environmental impact.

2. **Commercial Zoning creates increased traffic circulation** which requires accommodation and mitigation in the form of significant traffic controls. Curbs, Gutters, turn-pockets, signage, increased road maintenance are but few of the increased impacts required by Commercial Zoning.

Rural areas, Residential areas, and Agricultural-Zoned areas lack such accommodation therefore presenting significant environmental impacts neglected by GPA 1227.

3. Commercial Zoning, or any land-use with relaxed or reduced restrictions, poses **Environmental Impacts to wildlife** present to a greater degree in Rural Areas. Failure of GPA 1227 to require adequate EIR Reporting of impacts to fauna and flora in Rural areas proposed for Commercial uses poses a significant environmental threat to nature, as well as existing Residential uses.

4. **Characteristics of Commercial land-uses differs significantly from Residential or Agricultural uses thus presenting Environmental Impacts to existing uses.**

Fundamental aspects of Lighting, Signage, hours of operation, sound attenuation and air pollution (smell), Traffic noise and congestion, pedestrian accommodation, soil percolation standards for human-waste disposal all pose Environmental threats to Rural Areas. Rural areas normally lack municipal sewage waste disposal facilities and other accommodations (Water) found in Cities. The lack of these facilities in Rural Areas is not mitigated (or considered) in the proposed Amendment.


5. **GPA 1227 fails to adequately define the Terms used in the Legislation.** This failure of construction presents glaring opportunities for abuse, misuse, encroachment, and mismanagement at all levels of administration and compliance. Greetings:

On behalf of concerned area residents and Rural Association of Mead Valley, please accept these comments in opposition to proposed changes to Policies LU 21.7 and 22.7 "GPA No. 1227" for the following reasons:

1. Removes the small scale commercial uses that serve rural neighborhoods (Neighborhood commercial land use). This is a critical component of the Rural Foundation General Plan that limits commercial land uses in rural areas to serve the neighborhoods within them, not the urban needs of distant residents.
 - a) The design and scale of future proposed commercial uses will not be compatible with surrounding rural land uses, protective scenic views (Cajalco Road, Gavilan Hills, etc.), nor blend into the rural nature of the area.
 - b) Future commercial projects can be located anywhere in a rural community without the requirement of being located adjacent to a arterial, mountainous arterial or a major highway. The proposed change states, commercial uses can be approved if adjacent to and can be safely accessible from a General Plan "roadway".
 - c) This proposed Foundation change to the General Plan will conflict with the vision set forth in a number of applicable General Plan Policy Area and Land Use Overlays.
 - d) "The current existing policies foster small-scale commercial uses based on a set of criteria that are intended to prevent an overconcentration (clustering) of commercial uses in remote areas of the County. They benefit from some conveniences such as small-scale local commercial services and all weather access roads, yet maintain an unhurried, uncrowded life style. Rural residents accept the fact that they must travel some distance for more complete services and facilities."

As stated in the staff report this General Plan Amendment that proposes to alter the entire rural land use for the entire County of Riverside was noticed in the Press

Enterprise just 10 days before the public hearing. The notice is difficult to read. The Planning Commission Agenda came out July 12th, 2018. Certainly this is not sufficient notice for the public to review such a massive change in the General Plan. Typically this type of change requires going out to the public through community meetings to receive input and comments from the residents throughout the County.

I. FINDINGS FOR FOUNDATION COMPONENT GENERAL PLAN AMENDMENT CANNOT BE MADE

General Plan Amendment Cycles

GPA No. 1227 should not be initiated as the required findings for approving such an amendment are unsupported by substantial evidence and cannot be made. GPA 1227 is a Foundation Component General Plan Amendment subject to an eight-year approval cycle. (Ord. 348 § 2.5.(B).) Pursuant to Ordinance 348 Section 2.5 (F), a Planning Commission resolution recommending approval of a regular Foundation Component Amendment must include findings, based on substantial evidence:

- (1) That new conditions or circumstances disclosed during the review process justify modifying the General Plan;
- (2) That the modifications do not conflict with the overall Riverside County Vision, and
- (3) That they would not create an internal inconsistency among the elements of the General Plan.

These findings cannot be made.

A. No New Conditions or Circumstances Justify Modifying the General Plan.

Rural area plans, General Plan Vision and rural community area plans have not changed substantially over the years since the General Plan was adopted in 2003.

B. The Modifications Conflict with the Overall Riverside County Vision, Rural Community Area Plans, and General Plan.

The Rural Community Foundation Component is intended to identify communities and neighborhoods having a rural lifestyle, where animal-keeping uses and limited infrastructure (compared with Community Development areas) are prevalent. Rural Community areas will serve as transition areas between Community Development and Rural Foundation Components.

Along these lines, the Very Low Density Residential land use designation provides for the development of detached single-family residential dwelling units and ancillary structures on large parcels, and the Rural Community Foundation Component encourages equestrian and other animal-keeping uses.

Hence, GPA 1227 would substantially alter the Rural Community Foundation Component of the General Plan and degrade its application Countywide. GPA 1227

would also permit clustering of Commercial land uses in rural communities creating conflicts with the overall purpose of these Foundation Components, the General Plan, vision of the General Plan and Rural Community Area Plans.

GPA 1227 a Foundation General Plan Amendment to Land use within the rural communities will create a substantial conflict within the General Plan Vision, Rural Foundation Component, and Rural Area Plans within the Riverside County General Plan.

**There are Four types of amendment cycles to the General Plan.
Foundation General Plan Amendments requirement.**

1.General Plan Review Cycle

This cycle first occurs in 2008, five years after the initial adoption of this General Plan and then occurs periodically every eight years thereafter. This cycle:

a) Includes amendments proposed by the County of Riverside or by private property owners. Prior to Board initiation, proposed amendments shall be submitted in a comprehensive manner for review and comment to a general plan community advisory committee appointed by the Board. Comments received from the committee shall be included in subsequent initiation proceedings before the Planning Commission and the Board.

b. Is intended to assess General Plan progress and issues related to its implementation.

c. Is the only time, other than a declared extraordinary amendment or an Agriculture Foundation Component amendment, that a Foundation Component of the General Plan may be considered for change.

The last 8 year review cycle took place in 2016.

The Rural Association of Mead Valley urges the Planning Commission to deny Resolution No. 2018-005 and deny GPA 1227.

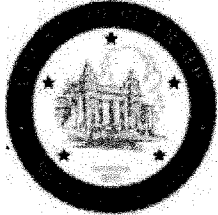

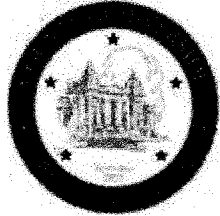

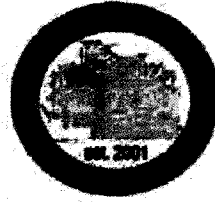

3. Fundamental Due Process of Law is Denied by Approval of this Proposal.

Fundamental concepts of Due Process of Law require more than cursory respect for notice, transparency, and opportunity to be heard, especially when government attempts to make, implement, or change laws, regulations and rules. The subject GPA 1227 would fundamentally change County Supervisorial District 1 if approved and ultimately adopted by allowing the further gradual transformation of the existing rural community into a different one with new commercial structures and enterprises that the public has vocally expressed are unwanted and unneeded.

The staff report states that this General Plan Amendment (proposing to alter the entire existing rural land use for the entire County of Riverside) was published and noticed in the Press Enterprise newspaper just 10 days before the public hearing. The notice was a surprise to the public and community, totally unexpected, difficult to read and comprehend, complex, written in legalese, and thus lacks transparency required by due process of law.

The Planning Commission Agenda came out July 12th, 2018. This is not sufficient notice for the public to review such a massive, important, complex and impactful change in the General Plan. Typically this type of change requires going out to the public through community meetings to receive input and comments from the residents throughout the County. That has not taken place in this instance.

This proposed GPA 1227 seeks to alter the fundamental nature of the present rural community not by convincing the community to accept it but rather by bureaucratic feat and subterfuge in the way of complex, hidden regulation that almost went unnoticed by the public of this community.

The County bureaucracy and executives know the community is unsophisticated in the regulatory workings of general plans and zoning. They know the community is not able to finance lawsuits. They know the community do not read legal notices hidden within newspapers. They know most residents are working weekday mornings and cannot attend these meetings. They know no one in the community has requested this change. And they know they can often get their desired proposals passed without anyone realizing what happened until it is too late to object.

GPA 1227 is one of those efforts by County government to fundamentally change the rural areas without seeking and obtaining community approval by subterfuge in the form of obviously inadequate notice. Thus, the community is denied required, basic due process of law.

The California Supreme Court has called the general plan “the constitution for all future development” because it presents a vision and a set of principles for future growth in the community. Development decisions must carry out and not obstruct a general plan’s policies. Major updates to a general plan often trigger review under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), which requires studies of the impacts of government decisions on people and the environment.

4. Conclusion.

For each and all of the foregoing reasons, the Residents Association of Greater Lake Mathews on behalf of the residents and interests of the Cajalco Valley and Plateau, respectfully urges and demands that GPA 1227 be denied as contrary to the wishes and best interests of the community

the Board of Supervisors is elected to represent.

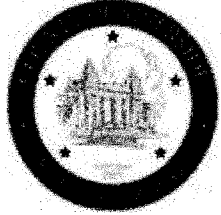

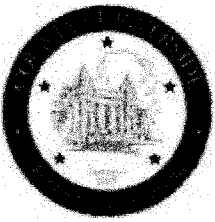
