Adopt, read title, and waive further reading of Ordinance No. 832.1, An Ordinance of the County of Riverside Amending Ordinance No. 832 Imposing Charges for Annual Registration of Packers and Point of Sale Stations updating the statutory authority cited in the ordinance and revising the ordinance to make it consistent with state statute and/or case law.
3. Direct the Clerk of the Board to publish Ordinance No. 832.1 in accordance with California Government Code Section 25124 within fifteen (15) days after the adoption of Ordinance No. 832.1.
4. Direct the Clerk of the Board to file the attached Notice of Exemption with the County Clerk within five (5) days after the adoption of Ordinance No. 832.1.



BACKGROUND:

Summary (continued)

Riverside County's Weights and Measures division is responsible for protecting both consumers and businesses that conduct business with Riverside County. This is done by ensuring that commercial weighing and measuring devices are accurate and reliable.

On June 8, 2004, Agenda Item 9.1, pursuant to the authority granted in California Business and Professions Code §13350, the Board of Supervisors adopted Ordinance No. 832 entitled "An Ordinance of the County of Riverside Imposing Charges for Annual Registration of Packers and Point of Sale Stations," which is known as the "Consumer Protection Business Permit Ordinance of the County of Riverside."

Ordinance No. 832 established permitting requirements to identify, monitor, and impose penalties on: (1) those persons commercially engaged in the packaging of commodities in advance of sale; and (2) those persons utilizing for commercial purposes automated systems for retail sale commodity pricing commonly referred to as "scanners".

Since Ordinance No. 832 has been adopted, some of the statutes and regulations cited in the ordinance as the authority for the ordinance have been amended, repealed, and/or renumbered.

On June 26, 2018, Agenda Item 3.15, the Board of Supervisors adopted an order initiating an amendment to Ordinance No. 832 to update the statutory authority cited in the ordinance and revise the ordinance, as necessary, to make it consistent with state statute and/or case law. Ordinance No. 832.1 amends Ordinance No. 832 to reflect these changes. Specifically, the revisions include:

- Amending the statutory authority listed in the last sentence of Section 2 to update the statutes and regulations cited that have been amended, repealed, and/or renumbered;
- Updating the definitions of "Person", "Point of sale station", and "Sell" in Section 3 to be consistent with California Business and Professions Code Sections 12011, 13352, and 12009, respectively;
- Amending the second paragraph of Section 9 to be consistent with California Government Code Section 25132; and

- Adding a severability clause.

Ordinance No. 832.1 does not impose new charges or raise existing fees.

On August 28, 2018, Agenda Item 3.19, the Board of Supervisors introduced Ordinance No. 832.1. Ordinance No. 832.1 shall take effect thirty (30) days after its adoption.

In accordance with CEQA, the use of the Common Sense Exemption (State CEQA Guidelines, Section 15061(b)(3)) is based on the "general rule that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment." The use of this exemption is appropriate if "it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment." The proposed Ordinance No. 832.1 merely updates the statutory authority cited in Ordinance No. 832 whereby the County established permitting requirements for packers and scanners so that the Agricultural Commissioner's office can ensure commercial weighing and measuring devices located in the unincorporated area of Riverside County are accurate and reliable. As such, Ordinance No. 832.1 is exempt under the common sense exemption of CEQA Guidelines section 15061(b)(3) in that it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the ordinance may have a significant effect on the environment.

It is recommended that the Board of Supervisors adopt, read title, and waive further reading of Ordinance No. 832.1.

Ordinance No. 832.1 has been approved as to form by County Counsel.



18 Section 3. The definition of "Point of sale station" in Section 3 of Ordinance No. 832 is
19 amended to read as follows:

20 " 'Point of sale station' means any computer or electronic system used by a retail
21 establishment such as, but not limited to, Universal Product Code scanners, price
22 lookup codes, or an electronic price lookup system as a means for determining the
23 price of the item being purchased by a consumer."

24 Section 4. The definition of "Sell" in Section 3 of Ordinance No. 832 is amended to read

26 " 'Sell' or 'sale' means barter, exchange, trade, rent, lease, keep for sale, offer for sale,
27 or expose for sale, in any of their variant forms."
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Section 5. The second paragraph of Section 9 of Ordinance No. 832 is amended to read as follows:

“Any person so convicted shall be: (1) guilty of an infraction offense and punishable by a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for a first violation; (2) guilty of an infraction offense and punishable by a fine not exceeding two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for a second violation within one year of the first violation. The third violation within one year of the first violation and any additional violations shall constitute a misdemeanor offense and shall be punishable by a fine not exceeding one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or six months in jail, or both.”


Section 6. A new Section 10 is added to Ordinance No. 832 to read as follows:

“SECTION 10: SEVERABILITY. If any provision, clause, sentence or paragraph of this ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstances shall be held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the other provisions of this ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end, the provisions of this ordinance are hereby declared to be severable.”



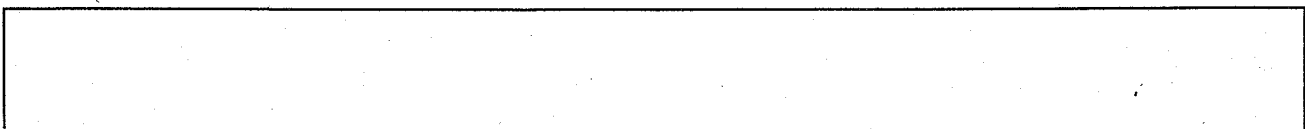

**ORDINANCE NO. 832.1
AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE
AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 832 IMPOSING CHARGES
FOR ANNUAL REGISTRATION OF PACKERS AND POINT
OF SALE STATIONS**

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside ordains as follows:

Section 1. The last sentence of Section 2 of Ordinance No. 832 is amended to read as follows:

"The authority for this ordinance is: California Business and Professions Code Sections 12009, 12011, 12011.6, 12012.1, 12013, 12015, 12015.3, 12015.5, 12024.2, 12024.3, 12024.6, 12103.5, 12211, 12609, 13301, 13303, 13350, and 13352; California Government Code Section 25132; and California Code of Regulations, Title 4, Division 9, Chapter 10, Section 4500 et seq."

Section 2. The definition of "Person" in Section 3 of Ordinance No. 832 is amended to read as follows:

"Person(s)" means any person, firm, corporation, or association."

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Section 5. The second paragraph of Section 9 of Ordinance No. 832 is amended to read as follows:

"Any person so convicted shall be: (1) guilty of an infraction offense and punishable by a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for a first violation; (2) guilty of an infraction offense and punishable by a fine not exceeding two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for a second violation within one year of the first violation. The third violation within one year of the first violation and any additional violations shall constitute a misdemeanor offense and shall be punishable by a fine not exceeding one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or six months in jail, or both."

Section 6. A new Section 10 is added to Ordinance No. 832 to read as follows:

SECTION 10: SEVERABILITY. If any provision, clause, sentence or paragraph of this ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstances shall be held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the other provisions of this ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end, the provisions of this ordinance are hereby declared to be severable."

Section 7. Existing Section 10 of Ordinance No. 832 is renumbered Section 11.

Section 8. This ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days from the date of its adoption.

EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall become effective 30 days after adoption.
