On a motion from Supervisor Tavaglione, seconded by Supervisor Washington, and duly carried by unanimous vote, IT WAS ORDERED that the meeting of Tuesday, October 30, 2018 be adjourned in memory of my uncle, Nicholas Eugene Tavaglione, Sr., an 86-year-old lifelong resident of Riverside, California who passed away on October 22, 2018 one week shy of his 87th birthday.

An instrumental force in the community, Nick was a prominent General Contractor and Developer in Riverside and other states across the country, a Riverside Sport Hall of Fame inductee, and a tireless supporter of youth sports. He was a strong family man with a commitment to helping others and will always be remembered as the go to guy.

Nick was the youngest in a family of 11 with two brothers still alive, Joe and Louie Tavaglione. When his family moved to Riverside in 1927, he attended Riverside Poly High School and Riverside City College where he met his wife Sallie. While attending RCC, he started working at his family's winery, the Rubidoux Winery. He excelled in football and baseball and became RCC's first All American in 1952. After graduating from RCC, he completed his education at Pepperdine University and became a teacher and coach for numerous years.

Nick began his successful career in the construction business fixing houses in the path of the original 91 Freeway project, moving homes onto lots he purchased and reselling them. He built hundreds of 7-Eleven and Chief Auto Parts stores, traveling to multiple states for the projects. He worked with his son Nick Jr. in the construction business for nearly 30 years.

Nick founded the Riverside Little League, Riverside Rancheros with his brother Louie, Pop Warner Football, RCC Tiger Backers, and Poly High Football Booster Club. He served on the Riverside County Olympic Committee, Board of Riverside National Bank, Riverside County Grand Jury, PTA Boards, Riverside County Planning Commission, and was a Trustee for Riverside Community Hospital. He was also President of the Foundation at RCC and of the Tiger Backers.

Nick's many honors include RCC Alumnus of the Year in 1995, Humanitarian of the Year by the Riverside Recovery Resources and Riverside Police Officers Citizen of the Year in 1994 after building the Safe in His Arms monument.

Nick is survived by his wife Sallie; son Nick (Sandy) Tavaglione, Jr.; daughter Donna (Don) Luginbill; grandchildren Jeremy (Tara) Luginbill, Nicholas Tavaglione, Jamie Luginbill, Cara Tavaglione; and seven great-grandchildren.
