BACKGROUND:

Summary

California Government Code section 24000, subsections (f) and (i) establish the treasurer and tax collector, respectively, as county officers. The general duties of the county treasurer are set forth at Government Code sections 27000 – 27013. Riverside County has consolidated the two offices under a single officer as permitted under state law. In 52 of the 58 counties, the offices of county treasurer and county tax collector are consolidated under a single elected officer.

More specifically, Sections 27000.7 – 27000.9 set forth the qualifications, course of study, and continuing education of any duly elected county treasurer-tax collector. These sections were enacted by the state legislature in order to ensure that the officeholder possesses the requisite skill, experience, and expertise and further, that they continue their education within the discipline of treasury management, tax collection, public finance, public administration, governmental accounting, or directly related subjects, offered by a recognized state or national association, institute, or accredited college or university, or the California Debt and Investment Advisory Commission.

However, these sections are not self-executing. In order for these sections to be effective in Riverside County, the Board of Supervisors must enact an ordinance by majority vote at a regular meeting with all members present, adopting the provisions of those sections. Given the substantial responsibility bestowed on the County's Treasurer-Tax Collector to safeguard the County's money as well as other depositors such as schools, special districts and other discretionary depositors) and the authority delegated by the Board to invest and reinvest the funds of the County, it is strongly recommended that this ordinance be enacted.

The County's Executive Officer, Chief Financial Officer, and the Treasurer-Tax Collector all concur with the recommendation.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

The purpose of Ordinance 947 is to ensure that the persons eligible for election or appointment to the office of Riverside County Treasurer-Tax Collector are well-qualified and able to fully and faithfully discharge the duties and responsibilities of the office.

Additional Fiscal Information

There are no costs associated with the enactment of this ordinance. There are costs associated with the continuing education requirements set forth in Sections 27000.8 and 27000.9 but those costs have and will be included in the Treasurer-Tax Collector's annual budget as approved by the Board of Supervisors.

ORDINANCE NO. 947

AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE SPECIFYING QUALIFICATIONS FOR OFFICE OF TREASURER-TAX COLLECTOR

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside, State of California, do ordain as follows:

Section 1. Purpose.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to ensure that persons eligible for election or appointment to the office of Riverside County Treasurer and Tax Collector are well qualified and able to fully discharge the duties and responsibilities of the office.

Section 2. Authority.

Pursuant to Government Code Section 27000.6, the Board of Supervisors may enact the provisions of Government Code Sections 27000.7, 27000.8 and 27000.9 prior to the first date of the period for filing declarations of candidacy for the office of County Treasurer, County Tax Collector, or County Treasurer-Tax Collector.

Section 3. Enactment of Government Code Provisions.

The Board of Supervisors hereby enacts the provisions of Government Code Sections 27000.7, 27000.8 and 27000.9 as presently enacted or subsequently amended or renumbered.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after its adoption.
