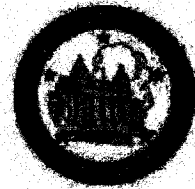

2. Waive further reading of the Ordinance.



BACKGROUND:

Summary

The Riverside County Department of Environmental Health (DEH) is responsible for oversight and enforcement in solid waste collection service, transfer and disposal.

Ordinance 657 was adopted by the Board of Supervisors on December 19, 1988 as item 3.18. It has been revised six times since, with the last revision occurring on May 17, 1994 as item 11.3.

Ordinance 657 addresses the collection, removal and transfer of solid waste in the unincorporated areas of Riverside County. The majority of the ordinance addresses the permitting of waste haulers to collect residential and commercial waste in the unincorporated portions of the County. In 1998 and 1999 the Board of Supervisors approved a system of franchising waste collection in the unincorporated area that superseded the permitting language in Ordinance 657. Two sections of the ordinance, not related to permitting, that cover the frequency of waste removal and waste removal by non-franchise haulers, were moved into Ordinance 745.3, which is being brought to the Board of Supervisors in a separate action for consideration of approval on December 4, 2018 (MT 8066).

DEH desires to repeal Ordinance 657 to remove outdated or superseded language and incorporate language from Ordinance 657 into Ordinance 745.3 to consolidate solid waste collection oversight into one ordinance.
