On motion of Supervisor Tavaglione, seconded by Supervisor Washington, and duly carried by unanimous vote, IT WAS ORDERED that the meeting of Tuesday, December 11, 2018 be adjourned in memory of James Allen Robinson, a resident of Riverside, California who passed away on December 4, 2018.

Born on November 10, 1934 in Tulsa, Oklahoma, "Jim" and his family relocated to California for drier air and warmer climate. He graduated from San Bernardino High School and earned his Bachelor's Degree from California State Los Angeles. While in college, he enlisted in the Army National Guard, earning the Distinguished Cadet Honor and obtained the rank of Staff Sergeant. He continued his education throughout his career.

Jim's prominent career in banking began as a messenger for Security First National Bank which later became Security Pacific National Bank. After completing the bank's management training program, he managed a series of larger bank branches in Riverside and San Bernardino County. In 1973, he was promoted to Regional Manager of the Los Angeles headquarters division and moved his family to Seal Beach. In 1974, Jim was promoted to Division Manager for the Inland Empire and he and his family returned to Riverside. Ultimately, his role expanded to include all of the branches and commercial lending responsibility from the Central Valley down to Imperial County. He retired in 1992 and was hired as the President and CEO of Riverside National Bank. When the bank was sold to City National Bank in 1997, Jim remained as an Executive until he retired again in 2003. He formed the Security Bank of California in 2005 which was headquartered in the Inland Empire. He was the Chairman and CEO until the bank was sold to Pacific Premier Bank in 2016 and he retired for the last time.

An inspirational force in the community, Jim served and sat on numerous boards in the regions he worked including Fresno, Los Angeles, Riverside, and San Bernardino Counties. He was recognized as Entrepreneur of the Year by Ernst and Young in 1990 and was recognized by UCR as the Management Leader of the Year in 1996-1997. He was named an Executive Fellow of UCR's A. Gary Anderson Graduate School of Management for the 1999-2000 school year. He was also recognized as the Distinguished Executive Officer by the School of Business at California State San Bernardino in 2012.

Jim was a loving and devoted family man, mentor, and friend. His memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved him. He will be dearly missed but never forgotten.

On motion of Supervisor Tavaglione, seconded by Supervisor Washington, and duly carried by unanimous vote, IT WAS ORDERED that the meeting of Tuesday, December 11, 2018 be adjourned in memory of Herbert P. "Herb" Spiegel, a 93-year-old prominent resident of Corona, California who passed away on December 2, 2018.

Herb and his family escaped war-torn Germany in May of 1939, immigrating to the United States and settling in New York. A true Patriot, he proudly served in the U.S. Navy as a Seabee in Kokiak, Alaska during World War II and was honorably discharged in 1946. He married Flora Hirsch on May 23, 1946 and returned to Kokiak, where he continued to work as a civilian electrician with the Navy. From Kokiak, they moved to Albany, New York for two years and then settled in Corona.

An instrumental force in the community of Corona since 1958, Herb founded Corona Industrial Electric Inc. with his late wife Flora who passed away on March 8, 1992. He was an active member of the National Electrical Contractors Association (NECA) as well as the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers (IBEW). He retired in 1994, after receiving numerous awards and recognitions in the electrical contracting industry.

Herb remained active in the community and was a member of many local organizations including the Corona Chamber of Commerce, Corona Host Lions, Corona Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks, Masonic Lodge, Navy League, and was a member and founder of Congregation Beth Shalom of Corona. He was also active in philanthropy, community outreach, and local nonprofits including the Corona Public Library, Corona Norco Unified School District, and was a longtime judge for History Day.

Herb was honored with many awards including Citizen of the Year and the Lifetime Achievement Award by the Corona Chamber of Commerce, Distinguished Service Award by the Corona Host Lions, Special Recognition Award by NECA, and the Legacy Award by Congregation Beth Shalom. He was also cofounder and creator of a holocaust education forum to share and preserve the story of his life and other holocaust survivors.

Herb is survived by his three sons Sam (Catherine), Bobby (Karen), and Marc (Michelle); seven grandchildren Tanya, Rebecca, Rachel, Isaac (Katelynn), Josh, Jacob, and Aaron; great-grandson RJ; and many nieces and nephews. His memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved him. He will be dearly missed but never forgotten.
