BACKGROUND:

Summary

The Cranston Fire began Wednesday, July 25, 2018, near the mountain communities of Idyllwild and Mountain Center and burned more than 13,000 acres. Conditions of extreme peril to people, property and critical infrastructure necessitated the mandatory evacuation of the area during the fire. The Director of Emergency Services proclaimed that a "Local Emergency" exists in Riverside County, which was ratified by the Board of Supervisors at their meeting of July 31, 2018.

It is requested that the Board of Supervisors adopt Resolution No. 2019-005 to extend the Proclamation of Local Emergency. The vast burn areas left by the Cranston Fire leave Riverside County residents and visitors threatened by flooding and debris flows. Monsoonal storms over the burn area(s) have already led to post fire flash flood warnings issued by the National Weather Service, resulting in evacuations and road closures. This is a pattern that will be repeated when storms occur over the area(s).

Impact on Residents and Businesses

The residents and businesses of the San Jacinto mountain communities will be negatively impacted if stabilization measures are not taken to protect the community. The extension of the Emergency Proclamation provides access to necessary resources to accomplish this goal.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE EXTENDING THE EXISTENCE OF A LOCAL EMERGENCY BY THE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

WHEREAS, Section 8630, Article 14, of the California Emergency Services Act requires that the County Board of Supervisors review, at least every thirty (30) days until such Local Emergency is terminated, the need for continuing the Local Emergency; and

WHEREAS, a period of Local Emergency presently exists in the County of Riverside in accordance with the proclamation and confirmation thereof by the County Board of Supervisors on the 31st day of July, 2018, as a result of conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property within this County, caused by the Cranston Fire in the San Jacinto Mountains near Idyllwild and surrounding communities, commencing on or about the 25th day of July, 2018; and

WHEREAS, the County Board of Supervisors of Riverside County has reviewed the need to continue the existence of the Local Emergency; and

WHEREAS, the local emergency created by the Cranston Fire not only includes the current fire conditions but also includes conditions in the burn areas of the Cranston Fire which have left communities extremely vulnerable to debris flow and flooding during rain events; and

WHEREAS, the situation resulting from said condition of extreme peril is still deemed to be beyond the control of normal protective service, personnel, equipment, and facilities of and within said County of Riverside; now, therefore,

BE IT PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside that the period of Local Emergency is extended for thirty (30) additional days unless sooner terminated.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that said Local Emergency shall be deemed to continue to exist until its termination is proclaimed by the County Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside.
